

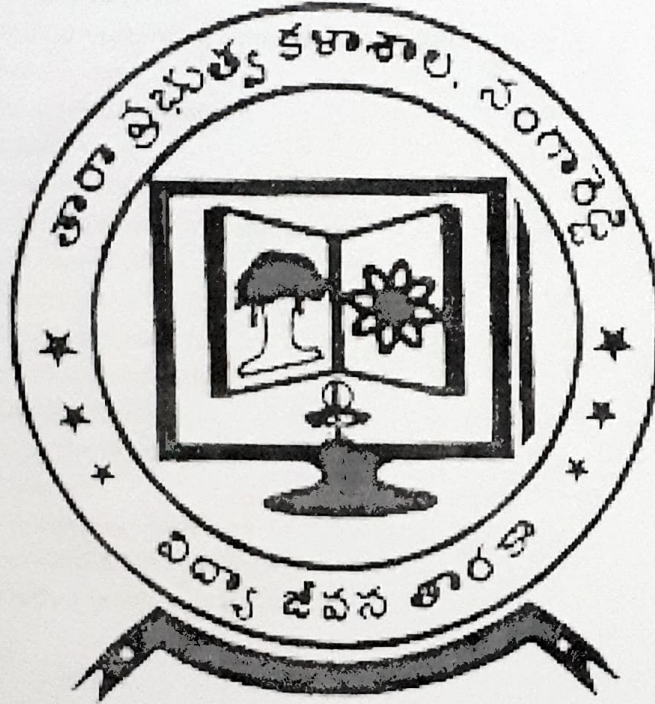

Tara Government College was conferred with Autonomous status from the academic year 2016-17. Semester system was introduced from the academic year 2016-17.

Examination System:

Examination system of the institution is defined in a way, which includes continuous assessment and end semester examination with a ratio of 30:70. Continuous internal assessment includes internal examinations, assignments and seminars. U.G. final year students have project works.

Continuous Internal Assessment:

To assess the learning outcomes of student's, continuous evaluation system is followed.

- 2 Internal assessment tests are conducted. Each test is conducted for 20 marks. Average of two tests is taken into consideration. The tests help to understand the student knowledge in a particular subject.
- Assignment helps to understand the subject understanding of the student. Weightage of the assignment is 5 marks.
- Seminar helps to assess student's presentation and expression skills. Weightage of the seminar is 5 marks.

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Minimum of 75% of attendance is required for a student to be eligible to appear for end semester examination. In case of medical grounds, a student is allowed if he or she puts 65% attendance provided the student has to produce relevant medical certificate. Those students who attend state/national camps/ workshops must produce the concerned attendance certificate attested by the principal to be only permitted to attend the semester examinations.

End Semester Examination:

Students who are writing end semester end examination are expected to be on time according to the schedule. Students are not allowed to enter the examination hall 30 minutes after the commencement of examination. End semester examinations are held for 70 marks and the duration of examination is two and half hour. Question paper setting for the end semester is by the external examiners approved in the BOS of concerned departments. Answer scripts are evaluated by external examiners.

Result and Backlogs:

An undergraduate student who clears all the papers within the stipulated 6 semesters will be awarded grade and CGPA. Year and month of passing of the exam is indicated in the consolidate memo. Students who fail to clear all the papers in the stipulated time are considered as supplementary candidates. Examinations for supplementary and backlog

students will be held only during even semesters. PG student has to clear all the papers with in 4 semesters. The student who doesn't pass the papers with in stipulated semesters is considered as supplementary candidate. Supplementary and backlog exams will be held during even semester examinations.

Declaration of Results:

The minimum mark for passing in a subject is 40% in the end semester examination for UG and PG. A student has to get 40% marks in concerned subject in external examination to pass in that subject irrespective of marks in continuous internal examination. Those who secure less than stipulated minimum marks are declared fail. Grading system is followed for result declaration. There is no provision for improvement examination.

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No student is automatically eligible for promotion to the next academic year. A student needs to pass a minimum of 50% subjects to be eligible for promotion to the next academic year.

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Moderation rules for Examinations:

1. If the pass percentage in a subject is < 30 then one moderation i.e. 5 marks for max marks > 75 , 4 marks for max marks > 50 and ≤ 75 , 3 marks for marks ≤ 50 are added.
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Marks from award list are entered and tabulation work is undertaken. After completion of the tabulation work results are declared. Memos are printed and verified before issuing to the students.

