

Government Degree College for Women, is fully aware of the various skill development initiatives of NSDC and in particular claims to have learnt in detail, about the scheme of awards established by NSDC and has approached Rooman to offer **Government Degree College for Women**, the license to conduct the training courses strictly under the course curriculum developed by Rooman, under the name of Rooman.

WHEREAS, Rooman has agreed to offer Skill Based Trainings to the students of **Government Degree College for Women**, 'on non-exclusive basis' to conduct such training courses as mutually agreed, under the scheme of awards of NSDC and thus, the parties have agreed to execute this agreement.

Now, this agreement lists out the areas of understanding and terms of engagement between GDCW, and Rooman as follows:

1. ENGAGEMENT OF GOVERNMENT DEGREE COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, for Vocational Training services by Rooman:

1.1 Rooman hereby engages GOVERNMENT DEGREE COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, on *exclusive basis* to offer Skill based trainings and Placements

1.2 GOVERNMENT DEGREE COLLEGE FOR WOMEN shall provide permission to Rooman Technologies to conduct the awareness of the training programs offered by Rooman Technologies.

1.3 GOVERNMENT DEGREE COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, will provide the required infrastructure support as per the courseware specifications, and also offer the required marketing services for the Vocational training courses to be conducted among the unemployed youth and other student's community at large, who are interested to take up the above said courses under Rooman.

1.4 GOVERNMENT DEGREE COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, will exercise its best endeavors to ensure that effective and efficient training services as outlined and mutually discussed are provided to Rooman in accordance with the terms of this agreement.

2 Broad Roles and Responsibilities:

2.4 GOVERNMENT DEGREE COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, will provide its students who are interested to get registered and trained with Rooman.

2.5 To provide vocational training services, through its members of Professional Training faculty, for the students who have enrolled under Rooman, for undertaking the courses, at the training center of Rooman Technologies or in the College as per mutual agreement

2.6 Ensure that the Training infrastructure which includes Class room, Lab, Equipment's to conduct Practical and other facilities is as per the requirements of Rooman.

2.7 Ensure that minimum batch size of the candidates in a batch is 20 and maximum batch size does not exceed 30.

2.8 Ensure quality Training to achieve 100% pass in assessment conducted by SSC. GOVERNMENT DEGREE COLLEGE FOR WOMEN, will be eligible for consideration only in respect of the candidates who become qualified to get the award under scheme viz., only in respect of the candidates, who complete the training and successfully passing the evaluation test conducted by the SSC or its authorized personnel.

2.9 Maintaining of discipline, students' interaction with industry experts, on time completion of the curriculum, administration of the final qualifying examination and ensuring the completion of the certification process.

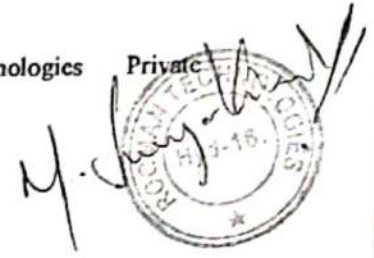

Roshni is a voluntary organization that provides free, confidential, and unconditional emotional support to the depressed and suicidal.



The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), an agency of the United Nations, helps countries to develop policies, leadership skills, partnering abilities, institutional capabilities and build resilience in order to sustain development results. UNDP works in more than 170 countries and territories, helping to achieve the eradication of poverty, and the reduction of inequalities and exclusion.

The Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Government of Telangana's mandate is to promote Collegiate Education, giving special attention to the areas located in Backward and Rural areas, to strengthen Women education at undergraduate and post-graduate levels to create educational opportunities for weaker sections of the society and to introduce need-based vocational courses replacing the conventional courses in a phased manner. The Government's initiative of Telangana Skills & Knowledge Centre (TSKC) addresses help students learn and practice employability skills as a dependable solution to the problem of unemployment faced by students studying non- professional courses in Government Degree Colleges.

Through this Letter of Understanding (LOU), UNDP and the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Government of Telangana wish to explore areas of collaboration in the framework of the UNDP implemented Project, 'Creating Opportunities for Employment and Entrepreneurship for Women in India'. This initiative seeks to leverage the needs for skilled personnel and other inputs in the business sector (as well as their financial and institutional capacity) and to create opportunities for skill development, employment and entrepreneurship for women. This multi-state initiative is funded by the IKEA Foundation and is supported by Xynteo, an international advisory firm which will help build partnerships with the business sector as well as the India Development Foundation (iDF) which is responsible for concurrent monitoring and research. The project has been duly endorsed by the Department of Economic Affairs, Union Ministry of Finance.

This LOU is aimed at harnessing the initiatives of the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, government of Telangana to make the students of non- professional courses in Government Degree Colleges employable. The core of this partnership will be to bridge the information gap that college students particularly the women confront with regard to information on opportunities for skill development and employment as well as public programmes created to serve these needs.

This LoU will facilitate collaboration in the following areas:

Strengthen the Government Degree Colleges in their efforts as career guidance, counselling & skills centres in the form of Telangana Skills & Knowledge Centres (TSKC) to :

- » Provide information, Psychometric profiling & career guidance to girl students.
- Facilitate establishment of close linkages with the businesses / private sector to open up a range of internship and job opportunities for girls.
- « Facilitate linkages with the government & private training providers to promote employability and entrepreneurship among students.
- Train & build capacity of select college teachers as trainers & counsellor for Career guidance & counselling so as to sustain the initiative.

The joint programme will be piloted initially in 40 government degree colleges across Hyderabad, Ranga Reddy, Medak, Mahbubnagar, Warangal, Adilabad and Khammam districts.

The LoU will be operational from the date of signing till 31 October, 2018.

A brief project outline is attached for reference (Annex-1). To ensure smooth implementation of the project, a detailed action plan with specific deliverables, timelines and responsibilities will be mutually worked out within a month of signing of the partnership LOU.

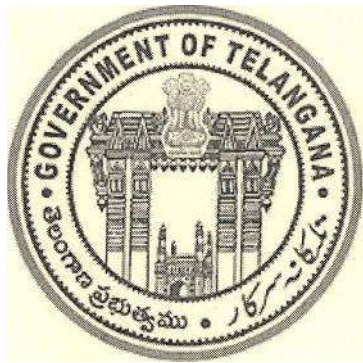

AND

Naandi Foundation, a Public Charitable Trust incorporated under the Indian Trusts Act, having its registered office at 502, Trendset Towers, Road No 2, Banjara Hills, Hyderabad 500 034, Telangana, India represented by Shri. Raj lyer, Chief Youth Employment Officer, through its authorized signatory (hereinafter referred to as “Naandi” which expression shall mean and include its heirs, successors, executors, administrators, authorized representatives and permitted assigns) as SECOND PARTY.

