

This Memorandum of understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MoU") is entered into by and between

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Hyderabad having its office at 3rd floor, Prof. Jayashankar Vidya Bhavan, Nampally, Hyderabad-500001 and herein after unless the context otherwise requires be referred to as "CCETS"

As FIRST PARTY

And

The Indus Entrepreneurs Hyderabad, founded in 1992 in Silicon Valley by a group of successful entrepreneurs, corporate executives and senior professionals with roots in the Indus region. Their office is located at #102, KADIRIS APURUPA URBAN, Laxmi Nagar, Kondapur, Hyderabad, Telangana-500084 and herein after unless the context otherwise requires be referred to as "TiE Hyderabad"

As SECOND PARTY

(Both Parties are hereinafter jointly referred to as "Parties" and individually as a "Party")

Introduction

A. Whereas CCETS is a non-profit department created by the Government of Telangana to promote education, giving special attention to backward and rural areas. It aims to strengthen education at undergraduate level especially for underprivileged sections of the society.

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- B. TiE Hyderabad is one of the happening chapters within TiE Global, working with a mission to foster entrepreneurship through mentoring, networking, education, funding and incubation with a focus on generating and nurturing the next generation of entrepreneurs.
- C. Whereas TiE Hyderabad, in furtherance of its mission, engages in establishing "TiE Grad", an initiative run by entrepreneurs, for students aspiring to be entrepreneurs. It is a top-class global entrepreneurship program which enables young students pursuing graduation to develop entrepreneurial mindset and encourages them to build their own business ideas.
- D. Whereas Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, in the State of Telangana is desirous of engaging in career guidance, employability and entrepreneurial skill development initiatives for the students pursuing graduation in Government Degree Colleges in the state.
- E. The parties share the common interest of engaging in entrepreneurial skill-building programs for students pursuing under graduation in Government Degree Colleges in Telangana.

TiE Hyderabad and CCETS desire to enter into this Memorandum setting out the terms and conditions under which the purpose and scope of this MoU will be achieved.

Article 1 Effective Date

The parties hereby agree that the effective date of this MoU shall be the date on which it is signed. The Preamble to this agreement constitutes an integral part thereof.

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Article 2

Purpose and Scope

Purpose: This MoU outlines mutual cooperation between the two parties in the space of entrepreneurial skill enhancement initiatives and creation of a platform for students to interact with global forums to showcase their skills and knowledge.

Roles and Scope of cooperation: The parties agree to, in the spirit of mutual cooperation, use the best efforts towards fulfilment of their respective obligations in achieving the purpose of this MoU.

2.1 Responsibilities of CCETS

- Will recommend and encourage all Government Degree Colleges working under its ambit to motivate their students to participate and make use of the TiE Grad entrepreneurship program.
- Ensure payment of requisite One-time initiation fee (Rs. 1 Lakh + GST) and Annual membership fee (Rs. 1 Lakh +GST, to be paid every year towards the renewal on 1st of April) to TiE Hyderabad chapter.
- Identify 50-100 students (I, II & III yr) from Government Degree Colleges and register them for the program.
- Identify and nominate one student champion and one faculty champion to coordinate the program.
- Provide a common venue (with flexible seating arrangement) at Hyderabad for conduct of orientation-kick-off session and monthly meetings.
- Provide the following for the meetings:
 - 3 Banners, 2 Standees, 1 Hoarding and 1 backdrop.
 - A lean canvas (equal in number to the number of students registered) printed on A2 Sheets.
 - A/V facilities, projector and computers.

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 Confirm calendar for TiE Grad team to conduct workshop/seminar on the college campus.

2.2 Responsibilities of TiE Hyderabad

TiE Hyderabad will:

- Share all relevant details of their programs & competitions with O/o CCE.
- Provide know how to permit smooth and effective technology and knowledge transfer.
- Assist registered student entrepreneurs and startups from Government Degree Colleges, Telangana state to solve their business or technical challenges and building mentor connections.
- Nominate 5 student members for BizHack Bootcamps.
- Extend speaker/resource person support for workshops/seminars organised by Commissionerate of Collegiate Education (prior intimation of 15 days is required).
- Assist student entrepreneurs in networking with top entrepreneurs.
- Assign business coach and idea coach to train the registered students on the program for the entire year.
- Conduct competitions to select at least 2 teams and nominate the same for semi-finals - Inter collegiate competitions, the winners of semi-finals (if any) to TiE Grad Business Idea Tournament (Inter-college) and the winners at finals (if any) to global competitions.
- Explain the current needs of the market every year to CCETS and make them understand the changes that may incur in the course of the program.
- Submit a monthly report on the status of the program to CCETS and also a final consolidated report on the program towards the end of the academic year.