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
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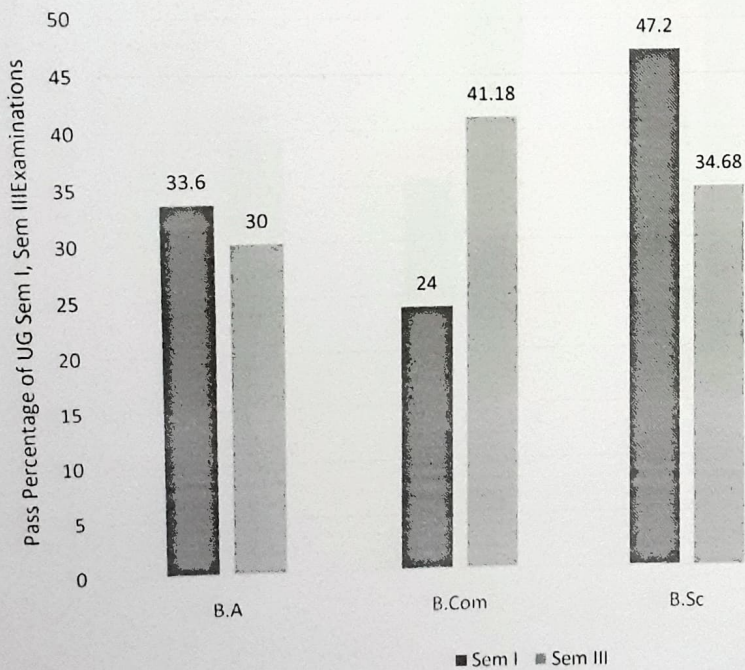

Examination System:

Examination system of the institution is defined in a way, which includes continuous assessment and end semester examination with a ratio of 30:70. Continuous internal assessment includes internal examinations, assignments and seminars. U.C. final year students have project works.

Continuous Internal Assessment:

To assess the learning outcomes of student's, continuous evaluation system is followed

- 2 Internal assessment tests are conducted. Each test is conducted for 20 marks. Average of two tests is taken into consideration. The tests help to understand the student knowledge in a particular subject.
- Assignment helps to understand the subject understanding of the student. Weightage of the assignment is 5 marks.
- Seminar helps to assess student's presentation and expression skills. Weightage of the seminar is 5 marks.

Semester Examination Eligibility:

Minimum of 75% of attendance is required for a student to be eligible to appear for end semester examination. In case of medical grounds, a student is allowed if he or she puts 65% attendance provided the student has to produce relevant medical certificate. Those students who attend state/national camps/ workshops must produce the concerned attendance certificate attested by the principal to be only permitted to attend the semester examinations.

End Semester Examination:

Students who are writing end semester end examination are expected to be on time according to the schedule. Students are not allowed to enter the examination hall 30 minutes after the commencement of examination. End semester examinations are held for 70 marks and the duration of examination is two and half hour. Result and Backlogs:

Examinations for supplementary and backlog students will be held only during even semesters. PG student has to clear all the papers with in 4 semesters. The student who doesn't pass the papers with in stipulated semesters is considered as supplementary candidate. Supplementary and backlog exams will be held during even semester examinations.

Declaration of Results:

The minimum mark for passing in a subject is 40% in the end semester examination for UG and PG. A student has to get 40% marks in concerned subject in external examination to pass in that subject irrespective of marks in continuous internal examination. Those who secure less than stipulated minimum marks are declared fail. Grading system is followed for result declaration. There is no provision for improvement examination.

Eligibility for Promotion:

No student is automatically eligible for promotion to the next academic year. A student needs to pass a minimum of 50% subjects to be eligible for promotion to the next academic year.

Representation regarding Semester Examination results:

Any student who has any grievance regarding the exam result, shall represent to the principal and go for revaluation by paying prescribed fee when the examination branch announces notification for revaluation.

Revaluation:

A student can apply for revaluation when the exam branch gives notification for revaluation. The following procedure will be followed for revaluation: If the difference is less than 10% of marks of the paper answered between the original and revalued marks, the former will be considered. If the difference is 10% or more marks between the original and revalued marks, the latter marks are considered for the result.

Supplementary Examinations:

Failed students can write supplementary examinations during even semesters. Supplementary examination should not be taken more than three times for a subject under the same syllabus. After that the student will have to repeat the examination under the revised syllabus. A UG student has to complete the course within five years of the admission.

Malpractice:

A student is guilty of malpractice if he or she is found attempting to copy or in possession of forbidden material. Such student will have all subsequent papers of the semester cancelled and further course of action will be taken by the examination branch.