(Both Parties are hereinafter jointly referred to as “Parties” and individually as a “Party”)

Introduction

WHEREAS CCETS is a non-profit organization created by Government of Telangana to promote education, giving special attention to the areas located in backward and rural areas. It aims to strengthen education at undergraduate and post graduate level especially for women and underprivileged sections of the society.

WHEREAS Naandi Foundation is an apolitical, autonomous Public Charitable Trust and a not for profit organisation having registration under section 12AA of income tax act, 1961 is tax exempt and is recognised by tax authorities as an organisation established for ‘charitable purpose’

WHEREAS Naandi is working with an objective of people centred development through its charitable activities in whole of India, without distinction of caste, creed or religion, etc

WHEREAS Naandi engaged, inter alia, in improving the livelihoods of the underprivileged communities through its various social initiatives, developmental programs, in various states of India. Naandi's activities include, education to underprivileged children with a specific focus on girl child education, improving livelihoods of small and marginal farmers through its farming practices, employable training and skill development programs to underprivileged youth, provision of safe drinking water to communities, etc

WHEREAS Naandi, in furtherance of its objectives and as a part of its skill development program to underprivileged youth, wish to build and enhance the employability skill set of the underprivileged youth/students in colleges under the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education in the State of Telangana.

WHEREAS the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, in the State of Telangana, is desirous of engaging in **employability skill building program of the underprivileged youth/students in Government Degree Colleges at undergraduate and post-graduate levels, in the State of Tetangana.**

WHEREAS both the parties having recognised each other's intention of supporting the underprivileged youth / students, studying in Government Degree colleges in the State of Telangana have decided to work together in the space of employability skill development initiative.

WHEREAS both the parties have decided to reduce the mutually agreed terms and conditions into writing

NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS UHDER:

I: The employability skill development program (MPC)

- 1.1 The program shall be carried out in Government Degree and PG Colleges, in the State of Telangana. A list of such colleges/institutes is given in Annexure - I enclosed herewith which is a part of this MOU.
- 1.2 The beneficiaries/students shall be the underprivileged students studying in the final semester of the program in Government Degree and PG Colleges, in the State of Telangana.
- 1.3 The skilling program shall be for a duration of 40 hours or as the case may be decided mutually by the parties.
- 1.4 The program shall include Soft-Skills, Communication Skills, Life Skill and Interview preparations for the beneficiaries under employability skill development program. The

beneficiaries may be trained in any other skill set, as mutually decided by both the parties, that improves their employable skill and livelihoods.

- 1.5 The first party or the respective college/institute/university shall select the beneficiaries/students for the said program.

II: Obligations of the First Party

- 1.1 Ensure that the necessary infrastructure like well-equipped class rooms are made available where the program shall be implemented.
- 1.2. Ensure that each of the selected colleges/ Institutes identify one resource person from their faculty to co-ordinate between the beneficiaries/students, the Institute management and the second party. Contact details of such identified resources shall be with the rest of the team.

III: Activities of the Second Party (Naandi):

- 1.1. Prepare content that will be most effective in training the beneficiaries/students.
- 1.2 Provide the first party a detailed Course Schedule containing curriculum and day wise lesson plans of courses to be conducted
- 1.3 Ensure that well-trained trainers are identified for each Institute to ensure overall success of the Project.
- 1.5 Monitor the program by conducting periodic assessments to ensure that the trainers do a quality job.
- 1.6 At periodic intervals, give a narrative report to the first party with the challenges met, opinion about the program, suggestions for improvement and feedback from the trainees. Similarly, parameter-based impact evaluation report shall be prepared by second party and submitted to first party periodically on completion of trainings for all students. A consolidated impact report shall be submitted on evaluating impact at project intervention level.

IV. TERM:

The MoU will be effective for a period of twelve months from the date of signing. The MOU may be extended on mutually agreed terms for a further period of one year or for such other period as mutually agreed by parties.

V. Free of Cost:

The Program is free of cost. Naandi shall not charge any fees on whatsoever account/name either from the students or the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education - Telangana or its affiliated institutions, for conducting the aforesaid program.

VI. Certification:

Certificates shall be awarded by Naandi to the students on successful completion of the training and clearing of the assessment held post completion of the program.

VII. General Terms

Amendments to the MoU:

No amendment or modification of this MoU shall be valid, unless the same is made in writing by both the parties or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be an amendment of this MoU. The modifications/changes shall be effective from the date on which they are made/ executed, unless otherwise agreed to.

Compliance with laws, statutes, rules and regulations of Government / local authority:

Both the parties shall comply with all laws, statutes and rules & regulations of Central and State Governments or Local authorities that may be applicable from time to time as required under this MoU.

Termination:

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana State, shall have the right to terminate the MoU, in case if the Naandi fails to fulfil their obligations as mentioned in the MoU, or violates any of the clause mentioned in the MoU.

Assignment :

NaandJ shall not De entitled to assign any ot its rights, benefits or obligations under this MoU without written consent of the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana State.

Relationship:

Nothing contained in this MoU will be construed as creating any agency, partnership, joint enterprise or other similar relationship between the parties. Neither party will have authority to contract for or





Confidentiality:

MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding is executed on the 28th Day of April, 2018 by and between V.K.R. College Committee which is a non-profit organisation registered as a Society Vide Regn. No. 8 of 1969, dated 24 Jan., 1969 at Machilipatnam, Krishna District (hereinafter referred to as "SOCIETY" which expression shall, unless the context required otherwise include the Governing Body, Trustees, administrators and representatives) with its office at Buddhavaram (P.O.), Gannavaram Mandal, Krishna District-521101 represented by its Authorized Representative, Mrs. Ambica Unni, Project Coordinator as a First Party

AND

Government Degree College for Women (Autonomous), Begumpet, Hyderabad represented by its Authorized Representative Dr. P. Rajani, Principal, Government Degree College for Women (Autonomous), Begumpet, Hyderabad (hereinafter referred to as "INSTITUTION" which expression shall, unless the context required otherwise include the Governing Body, Trustees, administrators and representatives) with its office at Begumpet, Hyderabad, known as Second Party/Institution.

This M.O.U. is designed to reflect the understanding between the skills training provider hereinafter referred to as the **SOCIETY** and **GOVERNMENT DEGREE COLLEGE FOR WOMEN (AUTONOMOUS)** hereinafter referred to as the **INSTITUTION**.

The SOCIETY & The INSTITUTION being parties to this M.O.U. have the common overall objective of providing soft skill training, Training in Accounting Packages, D.T.P., Hospitality, Retail Marketing, etc. and Vocational Training in trades like Welding, Plumbing, Electrical, Tailoring, Fashion Designing etc. to enhance the skills of the students & faculty.