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ARTICLE 3

Term

- 3.1 The MoU will be effective from the date of signing and applicable upto the end of the academic year 2019-2020.
- 3.2 The MoU may be extended on mutually agreed terms for a further period of one year or for such other period as mutually agreed by the parties. If extended, the renewal shall be done on 1st April of every year.

ARTICLE 4

Financial liabilities

4.1 The program is offered for a fee which involves One-Time setup fee = Rs. 1, 00,000/- + GST@18% Annual membership fee = Rs. 1, 00,000/- + GST@18% (to be renewed every year in April).

Total payable fee for first year = Rs. 2, 36,000/- (inclusive of GST@18%).

Renewal fee from 2nd year (April-March) = Rs. 1, 00,000/-+ GST (18%)

- 4.2 The expenses incurred towards provision of venue, food and accommodation for the meetings held at colleges shall be the liability of CCETS (except for finals, hosted by TiE Grad).
- 4.3 The registration fee towards student nominations for global competitions only (if any) shall be borne by TiE Hyderabad. However the expenses incurred towards travel and logistics shall be the responsibility of nominees/team members.



Article 5

Confidentiality

- 5.1 This document is confidential. Both the parties agree to maintain in confidence, and not reveal to any person or body, rights and obligations of the parties or any information or data which it receives through the other pursuant to this Agreement. The provision of Confidentiality shall survive the termination of this MoU and continue to bind the parties.
- 5.2 Both parties hereby declare that they know that this undertaking will be in force during the validity of this MoU, as well as at any time after this MoU is terminated.
- 5.3 Both parties declare that they know that the undertaking pursuant to this agreement is a pre- requisite for each party to enter into this MoU with the other, and that without this declaration each would not be willing to enter into an agreement with the other.

Article 6

Intellectual Property

- 6.1 Intellectual property means all systems, processes, procedures, propositions, descriptions, models, copyrights, trademarks, trade secrets, and patents, utility models, methods and other intellectual property rights recognized in any jurisdiction worldwide, including all applications and registrations.
- 6.2 The materials provided by TiE Hyderabad are protected by copyright, including without limitation by copyright Law and other applicable laws in India



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- 6.3 CCETS & TiE Hyderabad will not reveal, make use of or commercialize any of the confidential information provided by TiE Hyderabad/CCETS either during the currency or after termination of the related Agreement for a period of five years.
- 6.4 TiE Hyderabad will retain the right of ownership to all the Intellectual Property Rights. 

This Memorandum of Understanding (hereinafter referred to as "**MoU**") is made at Hyderabad on 24th day of May 2022.

By and Between

The Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Government of Telangana, Vidya Bhavan, Nampally, Hyderabad 500001 (herein after known as CCETS, Hyderabad which expression shall mean and include its heirs, successors, executers, administrators, authorized representatives and permitted assigns) is intended to facilitate a collaborative program in the matter of





training manpower with employment oriented skillset.

AND

ICICI Foundation for Inclusive Growth, a charitable trust registered at Chennai vide a Trust Deed dated January 04, 2008 and having its head / principal office at ICICI Bank Towers, Bandra Kurla Complex, Bandra East, Mumbai 400051 (hereafter referred as the "SECOND PARTY", which expression shall unless repugnant to the context and meaning thereof, be deemed to mean and include its present and future trustees).

(Both the parties are hereinafter, collectively referred to as the "Parties" and individually as the "Party")

WHEREAS, the First Party is keen on skill development of the unskilled manpower (specifics like tribal youth / minority / socially backward, etc. may be added depending on the mandate of the Government agency) in the State of Telangana ("State") and thereby enabling them to participate in the growth and economic development of the State / District and the Second Party has the relevant experience of successfully conducting training programmes through ICICI Academy for Skills ("Academy"), a training institute that provides skill development training to underprivileged youth with the objective of improving their livelihood prospects through self-employment and wage employment and providing placement opportunities for successful trainees, the Parties have decided to enter into this MoU for achieving the objective envisaged by the First Party.

This MoU has been entered with respect to the Telangana State and Hyderabad centre of ICICI Academy for Skills in the Telangana State ("Centre").