Moderation rules for Examinations:

1. If the pass percentage in a subject is < 30 then one moderation i.e. 5 marks for max marks > 75, 4 marks for max marks > 50 and < = 75, 3 marks for marks < 50 are added.

2. If the number of students getting 55% of marks in a subject are <70%, then one moderation i.e. 5 marks for max mark > 75, 4 marks for max marks > 50 and <=75, 3 marks for max marks <= 50 are added.
3. If the both the above conditions are met then 2 moderations i.e. 10 are marks for max mark > 75, 8 marks for max marks >50 and <=75, 6 marks for max marks <= 50 are added.

The rule is in accordance with the Osmania University, Hyderabad to which the college is affiliated.

Rules for Grace marks in examinations:

Grace upto 2 marks: Any candidate of I year, II year and III year up to only V semester is failing by 1 mark or 2 marks in any one or two papers-Grace marks of only two can be added. If he or she is failing in more than two subjects, grace can be given to reduce Backlog papers.

0.5% rule applies only for final year final semester students. 0.5% of grand total of the marks of the course can be given as grace only if he or she is completing the course. For example, if grand total is 2000 marks, then 0.5% of 2000 = 10 marks. These 10 marks can be added to a student failing to complete the course but not to reduce the backlogs.

Process of Examination:

Exam notification shall be issued by the Controller of Examination as per College almanac.

Students shall collect the application forms from the examination branch and pay prescribed fee and submit at the examination branch along with a xerox copy of previous semesters marks memos of the qualifying exam

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As per time table examinations are conducted.

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Coding of answer scripts is done at the examination branch.

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Marks from award list are entered and tabulation work is undertaken. After completion of the tabulation work results are declared. Memos are printed and verified before issuing to the students.

Issue of Memos:


Consolidated memos and semester memos are issued to the students.

Approval of the Result:

Since the institution is in first autonomous cycle, the result of the students has to be approved by the affiliated University. All the required data submitted to the University and after a thorough scrutiny the university approves the result.

Issue of Provisional & Original Certificates:

The tabulation records are submitted to the affiliated university and after the verification the university issue provisional and original certificates accordingly by receiving the stipulated fee.