The trust has the expertise, resources, organisational skills & the faculty to provide Soft Skills development training and Vocational Training to meet the requirements of the future employers & the SOCIETY has been approached by the INSTITUTION to impart & conduct training programmes. And the trust desires to provide Training to the Institution free of cost & the institution has agreed to provide necessary infrastructure to conduct training programmes like class rooms, vocational training, Labs with equipment, Audio / Visual equipments, computer labs etc. as required.

- a) The sharing of best practices & learning materials in areas deemed beneficial including but not limited to academic programmes, teaching methodologies and assessments.
- b) Increase mobility of students so that they can take part of their studies or intern-ship to other areas which have been fully recognised, broadened education & to acquire competencies.
- c) Increase mobility of faculty so that they can learn from such programmes and explore the development of module courses or programmes.
- d) Increase exchange of administrations so that they can better understand and appreciate the other and can initiate more sustainable and practical institutional or secretarial partnership.
- e) To review special problem cases, co-ordinate schedules, evaluate and assess the training programmes.

OTHER TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF THE M.O.U. :

- 1. Timely meeting shall be held by the parties to review the implementation of this agreement, to establish policy directives.
- 2. In any event they intent to confer on the development of forms of procedures of the respective systems.
- 3. Precise time schedules shall be set by the parties according to mutual convenience.
- 4. The parties to this agreement agree to develop common operating procedures and standards where ever possible.
- 5. In addition will also maintain documentation of the training schedules & other statistical information as needed for accountability & research purposes.
- 6. Confidentiality assurance should be viewed as a essential practice for the protection of the rights when any information is gathered and shared between the parties.
- 7. The parties shall safeguard the use of and access to information and shall not use or release any reports / data or other information except with the approval of the parties. Such information shall be used only proper administration, planning co-ordination & monitoring performances.
- 8. The Institution shall provide the Class-rooms, Infrastructure, Computers and all such learning material required for training the students.
- 9. The Society shall provide the Trainers – Full Time or Part Time and shall pay for their services rendered.

- 10 The Institution shall provide One Class every day for each section in their time-table for Soft Skill Training. In case Accounting Package Training is required the College shall provide a minimum of Two Hours extra per week for Commerce Students.
- 11 There will be representatives of both parties on Advisory Councils which may serve as an incentive for developing closer relationship, training audit & programme review functions.
- 12 The parties mutually agree not to use the name of the other in any public information or platform without permission.
- 13 The curriculum shall be finalised by the Society/First Party including the timelines.
- 14 The Society shall make efforts to ensure that the students trained by them are employable. The trust would be entering into an agreement with Industries Business Houses, Organisations, Corporations to know what would be their man-power requirements in the years to come & also propose to have a tie up with them for on the job training.
- 15 Any disputes which may arise during the period of M.O.U. shall be settled through arbitration as per the Indian Arbitration Act and at no time the parties shall approach the court for redressal of the grievances or disputes. The decision of the arbitrator appointed by the parties shall be final and binding on both the parties.
- 16 This M.O.U. shall remain in effect until 30th April, 2019 or until terminated by either party with 60 days written notice from either side.



Whereas:

Furthermore:





Spoken tutorial project intends to provide opportunity to conduct software training from ST-IIT Bombay to all the Government Degree Colleges (GDCs) in Telangana state. As the programme is funded by the National Mission on Education through ICT, MHRD, Government of India it charges a nominal annual User Fee of Rs.25000/year/college. The program will provide the following benefits to the students of GDCs under purview of CCETS-

1. - Provide the promotional materials like posters, brochures, leaflets, banners etc. to the CCETS and the GDCs in TS.



1. DEFINITIONS:

- 1.1. The term "Commencement" shall mean the date of signing of agreement.
- 1.2. The term "Centre" shall mean the Classrooms/Lab at College premises
- 1.3. The term "Month" shall mean a calendar month and "Year" shall mean an academic year

2. RESPONSIBILITY:

FIRST PARTY

- 2.1. The college shall provide the basic infrastructure like classrooms and computers with internet connectivity of necessary speed to conduct the course.
- 2.2. The college shall look after the maintenance of classrooms and computers.
- 2.3. The college shall be expected to render full support and co-operation during the functioning of the entire courses at the college premises
- 2.4. The college would collect the fees from the students and remit it to ISFS designated account before commencement of any batch.
- 2.5. The college shall mobilize a minimum of 50 students for the batch start
- 2.6. The college and ISFS will jointly maintain the attendance of the students.
- 2.7. Any student taking admission in the college will be deemed to be eligible for the courses of ISFS and ISFS will be considering the student in the count of new batch.
- 2.8. The college to provide sufficient space from the teaching faculty or faculty members of ISFS in the college campus.

SECOND PARTY

- 2.9. ISFS will be responsible to provide content, books, syllabus, and conduct the examination of the student.
- 2.10. The batches will be conducted by ISFS
- 2.11. ISFS would also provide certificates to the students on the successful completion of the certification course.

AS

- 2.12. In case of placement-assisted programs, ISFS will be responsible for providing 100% placement assistance to students on the successful completion of respective courses.

3. ACADEMIC COMMITTEE

An academic committee shall be formed by ISFS to monitor the syllabus, progress of the course and fees structure as may be presently applicable including any increase there at.

4. ACADEMIC EXECUTION:

- 4.1. The courses as mentioned in **Annexure-A** would be conducted by ISFS
- 4.2. The said course would roughly be completed in duration as mentioned in **Annexure-A**
- 4.3. The whole project would be considered viable only when there is at least one batch consisting of minimum 50 students per batch. The practical sessions (Lab hours) in case of courses involving lab teaching, however, can be structured depending on the Lab capacity. The preferable timings could be within college working hours, or as mutually decided between ISFS and College.
- 4.4. The college would carry on the internal awareness of the courses to their students, encouraging them to enroll for these courses. ISFS would support college for such activities by holding seminars regarding the courses of ISFS in their classrooms.
- 4.5. The course fee would be as mentioned in **Annexure-A**.
- 4.6. In case of any changes, modifications or alterations to the above terms, the same shall be subject to written approval from ISFS.

5. MANPOWER

- 5.1. The managerial and non-teaching staff required for the classroom training in the college campus shall be provided by the college
- 5.2. ISFS shall ensure that availability of teaching staff at the designated time of the batch

6. VALIDITY

- 6.1. This MOU shall come into force from the date of signing and will be valid for 3 (THREE) years from there onwards.
- 6.2. Negotiations as to any extension of this MOU for another 3 (THREE) years shall be taken up one month prior to the expiry of this MOU subject to the approval of the Governing Body of the college and ISFS management.

7. PAYMENT TERMS

- 7.1. Collection of fees shall be done by College
- 7.2. College shall remit the full fees of the batch to ISFS in the designated account before commencement of the batch.