By this MoU, the Parties agree that the following shall be the role and responsibility of each party towards achieving the aforesaid objective -

- 1. The First Party shall counsel and mobilise the underprivileged youth for training at the Centre. The candidates who meet the eligibility criteria of the Second Party, may be offered admission to forthcoming training batches, subject to availability.
- 2. The Second Party shall continue to determine the eligibility criteria (age, educational qualification and family income), documents required from the prospective candidates, training curriculum and content and duration of





each training session, number of candidates per batch and number of batches in which the training to be carried out at the Centre and intimate the same to the First Party, from time to time, prior to commencement of training for each batch to enable the First Party to mobilise candidates as per the criteria.

- 3. The Second Party shall bear all costs of training programme and First party shall provide eligible candidates for the training program as per the eligibility criteria.
- 4. The Second Party shall make efforts (including through engaging placement agencies) to facilitate employment for trainees who complete the training successfully. The Second Party is however, not obligated to fulfil employment opportunities for all the trainees. The First Party shall support the efforts of the Second Party.
- 5. This MoU shall operate for **two (2)** years from the date of signing. However, the Parties may extend this MoU for such further period as may be mutually agreed by the Parties in writing.
- 6. The First Party proposes to provide aforesaid support to **2000 candidates** during the course of this MoU. If the targeted number of candidates to be supported under this MoU is achieved before the expiry of this MoU, the Parties may mutually agree to increase the target.
- 7. The Parties acknowledge that this MoU will be subject to the laws of Telangana, India in case of any disputes. The courts of Hyderabad shall have jurisdiction on non exclusive basis in relation to any disputes arising under this MoU.
- 8. The Parties acknowledge that neither them nor their employees, agents, officers or representatives, have received or shall receive, purport to receive or seek, directly or indirectly, any payments or transfers in kind of any value from the trainees and / or any other persons, including but not limited to any relatives/friends/other people accompanying or known to the trainees or people in general being sourced / counselled by them for the purposes of this MoU and for acceptance into the Academy. The Parties further acknowledge that they have put in effective process to ensure working / compliance of the aforesaid arrangement.
- 9. The Parties acknowledge that this is a non-financial collaboration and it has not and shall not in connection with this MoU, make or has made any payment or transfer anything of value, directly or indirectly for securing the arrangement under this MoU or any other matter relating to this MoU:



Do

- (i) To each other, the other's employees, officers, managerial personnel or any person, involved in the management and administration of each entity;
- (ii) To any person(s) who are the subject of the initiatives/collaboration stated in this MoU, including any trainees or their relatives, friends, people accompanying them, etc:
- (iii) To any governmental official or employee (including employees of a government corporation or public international organisation) or to any political party or trainee for public office;
- (iv)To any other person or entity if such payments or transfers would violate the laws of India.
- 10. None of the First Party's employees or other man power shall be construed or deemed to be the employees of the Second Party at any time and vice a versa.
- 11. In order to streamline coordination between the Parties for effective implementation and monitoring of the training programme, the Parties will nominate a single point of contact from each side.
- 12. The Parties agree that each of them will not be bound by any other obligations other than those specified as a part of this MoU. Each Party will be solely liable for performance of the obligations and activities assigned to it under this MoU, including any third party claims arising from each Party's actions or omissions during the term of this MoU.
- 13. Unless otherwise provided herein, all notices or other communications under or in connection with this MoU shall be given in writing and may be sent by personal delivery or post or courier at the below mentioned address. Any such notice or other communication will be deemed to be effective if sent by personal delivery, when delivered, if sent by post, 7 (seven) days after being deposited in the post and if sent by courier, one day after being deposited with the courier.
- 14. The Second Party may terminate this MoU, in whole or in part, at any time prior to the expiry of the term of this MoU by giving the First Party thirty (30) days prior written notice.
- 15. The Parties shall not be liable for any failure to perform any of its obligations under this Agreement if the performance is prevented, hindered or delayed by a Force Majeure event (defined below) and in such case its obligations shall be suspended for so long as the Force Majeure Event

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continues. Each party shall promptly inform the other of the existence of a Force Majeure Event and shall consult together to find a mutually acceptable solution.

"Force Majeure Event" means any event due to any cause beyond the reasonable control of the Party, including, without limitation, unavailability of any communication system, sabotage, fire, flood, explosion, acts of God, civil commotion, strikes or industrial action of any kind, riots, insurrection, war or acts of government.