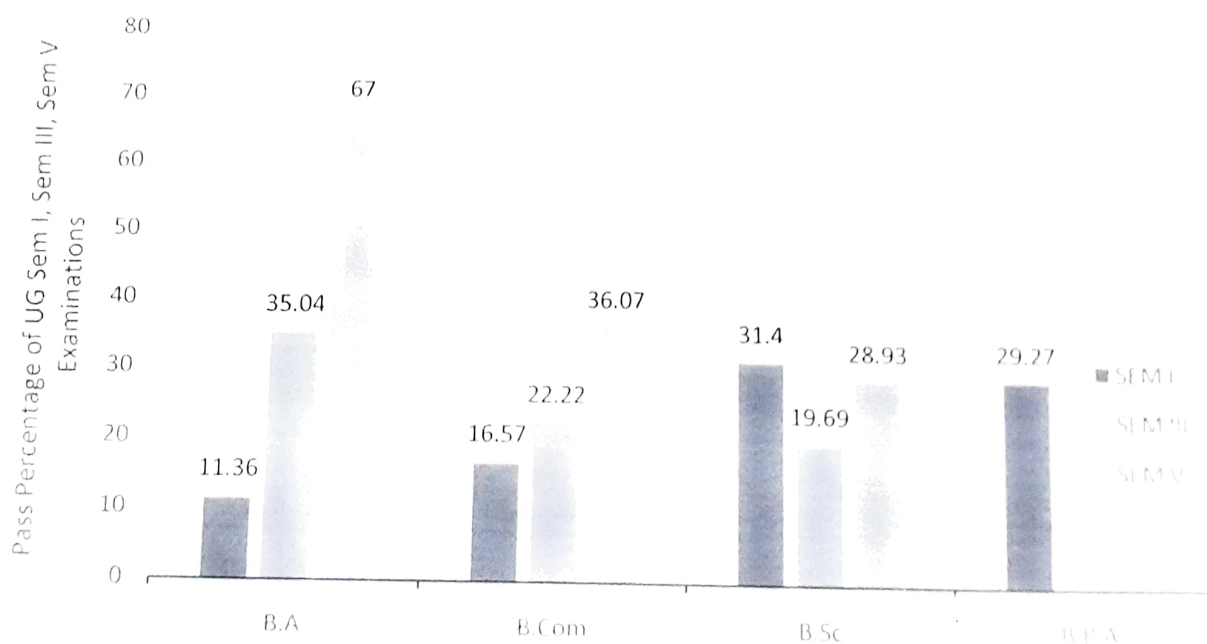

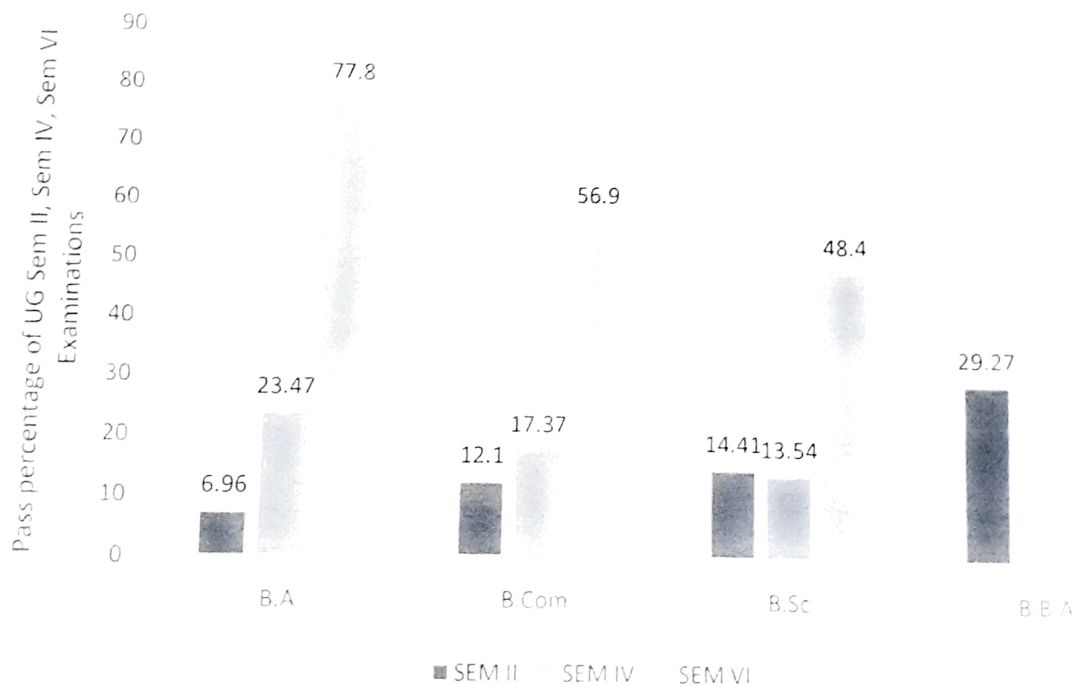

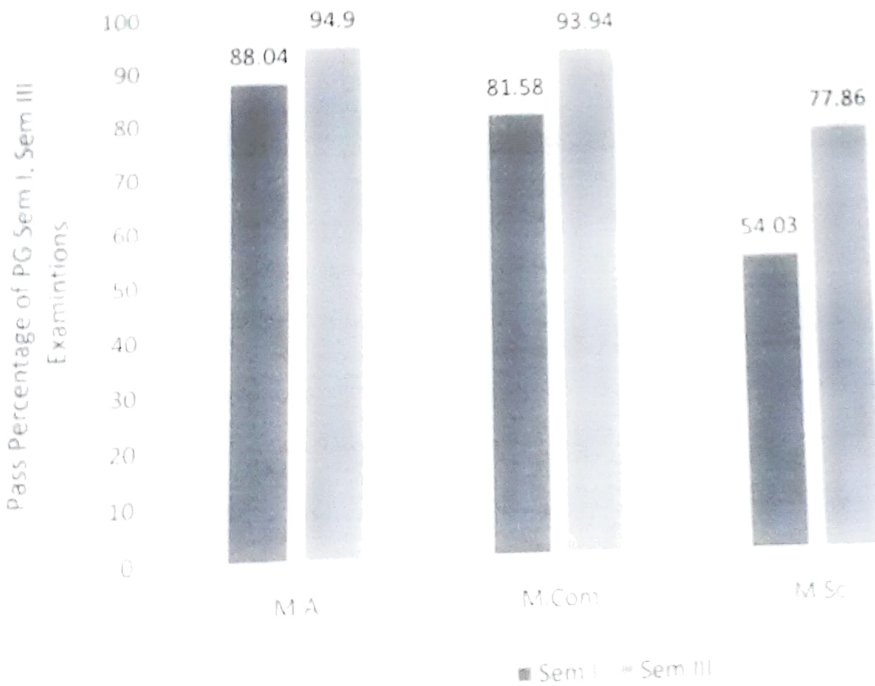

Pass Percentage of PG Semester I & Semester III Examinations