8. TERMINATION:

6. The overarching principles on which Training Programmes have to be designed by the second party are the following:

6.1 Programme Design

6.1.1. Second Party will design Courseware for the respective programme offered, keeping in mind the trainee segment in college. It should meet requirements of National Occupation Standards (NOS) and Qualification Packs (QPs) so that the Course is aligned to NSQF and approved by respective SSC's besides the affiliating university

6.2. Programme Materials

6.2.1. The Second Party will develop "Participant Handbook" relevant to the programme and it will be provided in print format to all trainees enrolled for the programme. One copy of the Handbook will be submitted to college also.

6.2.2. Second Party will develop "Trainer Handbook" for the programme and same will be provided in printed format to all Trainers. One copy of the Handbook will be submitted to college also.

6.2.3. Curriculum will be a mix of practical and theory and will also include project work, home-work and self-learning modules

6.2.4. E-Content (PPT and Videos) will also be provided

6.3. Training Delivery: Second Party

- 6.3.1. Second Party will develop an activity-based learning methodology for the Programme and the same will be adopted while imparting training. The approach will be reflected in all documents developed for the programme;
- 6.3.2. Second Party will have Session-wise Training Delivery Plan as per Programme Framework and will adhere to the plan
- 6.3.3. The training activities will provide more scope for teamwork, individual practice on the skill and interaction of the participants
- 6.3.4. Second Party will draw up training calendar for the skill component in consultation with College and adhere to the plan
- 6.3.5. Second Party will ensure each trainee gets individual attention
- 6.3.6. Second Party will deliver training as per the approved Framework
- 6.3.7. Second Party will provide all the materials required for training delivery to the Trainers and Trainees.
- 6.3.8. Second Party will ensure attendance of trainees through quality delivery of the programme as per approved schedule. These are not exhaustive and are expected to utilize their expertise in pedagogy and training delivery to provide an outstanding learning experience to the trainees.

6.4. Trainer

- 6.4.1. The Second Party will provide the relevant trainers under this Programme
- 6.4.2. The Second Party will deploy Trainers trained for the Programme.
- 6.4.3. Trainers will attend Training of Trainer (ToT) programme conducted and certified by the Second Party
- 6.4.4. Trainers will have proficiency in both English and local language
- 6.4.5. The Second Party will have to make an arrangement of substitute trainer during the period of leave (financial liability of the period will be borne by TSP), and if a trainer goes on leave for more than 5 days alternate arrangement will have to be provided
- 6.4.6. Updation/Augmentation of the labs if required, for intense practical training (The cost for procurement of lab material will be borne by college)
- 6.4.7. Maintenance of Labs (Any major maintenance cost to be borne by college)
- 6.4.8. Assistance/Approval of College may be required to arrange for Industrial Visits/Field Trips/OJTs/Project Work

6.5. Mobilization

- 6.5.1. Second Party will assess and select trainees during Mobilization organized at the college
 - 6.5.2. Second Party will conduct orientation session for college staff about the prospects, content, job opportunities, and Internship arrangements if required
 - 6.5.3. Second Party will conduct an initial aptitude test for selection of appropriate candidates into Programme, for a job role, and all trainees will be counselled.
- 6.7 Assessment, Evaluation and Certification**
- 6.7.1 Final Assessment for the Programme will be conducted by EduBridge Second Party will also conduct regular internal assessments during training period.
 - 6.7.2 Second Party will conduct continuous and comprehensive evaluation for each batch as per their internal methodology and the marks obtained will be shared with Programme Donors.
- 6.8 Batch Size**
- 6.8.1 The batch size of the Programme may vary from minimum 50 to 60 students.
- 6.9 Reports**
- 6.9.1 At the end of the programme, the course completion report will be submitted in digital format to college for the purpose of information exchange.
 - 6.9.2 This report will comprise the salient features of the training activities under this programme and overall summary report on completion of entire programme.
- 6.10 Co-ordination**
- 6.10.1 Second Party will deploy a coordinator to implement the programme.
 - 6.10.2 Coordinator will represent the Second Party for all programme related activities.
 - 6.10.3 Coordinator will submit relevant training reports to the college as per requirement.
 - 6.10.4 Coordinator will attend the review meeting of the programme, whenever it takes place or if required.
 - 6.10.5 College to provide support through a single point of contact during the entire duration of the Programme

III. KEY TERMS OF THE AGREEMENT

- 7 **Process Guidelines:** The Second Party shall follow the training guidelines, standard operating practices as notified by the First Party from time to time for conduct of any activity outlined
- 8 **Suspension of services**
 - 8.1 In the event of breach as under clause 11.1, the First Party may issue a written notice of suspension for the Second Party to remedy the breach within thirty (30) days of receipt of such notice.

- 8.2 In the event of failure of the Second Party to remedy/rectify the notified breach to the satisfaction of the First Party within thirty (30) days of receipt of the notice of suspension.

IV. SPECIFIC DELIVERABLES AND TIMELINES

- 9 **Batch Initiation:** The Second Party will initiate the first batch in the January month of the academic year 2019-2020 in the college premises
- 10 **Trainees Attendance:** Trainees must remain present for atleast 90% of the total training hours.
- 11 **Assessment of Trainees:** The assessment process must be initiated / facilitated by Second Party such that assessment is carried out towards the completion of training or at a pre-agreed date for regular in-training assessments.

V. OBLIGATIONS OF THE TWO PARTIES

- 12 **Responsibility of the First Party:** The First Party shall be project sanctioning, supervising agency, and shall:

12.1 Discharge its responsibilities through facilitation, timely support for the progress of the project;

12.2 Review and accord sanction for the training plans and calendar submitted by the Second Party;

12.3 Conduct regular monitoring of project performance and outputs if required

12.4 College will appoint a single point of contact to support second party in day to day operations and execution of the project

- 13 **Responsibility of the Second Party:** The Second Party agrees to implement the program as per the terms and conditions described herein, and shall:

13.1 Be fully and directly responsible for achieving the targets in compliance with any guidelines, circulars or orders issued by the First Party from time to time;

13.2 Carry out its obligations hereunder with all due diligence, efficiency and economy, in accordance with generally accepted professional standards and practices;

13.3 Observe sound management practices and employ appropriate technology including safe and effective equipment, material and methods;

13.4 Promptly inform the First Party of any event that may have legal or other implications, including affecting the achievement of objectives specified herein, in writing;

13.5 Furnish to the First Party all pertinent information and reports as required from time to time;

13.6 Allow and facilitate the First Party or its representatives to inspect, at any time, the site of programme implementation;

13.7 Maintain records in accordance with appropriate and accepted training practices;

13.8 Ensure that the personnel engaged by it in the performance of its obligations under this agreement are at all times properly trained for their respective functions;

13.9 Keep complete record of beneficiaries trained under the project including their names, parents' names, address, contact number, training course, copy of assessment certificates, etc. as required by Donor`

13.10 Ensure that there is no conflict of interest in execution of work under this project and ensure that any such situation, should it arise, is immediately reported to the First Party.