- 16. Each Party will seek the other Party's prior written consent for use of that other Party's name and / or logo and / or intellectual property in any manner whatsoever.

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN

AND COMMISSIONERATE OF COLLEGIATE EDUCATION (CCETS),

GOVERNEMENT OF TELANGANA

FOR THE COLLABORATIVE EDUCATION, RESEARCH & TRAINING

This Memorandum of Understanding signed on **28/04/2022** between INDIAN INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY – HYDERABAD (IITH), established in 2008, and having its campus at Kandi Village, Sangareddy District, Telangana, 502 285 (herein after known as IITH)

AND

The Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Government of Telangana, Vidya Bhavan, Nampally, Hyderabad 500001 (herein after known as CCETS, Hyderabad which expression shall mean and include its heirs, successors, executers, administrators, authorized representatives and permitted assigns) is intended to facilitate collaborative programs in the field of Education, Research & Training in allied subjects between the two Organizations.

Whereas,

- (A) Indian Institute of Technology Hyderabad (IITH) is a premiere institute of science and technology established in 2008. IITH has been consistently ranked in the top 10 institutes in India for Engineering. IIT Hyderabad is established to promote research and innovation in various fields of Technologies. The vibrant research culture is evident from the number of patents and publications that IITH produces consistently every year. IITH offers graduate programs at both Masters and Doctoral level in several diverse areas. IITH is also offering separate programs for Technology, Design, Science, and Liberal Arts.
- (B) Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Government of Telangana is the Department created to promote education, giving special attention to the students hailing from backward and rural areas. It aims to strengthen education at Undergraduate and Postgraduate level especially for women and under privileged sections of the society.

Whereas, both IIT, Hyderabad and CCETS, Hyderabad (herein after together referred to as parties) are empowered to enter into collaborative agreement of this nature in respect to the subjects related to achieve its goals objectives as stated by them.

NOW THEREFORE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

To enter into Memorandum of Understanding for a joint collaborative program of Education, Research, Training to the students & faculty members between the two institutions.

1. PURPOSE

IIT, Hyderabad and CCETS, Hyderabad desiring to develop cooperation and collaboration in Education, Research, Training and other agreed



activities that further the aims and objectives of both parties mutually agreed upon are as follows:

- Co-operation in New and Existing Academic Programmes.
- ii. Conducting of Faculty Development Programs (FDPs).
- iii. Support and extension for undertaking research activities and publication of research to the faculty members.
- iv. Support and guidance for Patent generation/development to the faculty members
- v. Providing mutual opportunities for faculty members and Researchers to deliver invited lectures/talks.
- vi. Providing opportunities for students to undertake certificate courses and internship programs.
- vii. To encourage and support innovation and entrepreneurship among the students at every stage.
- viii. Research co-operation to the students.
- ix. Facilitating for conducting Trainings, Lectures, Symposia, International Conferences and Workshops.
- x. Providing opportunity to the students to undertake campus visits at IIT, Hyderabad.

2. IMPLEMENTATION

- All programs or activities implemented under the term of this Memorandum of Understanding shall be mutually agreed upon in writing, including the necessary budget for the program of activity as the need may arise.
- ii. Both IITH and CCETS, Hyderabad shall be fully responsible financially for the activities carried out under its direction or by its staff, except as otherwise agreed by IITH and CCETS, Hyderabad.
- iii. Both IITH and CCETS, Hyderabad will designate one officer each who will develop and coordinate specific programs or activities between them.

3. DURATION AND RENEWAL OF AGREEMENT

The memorandum of understanding will become effective immediately after signature by the representatives of IITH and CCETS, Hyderabad for a period of **THREE** years. The MoU may be subject to renewal on mutual consent of both parties, for the period internally agreed upon.

4. AMENDMENTS

- a) This memorandum of understanding may be amended by a written agreement signed by the representatives of both IITH and CCETS, Hyderabad.
- b) In the event of any unforeseen incident during collaborative activities both IITH and CCETS, Hyderabad agree to negotiate a mutually and acceptable solution.

5. FINANCIAL ARRANGEMENT

There will not be any financial commitment between the parties and cost, if any, for exchange of faculty and students shall be borne by the individual or borrowing organization as the case may be.

6. CONFIDENTIALITY

- Each party recognizes that pursuant to this MoU, if, given access to information that is confidential and /or proprietary to the other party; and agrees to undertake not to use any such confidential, proprietary or restricted information for the own purpose without the prior written consent of the other party.
- 2. Both the parties shall take all reasonable steps to keep confidential (and ensure that its employees, students, associates and agents also keep them confidential), any subject matter and information or material classified as confidential, whether technical or commercial, acquired formally or informally by either party from the other or their staff or students or by the Researcher(s) concerned in the work done or to be done under this agreement.

