The scheme of examination which has been changed from the academic year 2019-20,approved in the 7thAcademic council is being followed for 1st,2nd & 3rd Years, i.e. 60 marks for external examination and 40 marks for internals. Division of 40 marks is as follows.

- 1. 20 marks internal assessment in the form of descriptive exam, where two internals will be conducted and average of two is considered.
- 2. Unit wise test in the form of 20 objective questions, carrying half mark each and a total weightage of 10 marks.
- 3. 5 marks for seminar / quiz/ group discussion and 5 marks for assignments. The semester end examinations for the courses commencing from 2021-22 are evaluated for 60 marks. The question paper shall be set as approved in BOS meeting and the same is to be given to the controller of examinations.
