



## SUMMARY OF FEEDBACK ANALYSIS: 2017-18

## 1. ALUMNI FEEDBACK

- Alumni felt that the depth of the course is satisfactory to gain expertise in the subject.
- They also opined that the curriculum gives leverage for extra learning and self-learning.
- They opined that the syllabus is in tune with the real-life situations and is helpful to face competitive exams.

## 2. FACULTY FEEDBACK

- Faculty opined that the curriculum is suitable to the present needs and the future challenges.
- They also suggested that the revised syllabus is, to some extent, a burden on the first semester students.
- Faculty responded positively towards the evaluation process adopted by the university and the institution in conducting university exams and internal exams.

### 3. STUDENT'S FEEDBACK ON LECTURERS

- Students opined that the teachers are able to infuse interest among the students on the subject content and they are an authority and have depth on the subject they teach.
- Majority of the students felt that the lecturers were able to complete more than 90% of the syllabus in stipulated time.
- They also stated that the faculty is supportive in conducting Class Room Seminars and also encouraged the students to visit library and browse certain education cites on internet.
- Students of all the groups are satisfied by the lecturers. The teaching-learning process adopted by the faculty is satisfactory for the students.