 Neither party shall assign and/or transfer any nor all of its rights, obligation and/or interests arising or claimed under or by virtue of this MoU to a third party without obtaining the prior written consent of the other party.

4. Both parties agree to subscribe to the principles of equal opportunity and will not discriminate on the basis of gender, age, disability, race, colour, religion, marital status, veteran's status, national or ethnic origin, or sexual orientation.

7. TERMINATION:

During the validity of this Agreement, each party shall be entitled to terminate the same at any time, without assigning any reason, after giving six months advance notice to the other party. Notwithstanding such termination, each party shall fulfill all obligations accrued under this agreement prior to the time the termination becomes effective.

This MoU is to develop and promote the student/institutional capacity building/research activities and does not have any legal binding. However, for administrative purposes the parties to this MoU agree to legal jurisdiction of Civil Courts of Hyderabad.

THE PARTIES TO THIS MOU HEREBY AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. SCOPE

- 1.2. The Company owns and operates a technology platform which provides among other services, test preparation and online learning called www.unacademy.com or the Unacademy App ("Platform").
- 1.3. The College in desirous of engaging with the Company for various collaborative activities ("Activities and/or Activity") as given in this MOU; The Company may
 - 1.3.1.conduct Webinars to create awareness about career opportunities in the subject or field that the students at the College are interested in;
 - 1.3.2. conduct technical workshops, advance technologies workshops and campus placement workshops.
- 1.4. The details of the Activities shall be mutually decided between the Parties and confirmed via email("Email") or by a separate agreement or contract as required.
- 1.5. The College shall provide the contact details of the students, with the required consents, who need to be enrolled in the webinars and workshops to the Company, or who are meritorious.

- 1.6. The Parties agree, in the event the Parties decide to confirm details of the Activities via Email, such Email shall be a valid and binding on both Parties, along with corresponding terms and condition for each Activity.
- 1.7. The Parties agree that this MOU is being entered purely for collaborative purposes without any expectation of any monetary compensation.
- 1.8. In the event the College recognizes any students who are meritorious, upon mutual agreement between the Parties, the Company shall offer special discounts for those individuals. It is hereby clarified that the discounts can be availed directly by those students who purchase a subscription on the Platform and the Company shall not collect or process any payments to the College at any point of time. The discounted subscriptions will be provided by the Company subject to the College sharing the requested details of the individuals with the Company. The Company may even share a unique code that the student may have to input at the time of availing the subscription in order to avail the special discounts. The details and terms and conditions for any Activity involving such discounted subscription shall be shared via Email or a separate agreement or contract.

2. TERM

This MOU shall commence on the Effective Date and shall continue until 19/06/2023 ("Term").

3. TERMINATION

- 3.1 Either Party shall have the right to terminate this MOU by providing 30 (Thirty) Jays written notice in the event that any Party materially breaches its obligations under this MOU:
 - in a manner that is irremediable; or
 - fails to remedy a remediable breach within 30 days after being put on notice of such breach by the non-breaching Party; or
- c. undergoes a "bankruptcy event", as such term is conventionally understood or for convenience.
- 3.2 Upon termination of this MOU and thereafter, neither Party shall provide to any beneficiary or third party or the public at large, the impression that the association between the Parties is continuing or allow such impression to be created.
- Notwithstanding the termination of this MOU, the terms contained in Clause 4 below, in relation to confidentiality and non-disclosure, shall survive for a period of 2 (Two) years from the date of termination of this MOU.

Each Party hereby covenants and agrees that it shall not, in any fashion, form or manner, unless previously and specifically consented to in writing by the other Party, either directly or indirectly use, divulge, transmit or otherwise disclose or cause to be used, divulged, transmitted or otherwise disclosed to any person, firm, partnership, corporation or other entity now existing or hereafter created, in any manner whatsoever (other than to its directors, officers, employees and advisors and other than as required by law), any of the disclosing Party's Confidential Information of any kind, nature or description. Each Party hereby further acknowledges and agrees that the sale or unauthorized use, transmission or other disclosure of any of the disclosing Party's Confidential Information which is in their possession constitutes unfair competition and the receiving Party covenants and agrees that it shall not engage in any unfair competition with the disclosing Party. The foregoing provisions shall not be construed to prevent the receiving Party from making use of or disclosing information that is in the public domain through no fault of receiving Party; provided, however, specific information shall not be deemed to be in the public domain merely because it is encompassed by some general information that is published or in the public domain. The foregoing provisions shall also not be construed as preventing Company from reasonable and bona fide efforts to promote the Company using Personality's Services.