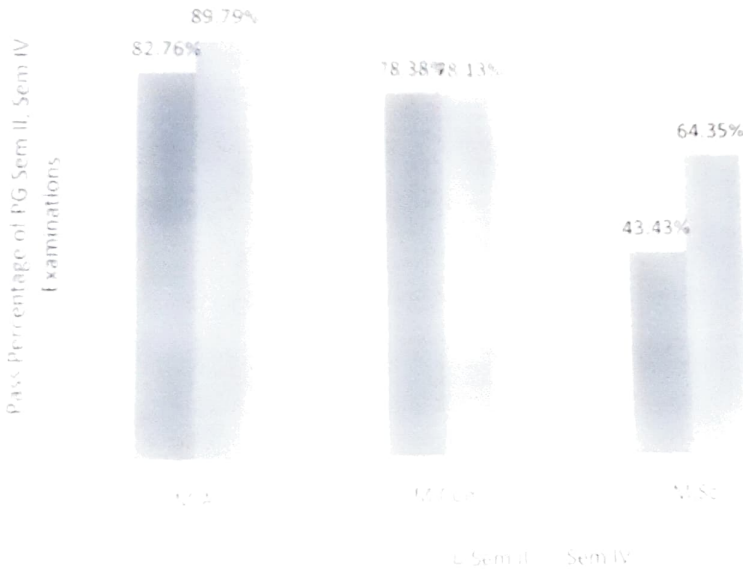

Remuneration for different services such as paper setting, evaluation of answer scripts, scrutiny etc will be given as per the rates of the affiliated University.

