TOPIC: SUP (SINGLE USE PLASTIC) — A GLOBAL PROBLEM

DATE: 03-06-2022

SPEAKER: Dr. D.Prasanna, Asst. Prof of Zoology.

SYNOPSIS: Dr.D.Prasanna from the Department of Zoology discussed in detail about different types of plastics and eradication of single use plastic.

- Every year 500 billion plastic bottles are produced worldwide.
- In 2020 we will generate more than 500 million tonnes of plastic, 900% more than in 1980.
- <u>Plastic in the ocean</u> is already more than 150 million tons of waste.
- By 2050, they could contain more plastics than fish.
- Each year around eight million tons of plastic ends up in our seas and oceans.
- India had piloted a resolution on addressing single-use plastic products pollution at the 4th United Nations Environment Assembly in 2019. The Government has taken a defining step to curb the pollution caused by littered and unmanaged plastic waste by banning single-use plastic. It has initiated a ban on SUP (Single Use Plastic) from 1st July 2022, including units engaged in production, distribution, stocking, and sale of such items being closed. And the violation of the ban will invite punitive action, including a fine or a jail term or both, detailed under Section 15 of the Environment Protection Act (EPA). The Central Pollution Control Board (PCB) has also launched a grievance redressal application to empower citizens to help curb the use of plastic. India defined single-use plastic in an August 12, 2021 notification as "plastic item intended to be used once for the same purpose before being disposed of or recycled". In the same notification, the Union Ministry of Environment Forest and Climate Change had devised a phase-out plan for 21 select single-use items.
- The plastic items proposed for the ban are: Ear buds with plastic sticks and plastic sticks for balloons, thermocol for decoration, plastic flags, candy sticks, ice-cream sticks,

- plates, cups, glasses, forks, spoons, knives, straws, trays and stirrers made of plastic, wrapping or packaging films around sweet boxes, invitation cards and cigarette packets, Plastic or PVC banners less than 100 micron thickness, Plastic carry bags less than 75 micron thickness. Non-woven plastic with less than 60 GSM (Grams per square metre).
- Reducing the consumption of plastics requires change in habits, but also a change of mind set. Therefore as consumers, to turn this situation around, we have the power to make manufacturers change the way they produce, by changing the way we consume


TOPIC: Multiple intelligence and learning styles







Creation of Google form and its uses BY