4.2 "Confidential Information" shall mean (a) this MOU and any information which is disclosed by any Party to the other Party pursuant to, or in connection with this MOU (whether orally or in writing and whether or not such information is expressly stated to be confidential); (b) any dispute or claim arising out of or in connection with this MOU or the resolution of such claim or dispute; (c) any information or materials prepared by or for the Parties or its representatives that contain or otherwise reflect, or are generated from the Confidential Information; (d) in case of the Company, any trade secrets, information, ideas, concepts, processes, techniques, or any other Intellectual Property, any information or data relating to the affairs of any Party including any project, work in progress, reports, statistics, summaries, records, future business, revenue projections, operational or financial plans, financing or personnel matters, information relating to present or future works, views, subscribers, clients, customers, employees, key persons engaged by the Company. Confidential Information shall not include any information in the public domain, provided, however, specific information shall not be deemed to be in the public domain merely because it is encompassed by some general information that is published or in the public domain.

5. REPRESENTATIONS AND WARRANTIES

5.1 Each Party hereby represents and warrants to the other Party that it has the legal capability to grant the rights under this MOU and to satisfy its obligations and responsibilities hereunder.

5.2 Other than as specifically provided herein, each Party warrants that it shall not represent to any third party that it is acting on behalf of the other Party and in no case shall each Party create or allow the creation of the impression that the other Party has any direct or indirect relationship with or liability

to the beneficiaries or such other third party.

5.3 Each Party ('Indemnifying Party') agrees that it shall, at its own expense, indemnify, defend and hold harmless the other Party and the other Party's officers, directors, employees, representatives, agents, respective directors, trustees and assigns from and against any and all direct liability (including but not limited to liabilities, judgments, damages, losses, claims, costs and expenses, including attorneys' fees and expenses) and any other direct loss that may occur, or arise from or relate to malfeasance, misfeasance or deliberate negligence or breach of any representations or warranties by the Indemnifying Party, in the performance of the Indemnifying Party's material obligations under this MOU.

5.4 To the extent permitted by applicable law, in no event shall either Party be liable for any special, indirect, consequential, exemplary or incidental damages, however caused to the other Party, arising

out of or relating to this MoU.

6. INTELLECTUAL PROPERTY RIGHTS

6.1 Each Party acknowledges the intellectual property rights of any kind, including but not limited to copyright, patent rights, design rights, service marks, trademarks, logos, titles, slogans, property rights and any other rights, held by the other Party. The Parties undertake that neither of them shall claim any right, title and interest in the intellectual property rights of the other Party.

6.2 During the Term, each Party grants the other Party a limited, non-exclusive, royalty-free right under this MOU to use its name and logo for the purposes of public relations and promoting the association between the Parties under this MOU, including without limitation, promoting over social media platforms, promotional material as approved by the other Party in writing and all related collateral. Each Party shall obtain the other Party's approval before using the other Party's name and logo in public relations, promotional and related communications as provided herein, it being agreed by the other Party that such approval shall not be unreasonably withheld or delayed. Further, it is clarified and agreed among the Parties that any such approval granted shall sustain during the Term for repeated use of such approving Party's name and logo in similar public relations, promotional and related communications for purposes of the Programme defined herein.

6.3 The Parties agree that subject to the licenses granted hereinabove, any intellectual property rights created by either Party in the course of giving effect to this MOU shall be owned by the Party that creates the same.

7. GOVERNING LAW, DISPUTE RESOLUTION AND JURISDICTION

This MOU shall be governed by and construed in accordance with the laws of the Republic of India. Any dispute under this MOU shall be resolved by arbitration by a sole arbitrator appointed in accordance with the Arbitration and Conciliation Act, 1996, in Bengaluru, India. The courts of Bengaluru, India shall have jurisdiction over this MOU.

8. MISCELLANEOUS

This MOU constitutes the entire agreement between the Parties with respect to the Agreement and supersedes all prior written agreements and understandings, both written and oral, between the Parties with respect to the Agreement. This MOU shall be binding in all respects and shall govern the relationship between the Parties.