13.11 Be responsible and liable for all its obligations under this Agreement notwithstanding anything contained in this or any other agreement and no default shall excuse the Second Party from its obligations or liability hereunder.

VI. GENERAL

14 Fraudulent and Corrupt Practices.

14.1 Both parties and its respective officers, employees, agents and advisors shall observe the highest standard of ethics during the subsistence of this agreement. Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in the agreement, Either Party may terminate the agreement without being liable in any manner whatsoever to the other Party if it determines that the other Party has directly or indirectly or through an agent engaged in corrupt practice , fraudulent practice , coercive practice to the other Party hereunder or subsistence or otherwise.

14.2 For the purposes of this Agreement, the following terms shall have the meaning hereinafter respectively assigned to them.

14.2.1 "Corrupt practice" means the offering, receiving, giving or soliciting, directly or indirectly, of anything of value to influence the action of a public official in the selection process or in execution of services;

14.2.2 "Fraudulent practice" means a misrepresentation or omission of facts or suppression of facts or disclosure of incomplete facts in order to influence a selection process or the execution of services;

14.2.3 "Coercive practices" means impairing or harming or threatening to harm, directly or indirectly, persons or their property to influence processes during selection process or execution of services.

14.2.4 "Restrictive practice" means forming a cartel or arriving at any understanding or arrangement among bidders with the objective of restricting or manipulating a full and fair competition in the selection process (including bid) or the execution of services.

15 Commencement, Completion and Modification of Agreement

15.1 This Agreement shall come into force and effect on the date of signing of this Agreement.

15.2 The contract will be valid from January 2019 and April 2020

15.3 Both Party can modify terms and conditions of this Agreement subject to mutual agreement between the Parties to account for change in Government stance.

Any modification or variation of the terms and conditions of this Agreement not covered under the above, including any modification of the scope of services or specific deliverables/timelines, may only be made by written agreement between the Parties.

16 Termination of Agreement.

16.1 Termination by the First Party: The First Party may terminate this Agreement, by giving not less than thirty (30) days' written notice of termination to the Second Party,

16.2 If the Second Party fails to remedy any breach hereof or failure in the performance of its obligations hereunder, as specified in a notice of suspension, within thirty (30) days of receipt of such notice of suspension or within such further period as the First Party may have subsequently granted in writing;

16.2.1 If the Second Party becomes insolvent or bankrupt.

16.2.2 If the Second Party fails to comply with any final decision reached as a result of dispute proceedings;

16.2.3 If there is any breach of terms & conditions of this Agreement or any guidelines issued by the First Party.

16.3 Termination by the Second Party: The Second Party may terminate this Agreement, by giving not less than thirty (30) days' written notice to the First Party,

16.3.1 If the First Party is in material breach of its obligations pursuant to this Agreement and has not remedied the same within thirty (30) days (or such longer period as the Second Party may have subsequently agreed to in writing) following the receipt by the First Party of the Second Party's notice specifying such breach;

16.3.2 If the Second Party becomes insolvent or bankrupt;

16.3.3 If, as the result of Force Majeure, the Second Party is unable to perform a material portion of its services for a period of not less than sixty (60) days; or

16.3.4 If the First Party fails to comply with any final decision reached as a result of arbitration.

16.4 No Objection: On termination of this Agreement, the First Party shall have the right and the Second Party should not have any objection to the First Party appointing a Third Party to assess or complete the services to be performed under the Scope of this Agreement

17 Force Majeure: For the purposes of this Agreement, "Force Majeure" means an event which is beyond the reasonable control of a Party, and which makes a Party's performance of its obligations hereunder impossible or so impractical as reasonably to be considered impossible in the circumstances, and includes, but is not limited to, war, riots, civil disorder, earthquake, fire, explosion, storm, flood or other adverse weather conditions, strikes, lockouts or other industrial action, confiscation or any other action by Government agencies. Neither party hereto shall be considered in breach hereof or in default if it fails to perform or observe any or all of the terms of

this agreement resulting directly or indirectly from Force Majeure events. In such case either party shall notify the other party of the occurrence of such cause. Should, as a consequence, the performance under this Agreement be prevented for a period longer than six months, then the other party shall have the right to terminate this agreement.

18 Disclaimer

18.1 The Parties acknowledge that prior to the execution of this agreement, both have, after a complete and careful examination, made an independent evaluation of the scope of services under the project, applicable specifications and standards, local conditions, conditions on ground, and all such information and has determined to its satisfaction the accuracy or otherwise thereof and the nature and extent of difficulties, risks and hazards as are likely to arise or may be faced by it in performance of its obligations hereunder, and confirms that it shall have no claim whatsoever against the any Party in this regard.

18.2 The Parties acknowledge and hereby accepts the risk of inadequacy, mistake or error in or relating to any of the matters set forth in the agreement and hereby acknowledges and agrees that either Parties shall not be liable for the same in any manner whatsoever to the Second Party.

19 **Indemnity:** Notwithstanding anything to the contrary contained in this Agreement and without prejudice to other rights that the Parties may have under this Agreement and in law, each Party (the "indemnifying Party") hereby irrevocably indemnifies, defends, saves and holds harmless and irrevocably agrees and undertakes to keep indemnifying, defending, saving and keeping harmless at all times the other Party ("indemnified Party"), and its respective directors and employees including offices and managers on demand, to the fullest extent permitted by applicable law from and against any and all losses, damages, penalties, costs, charges, reasonable expense, suits, or legal/quasi legal proceedings of whatever nature, including, without limitation, any legal or other fees and expenses in connection with investigating, disputing, preparing or defending any claim which may be suffered or incurred by the indemnified Party resulting from or arising out of a breach of any covenant or agreement made or failure to perform (whatever in whole or in part) any obligation required to be performed by the Indemnifying Party (or any person or representative designated by the Indemnifying Party) under this Agreement.

20. Dispute Resolution:

20.1 Any differences or disputes that arise between the Parties shall in the first instance be resolved mutually by the Parties.

20.2 This Agreement shall be governed by the Indian laws and subject to the jurisdiction of the Courts at Government of India.

20.3 Any notice required to be given under this Agreement shall be served on the party at their respective addresses given below by hand delivery, email or by registered post.

22.5 The physical infrastructure assigned in premises, furniture, systems, projectors, etc. so made available, under this MOU shall be solely owned by the College and Second Party shall have no right or claim in this respect thereof. The Branding material and other materials provided by and copyright of Second Party shall be solely owned by the Second Party and College shall have no right or claim in this respect thereof. This includes the use of the content/curriculum provided by the Second Party.