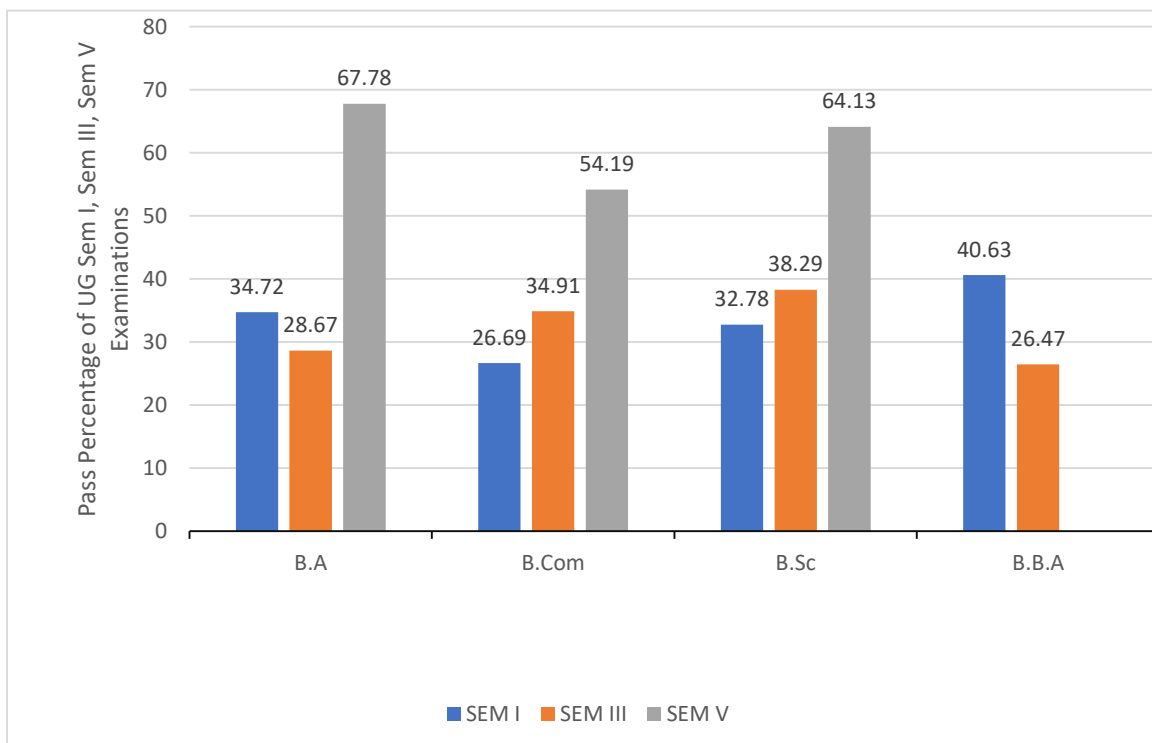

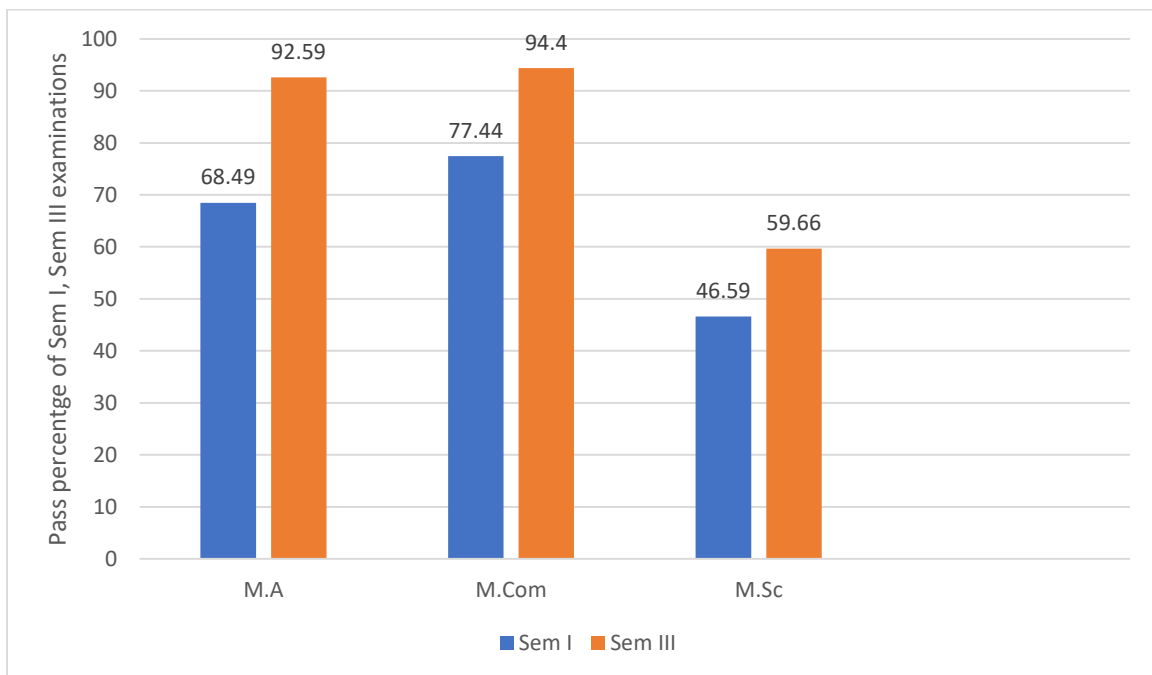

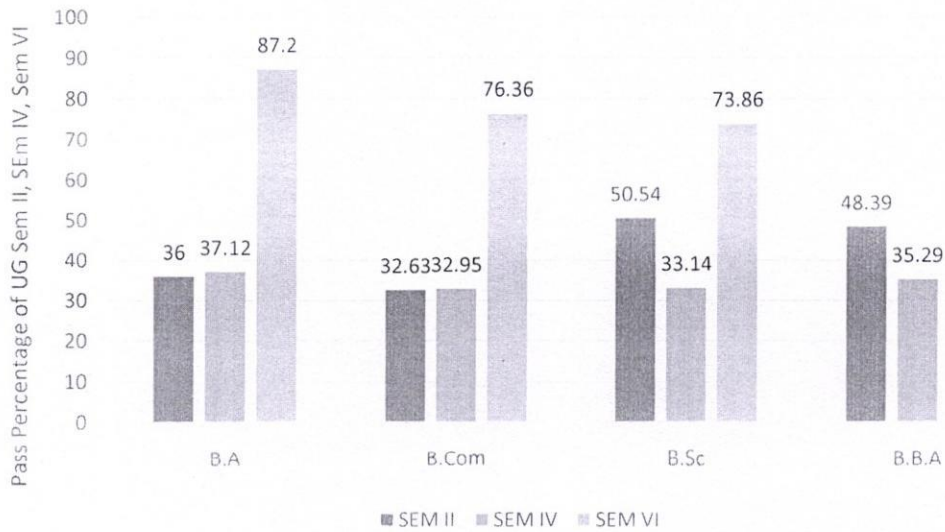
