FEEDBACK PROCESS:

Self-assessment and mirror-viewing helped the institution to reorient its arrows to reach the target.

Curriculum decides the expertise a student gains on the course content. It helps the student to traverse through the education process to achieve his goals. Under the circumstances, the institution as a sacred norm, endeavor to collect the opinion of different stakeholders on curriculum.

Ergo, the institution made it its mandatory responsibility to assess the relevance of the curriculum to propel higher education to the desired ends and meet the societal needs. As such the feedback is collected from all the stakeholders like students, alumni, parents, teachers and CPDC, and make a meticulous analysis annually. As Campus Drives are being organized frequently, because the institution is located in the heart of the city, feedback from the employers is collected during placement drives. The institution has a registered Alumni. As such, the feedback is procured during Alumni meets. Parents feedback is collected during Parent Teacher Meetings (PTM). Feedback from teachers and students is annually collected as the end of academic year. The IQAC later make a systematic analysis of feedback received and there after submits the same to the university. The faculty are also made abreast with the feedback so that they can fill the gaps in curriculum by introducing Certificate Courses and Add-On Courses.

The analysis of the feedback from various stakeholders for the year 2018-19 is as placed below:

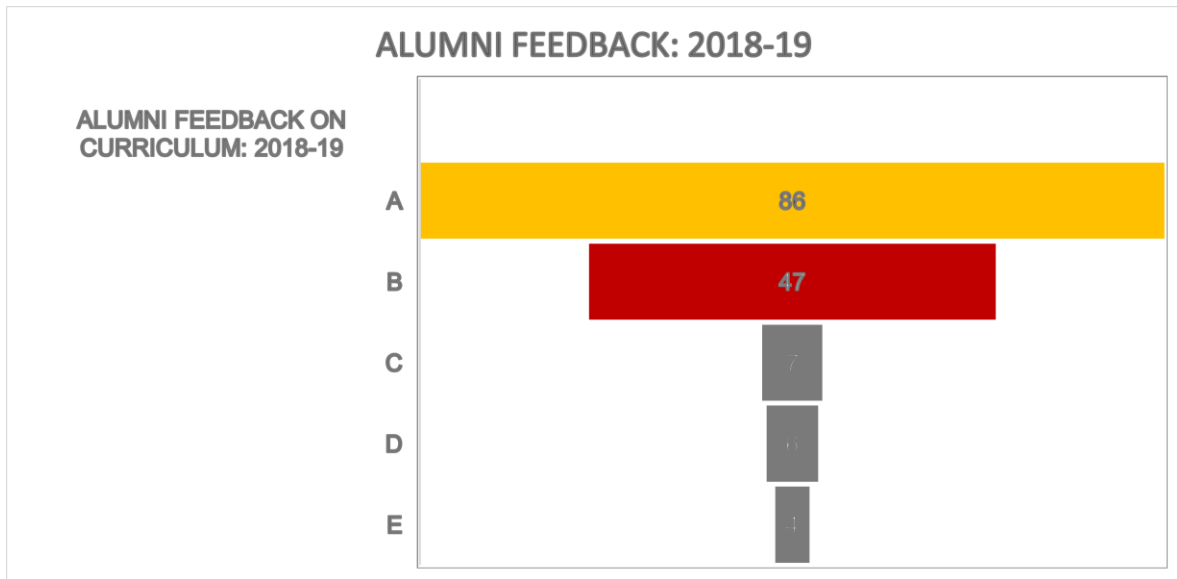

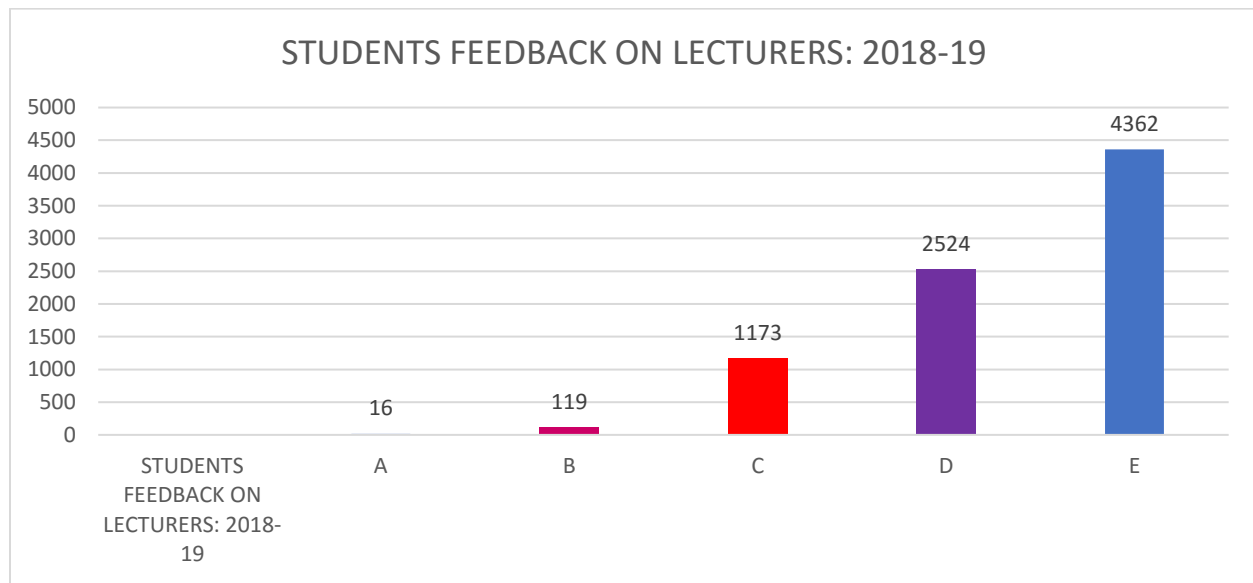

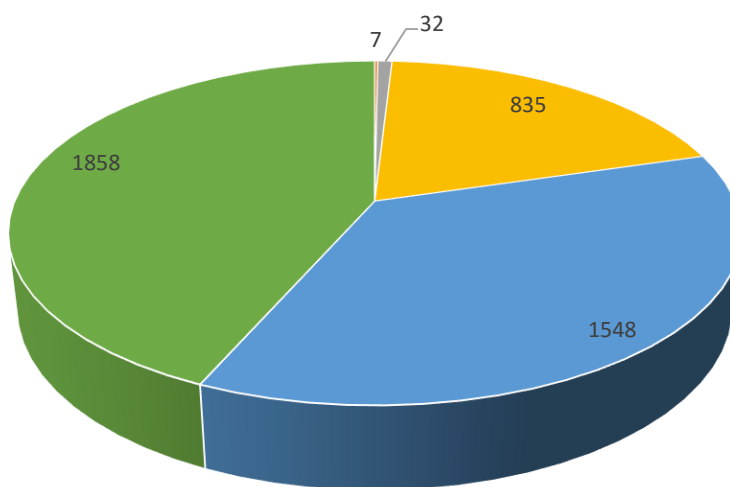

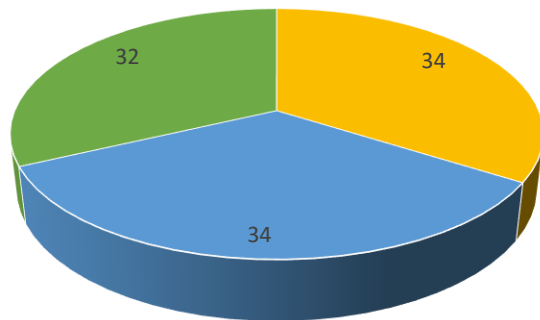

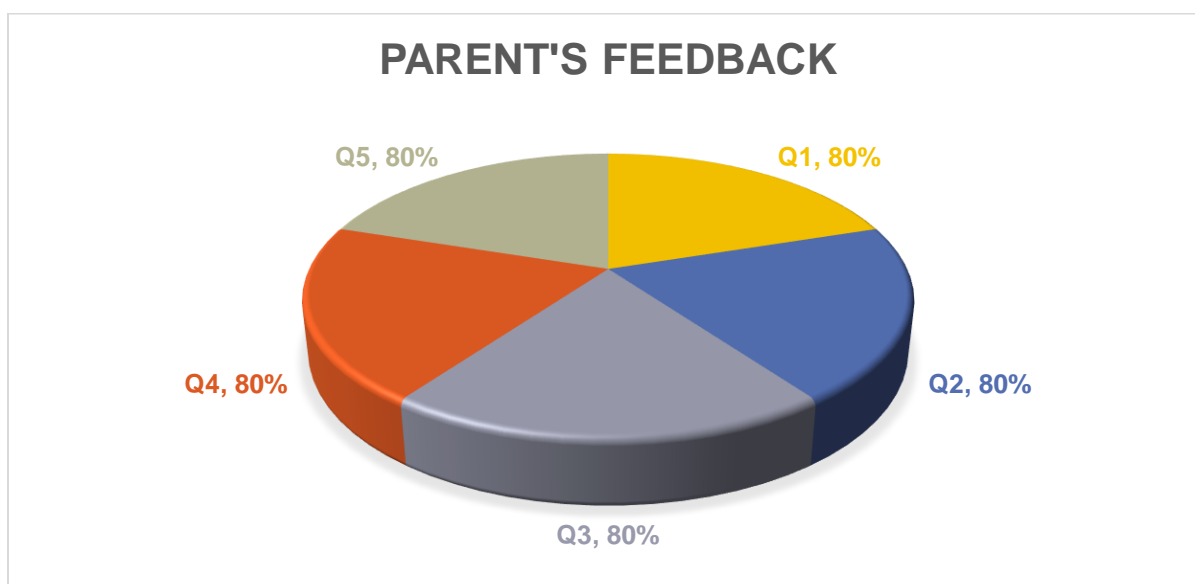
B.Com STUDENTS FEEDBACK: 2018-19

SUMMARY OF FEEDBACK ANALYSIS: 2018-19

1. ALUMNI FEEDBACK

- Alumni are of the opinion that the curriculum could carve a good balance between theory and practical knowledge. This equilibrium helped the students to understand the subject content without stress.
- They had apprehensions regarding the depth of subject content.
- They opined that the syllabus is in tune with the real-life situations and is helpful to crack competitive exams.

2. FACULTY FEEDBACK

- Faculty are of the opinion that the curriculum is relevant, useful and generates enthusiasm among the students towards subject content.
- Faculty also felt that the college library is updated with the text books, reference books, study materials and competitive exam specific books.
- Faculty responded positively towards the evaluation process adopted by the university and the institution in conducting university exams and internal exams.

3. STUDENT'S FEEDBACK ON LECTURERS

- Students of all the groups are satisfied by the lecturers. The teaching-learning process adopted by the faculty is satisfactory for the students.
- Majority of the students felt that the lecturers were able to complete more than 90% of the syllabus.
- Students opined that the teachers are able to infuse interest among the students on the subject content and they are an authority and have depth on the subject they teach.
- They also stated that the faculty is supportive in conducting Class Room Seminars and also encouraged the students to visit library and browse certain education sites on internet.

4. PARENTS FEEDBACK

- Parents are satisfied with the course structure.
- They opined that the curriculum promoted the wholesome development of the student and it has prospects for higher education.

ACTION TAKEN REPORT

- Co-curricular activities are encouraged to enrich the curriculum and also to fill the gaps in curriculum.
- Respective departments are encouraged to organize Guest Lectures, Invited Talks, Extension Lectures on the topics which enhances the knowledge on subject content.
- Mentoring and counselling is strengthened and streamlined.
- Institution wise schedule is prepared for remedial classes. All the slow learners are identified and are encouraged to attend the remedial classes.