22.6 This Agreement does not give authority to any of the parties to either represent or exercise opinion or make decision, on behalf of the other.



MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING BETWEEN

COMMISSIONERATE OF COLLEGIATE EDUCATION -
TELANGANA (CCETS)

AND

INDIA MATTERS FOUNDATION

This Memorandum of understanding (herein after referred to as "MoU") is entered into by and between

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Hyderabad having its registered office at 3rd floor, Vidya Bhavan, opposite Latha Talkies, Nampally, Hyderabad-500001 and herein after unless the context otherwise requires be referred to as "CCETS"

As FIRST PARTY

And

India Matters Foundation, an apolitical, autonomous, registered Public Charitable Trust and non-profit organisation established under the Trust Act and yet to obtain the registration under section 12AA of Income tax Act (Under Process). It is represented by its Managing Trustee Mr. Vijay Kumar Nair having their office at E1, 80 Nungambakkam high road, Chennai-600034, Tamil Nadu and herein after unless the context otherwise requires be referred to as "IMF"

As SECOND PARTY

(Both Parties are hereinafter jointly referred to as "Parties" and individually as a "Party")

Introduction

- A. Whereas CCETS is a non-profit organisation created by the Government of Telangana to promote education, giving special attention to backward and rural areas. It aims to strengthen education at under graduation level especially for underprivileged sections of the society.
- B. India Matters Foundation is an autonomous public charitable trust and non-profit organisation working with an objective of youth development through its charitable activities.
- C. Whereas IMF in furtherance of its objective, engages in establishing "Global Education and Careers Forum" a leading professional consortium. The consortium comprises of Government agencies, NGOs, and Educators in India & abroad who share the common vision of empowering youth with globally demanded skills, knowledge and experiences to be successful in the 21st century's Global Market Place. The consortium works to facilitate exchange of views, knowledge and skills between educators from different countries.

D. Whereas Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, in the State of Telangana is desirous of engaging in career guidance, overseas education counselling services and employability skill enhancement initiatives, for the students pursuing under graduation in Government Degree Colleges in the state.

E. The parties share the common interest of engaging in career guidance, overseas education counselling services and employability skills building programs for the students pursuing under graduation in Government Degree Colleges in Telangana.

IMF and CCETS desire to enter into this Memorandum setting out the terms and conditions under which the purpose and scope of this MoU will be achieved.

Article 1 **Effective Date**

The parties hereby agree that the effective date of this MoU shall be the date on which it is signed. The Preamble to this agreement constitutes an integral part thereof.

Article 2 **Purpose and Scope**

Purpose: This MoU outlines mutual cooperation between the two parties in the space of career guidance, overseas education counselling services and employability skills enhancement initiatives and creation of platform for students to interact with global forums to showcase their skills and knowledge.

Roles and Scope of cooperation: The parties agree to, in the spirit of mutual cooperation, use the best efforts towards fulfilment of their respective obligations in achieving the purpose of this MoU.

2.1 Responsibilities of CCETS

- Will recommend and encourage all Government Degree Colleges working under its ambit to partner with "Global Education and Careers Forum".

- Will recommend and encourage all Government Degree Colleges under its purview to motivate their final year students to make use of the "Global Education and Careers Forum platform to enhance their global employability skills.
- Ensure that the necessary infrastructure like well-equipped class rooms and auditoriums are made available to facilitate selection and mentoring programs by Global Education and Careers Forum.
- Identify and nominate faculty who will work with international partners of the forum in organising various activities such as competitions.
- Extend support in inviting speakers from higher offices and media who share the vision of enhancing employability skills in students pursuing under graduation.
- Extend support in conduct of Global Education and Careers Forum activities in GDCs without affecting the normal academic work in the college.

2.2 Responsibilities of IMF

Through Global Education and Careers forum, IMF will

- Design, structure and organise student & faculty centric seminars, workshops and competitions that help enhance the skills and knowledge of students to meet the global bench-mark.
- Organise selections to identify suitable students who are interested in pursuing higher education in international universities.
- Introduce the selected students to the concepts of global work and study skills through international seminars and one-to-one mentoring.
- Mentor selected students by organising soft skills development work shops and in the area of cross-cultural communication skills as required.
- Organise Inter College and Interstate competitions which provide a platform to the students to showcase their abilities.
- Organise Faculty Development Programmes to the nominated faculty who will be overseeing the said project in their respective colleges.
- Organise webinars on topics related to "Employability Trends in specific subject areas" in association with international universities.
- Organise international summit titled "Global Education and Careers Summit, consisting of panel discussions, Familiarisation trips and other suitable engagements for heads of educational institutions to engage with international educators.

- Organise events for students to meet International educators which will help them explore higher education opportunities.
- Provide promotional materials where ever necessary.
- Issue appropriate certificates to the participants.

ARTICLE 3

Term

The MoU will be effective for a period of three years from the date of signing. The MoU may be extended on mutually agreed terms for a further period of one year or for such other period as mutually agreed by parties.

ARTICLE 4

Financial liabilities

The program is free of cost. India Matters Foundation and / or Global Education and Careers forum shall not charge any fees on whatsoever account/name either from the students or the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education-Telangana or its affiliated institutions for conducting the aforesaid program.

However, students who get selected to pursue higher education in foreign universities will have to pay the Tuition fee and Application fee as mentioned in their admission letter directly to the University concerned.

Article 5

Confidentiality

- 5.1 This document is confidential. Both the parties agree to maintain in confidence, and not reveal to any person or body, rights and obligations of the parties or any information or data which it receives through the other pursuant to this Agreement. The provision of Confidentiality shall survive the termination of this MoU and continue to bind the parties.
- 5.2 Both parties hereby declare that they know that this undertaking will be in force during the validity of this MoU, as well as at any time after this MoU is terminated.
- 5.3 Both parties declare that they know that the undertaking pursuant to this agreement is a pre- requisite for each party to enter into this MoU with the other, and that without this declaration each would not be willing to enter into an agreement with the other.

Article 6

Intellectual Property

- 6.1 Intellectual property means all systems, processes, procedures, propositions descriptions, models, copyrights, trademarks, trade secrets, and patents, utility models, methods and other intellectual property rights recognized in any jurisdiction worldwide, including all applications and registrations.
- 6.2 The materials provided by IMF and "Global Education and Careers Forum" are protected by copyright, including without limitation by copyright Law and other applicable laws in India.
- 6.3 CCETS & IMF will not reveal, make use of or commercialize any of the confidential information provided by IMF/CCETS either during the currency or after termination of the related Agreement for a period of five years.
- 6.4 IMF will retain the right of ownership to all the Intellectual Property Rights. CCETS shall not use intellectual property that is in any way based on the systems, processes, protocols, propositions and models of IMF, even though CCETS may have amended and added to the foundation Intellectual Property.
- 6.5 The data of the students should not be shared to anyone without the permission of CCETS other than for the project for which the students have registered.

ARTICLE 7

General Provisions

- 7.1 Both Parties agree to maintain at all times, a one-point contact for undertaking and overseeing the initiatives listed out in this MoU. Any change in the contacts will be promptly notified to the other party.

7.2 This MoU references good faith efforts by both CCETS and IMF and is an expression of the Parties current intent and recognizes the fact that the execution of some of the terms of the MoU could require the parties to enter into definitive agreements. It is understood that without such definitive agreements, the terms of the MoU are not legally binding and will not be relied upon by any party for any purpose and no party is or will be bound by the terms of this MoU, unless and until definitive agreements are signed.

7.3 Terms and Termination:

The terms and conditions agreed under this MoU shall commence on the date of signing and shall remain in effect until terminated.

This MoU may be terminated by either of the Parties by giving not less than 3 months' notice in writing to the other Party.

7.4 Amendments: Either party may request changes to this MoU. Memorandum of Understanding for Academic Cooperation

Government Degree College for Women(A), Begumpet, Hyderabad.

and

S.S.Lab Equipment.

Government Degree College for Women(A), Begumpet, Hyderabad and S.S.Lab Equipment recognize their strengths in research and education in one or more disciplines of science and their mutual interest in engaging themselves in academic cooperation. GDCW(A), Begumpet and S.S.Lab Equipment therefore agree to establish a programme for academic cooperation in the areas of mutual interest, and in accordance with terms and conditions set forth in this memorandum of understanding (MoU).

A. Objectives: The goal is to foster collaboration, provide opportunity for global experience, and to facilitate advancement of knowledge on the basis of reciprocity, best effort, mutual benefit, and frequent interactions. GDCW(A), Begumpet and S.S.Lab Equipment agree:

- a) to exchange information on research and educational programmes
 - b) to exchange information on teaching, learning material and other literature relevant to their educational and research programmes
 - c) to jointly organize short-term continuing education programmes on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein
 - d) to jointly organize seminars, conferences, or workshops on topics of mutual interest and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein
 - e) to jointly propose and engage in research or training programmes sponsored by funding agencies, and to invite each other's faculty to participate therein
- GDCW(A), Begumpet and S.S.Lab Equipment further agree that detailed terms and conditions that guide each activity identified above will be separately determined and agreed upon by the two institutions. These terms shall include a technical description of the proposed activity, financial arrangements, and person(s) responsible for its implementation, etc.

B. Exchange of Faculty, Scientists and Staff GDCW(A), Begumpet and S.S.Lab Equipment agree to encourage collaboration between faculty and scientists from the two institutions. Specifically, institutions will encourage members of their faculties to undertake short visits to, or take up fixed-term visiting assignments at, each other's

institution as per the existing norms. Terms and conditions for each visit or an assignment, including those concerning stipend, travel, and housing, name of the concerned faculty member will be worked out between GDCW(A), Begumpet and S.S.Lab Equipment . Notwithstanding the above, GDCW(A), Begumpet and S.S.Lab Equipment will examine ways to identify financial resources to fund international travel by their faculty/scientists/students.


C. Student Exchange GDCW(A), Begumpet and S>S.Lab Equipment agree that student exchange will be guided by principles listed below. A home institution refers to the institution where a student is a full-time student, and from where he/she is expected to graduate. A host institution refers to an institution that receives a student for a brief period of time to undertake a pre-determined programme of study or research.

- a) Exchange students will be selected by mutual agreement between the home institution and the host institution.
- b) An exchange student will continue to be treated as full-time student at his/her home institution.
- c) An exchange student will be considered as full-time "exchange" student at the host institution.
- d) His/her programme of study at the host institution will be determined by mutual consultation between his/her academic advisor at the home institution and his/her "interim" academic advisor identified by the host institution.
- e) The host institution will evaluate an exchange student's performance in each course or module, award a letter grade or marks, and issue a letter to that effect.
- f) The home institution may award to the exchange student credits earned at a host institution, but only after the home institution has established correspondence between courses taken at the host institution vis-a-vis those offered at the home institution.
- g) If an exchange student has undertaken research, then the host institution will evaluate the exchange student's performance in the research, and issue a letter to that effect, together with a technical "report" of the research carried out.
- h) If an exchange student has undertaken research, then the home institution will take note of the performance evaluation and the technical report, and take steps in accordance with its own procedures.

- i) GDCW(A), Begumpet and S>S.Lab Equipment agree to provide suitable accommodation and living expenses for student exchange.
 - j) To avail travel expenses, students can apply for existing funding programs at their respective home universities.
 - k) The exchange students will pay tuition and other fees at their home institution.
- D.** The terms and conditions for such participation will be worked out by mutual agreement between GDCW(A), Begumpet and S>S.Lab Equipment
- E.** Intellectual Property GDCW(A), Begumpet and S.S.Lab Equipment agree to respect each other's rights to intellectual property. Further, the intellectual property rights that arise as a result of any collaborative research or activity under this MoU will be worked out on a case-by-case basis, and will be consistent with the officially laid down IPR policies of the two institutions.

This MoU will take effect from the date it is signed by representatives of the two institutions. It will remain valid for two years, and may be continued thereafter after suitable review and agreement. Either institution may terminate the MoU by giving written notice to the other institution six months in advance. Once terminated, neither GDCW(A), Begumpet and S.S.Lab Equipment will be responsible for any losses, financial or otherwise, which the other institutions may suffer. 

As SECOND PARTY

(Both Parties are hereinafter jointly referred to as "Parties" and individually as a "Party")

Introduction:

A. Whereas CCETS is a non-profit department created by the Government of Telangana State to promote education, giving special attention to backward and rural areas. It aims to strengthen education at under graduation level especially for underprivileged sections of the society.

including but not limited to Curriculum Vitae (CV) building etc. for students/jobseekers.

D. Article 1 Effective Date

The parties hereby agree that the effective date of this MoU shall be the date on which it is signed. The preamble to this agreement constitutes an integral part thereof.

Article 2 Purpose and Scope

- Jobseekers shall have the option of skill enhancements, trainings in the emerging horizons, interview & employment success factors, Curriculum Vitae (CV) building and other facilities on chargeable basis. SPL shall provide these options subject to terms and conditions, with consent of the jobseekers.
- Provide assistance to understand the gaps in employability skills and areas of improvement, with industry specific inputs.
- Support CCETS in increasing awareness on www.tsdeet.com among students, colleges, jobseekers and universities.

Article 3 Term

The MoU shall be effective for a period of one year from the date of signing. The MoU may be extended on mutually agreed terms for a further period of one year or for such other period as mutually agreed by parties.



Article 4 Financial Liabilities

4.1 StoryTech Private Limited shall not charge any fee on whatsoever account/name either from the students or the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education or its affiliated institutions for job placements and internships.

4.2 Skill enhancement trainings and other corollary features will be charged by SPL subject to terms and conditions specified, with consent of the jobseekers, without any financial liability on CCETS or its affiliated institutions.

Article 5 Confidentiality

5.1 This document is confidential. Both the parties agree to maintain confidentiality and not reveal to any person or body, rights and obligations of the Parties or any information or data which it receives through the other pursuant to this agreement. The provision of confidentiality shall survive the termination of this MoU and continue to bind the parties.

5.2 Both parties hereby declare that they know that this undertaking will be in force during the validity of this MoU as well as at any time after this MoU is terminated.

5.3 Both parties declare that they know that the undertaking pursuant to this agreement is a pre-requisite for each party to enter into this MoU with the other, and that without this declaration; each would not be willing to enter into an agreement with the other.

Article 6 Intellectual Property

6.1 Intellectual Property means all systems, processes, procedures, proposition descriptions, models, copyrights, trademarks, trade secrets, and patents, utility models, methods and other intellectual property rights recognized in any jurisdiction worldwide, including all applications and registrations.

6.2 The Materials provided by SPL (DEET) are protected by copyright, including without limitation by Copyright Law and other applicable laws in India.



6.3 CCETS & SPL (DEET) will not reveal, make use of any of the confidential information provided by SPL (DEET)/ CCETS either during the currency or after termination of the related agreement for a period of 5 years.

6.4 SPL (DEET) will retain the right of ownership to all the Intellectual Property Rights. CCETS shall not use intellectual property that is in any way based on the systems, processes, protocols, propositions and models of SPL (DEET), even though CCETS may have amended and added to the foundation of Intellectual Property.

6.5 The data of the students should not be shared to anyone without the permission of CCETS other than for the project for which the students have registered.

Article 7 General Provisions





The Commissionerate of Collegiate Education has established Telangana Skills and Knowledge Centers in all Government Degree Colleges with an objective to meet Human Resource requirement for state’s growth plan while fulfilling the stake holder’s aspirations. The main objective of TSKC is to enhance Life skills, Computer skills, Analytical and Aptitude skills among students pursuing graduation.

With an objective to strengthen TSKC activities, TSKCMC, O/o CCETS has collaborated with TASK to enhance employability quotient of young graduates in Government Degree Colleges and enable them to choose multiple avenues as they graduate. Hence from the academic year 2019-2020, TSKC-TASK program shall be offered to interested students pursuing graduation in all Government Degree Colleges in the state. The key aspects of this program are as follows:

- All Government Degree Colleges in Telangana shall register with payment of a nominal fee of Rs.5000/- + GST per annum, to TASK.

- The colleges shall renew the registration every year by paying the fee amount of Rs.4000/- + GST.
- Interested students shall enroll in TSKC-TASK program through an online registration process by login into TASK website, from 1st July till 31st August, 2019.
- The student registration process will be completed after the payment of a nominal one-time registration fee of Rs.500/- + GST. This registration is valid for a period of 3 years i.e., until the student completes his/her graduation.
- On successful completion of the program, students shall be evaluated and certified by TASK. TASK has partnerships with various corporates for placements like Infosys, Cognizant, Safran, Cyient etc. After the training, with their registered identification Number, students have an opportunity to directly apply for various jobs as per their choice in partnered Organizations of TASK.

In connection with this, the Principals of Government Degree Colleges are instructed to

- Register their GDC with TASK by paying the requisite fee of Rs. 5000/- +GST immediately before 15th July 2019. The expenditure towards payment of college registration fee to TASK shall be borne by the colleges from any of the available accumulated funds of the college.
- Post college registration process confirmations, TASK shall conduct an Orientation workshop for students in Government Degree Colleges. After the orientation workshop, the students can start registering themselves through an online registration process by login into TASK website, which shall be open from 1st July till 31st August, 2019.
- The program shall start in July, 2019 and based on student enrolment status the actual start date of the program shall be

finalized by the College and the same shall be communicated to TSKCMC, O/o CCE.

- The student strength per batch shall be fixed in the range 30-50. Parallel batches may be run depending on the student enrolment strength. TASK shall depute their resource persons in requisite numbers for the training. There is no upper limit on the number of students who can enroll into TSKC-TASK Program.
- The Principal shall nominate one regular faculty to coordinate the TSKC-TASK activities.
- Here-in after the services of TSKC Mentors shall be utilized in training students on technical skills through TSKC-TASK program. In colleges where TSKC Mentors are not allotted, technical skills also shall be taught by TASK resource persons at no additional charges.
- The Principals are also instructed to provide the following facilities/infrastructure in the classrooms for TSKC-TASK trainings.
 - Computer lab with internet connectivity,
 - Projector and proper sound systems
 - Class rooms with flexible seating arrangements if possible.
- Afternoon sessions on all Saturdays shall be designated for TASK Sessions by TASK Resource persons.
- The Full Time Mentors shall take TSKC-TASK classes during week days daily.

A committee with the following composition has been constituted to shortlist different modules to be taught under TSKC-TASK program which shall best serve the needs of the students. The committee shall ensure that the selected modules shall have a minimum of 40 contact hours per semester. Modules on Basic IT Skills, Functional English, Interview Skills and Life skills & Communication skills are compulsory.

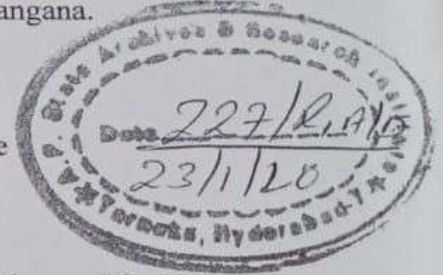





(hereinafter referred to as "CCETS" which expression shall mean and include its heirs, successors, executors, administrators, authorized representatives and permitted assigns) as FIRST PARTY.

Board of Apprenticeship Training (Southern Region), located at IV Cross Road, CIT Campus, Taramani, Chennai - 600 113, Autonomous Organization under Ministry of Education, Government of India, as SECOND PARTY.

C. Background and Purpose:

Whereas Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Government of Telangana, CCETS is a Department created by Government of Telangana to promote education, giving special attention to the areas located in backward and rural areas. It aims to strengthen education at undergraduate and post graduate especially for women and underprivileged sections of the society. - ii) The assessment and evaluation of Apprenticeship/Internship training would be carried out jointly by Board of Apprenticeship Training (SR), Chennai and commercial establishment which is imparting training
- iii) After successful completion of on the Job Training, Certificate of Assessment would be issued jointly by HEIs, Board of Apprenticeship Training (SR), Chennai and Concerned Industry/Commercial establishment which is imparting training.
- iv) The Degree Certificate would be awarded by the concerned affiliating University at the end of the course.
