





MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AMONG

COMMISSIONERATE OF COLLEGIATE EDUCATION - TELANGANA (CCETS)

AND

TELANGANA STATE COUNCIL OF HIGHER EDUCATION, TELANGANA

AND

INDIA MATTERS FOUNDATION

This Memorandum of understanding (hereinafter referred to as "MoU") is entered into by and among

COMMISSIONERATE OF COLLEGIATE EDUCATION, HYDERABAD, having its registered office at 3rd floor, Vidya Bhavan, opposite Latha Talkies, Nampally, Hyderabad-500001 and herein after unless the context otherwise requires, be referred to as "CCETS" as FIRST PARTY

AND

TELANGANA STATE COUNCIL FOR HIGHER EDUCATION (formed out of APSCHE Act 16 of 1988 as per the provisions of the AP Reorganization ACT 2014) with registered office at JNAFU Building, 1st Floor, Mahaveer Marg, opp. Mahaveer Hospital, Masab Tank, Hyderabad, Telangana 500028 and herein after unless the context otherwise requires, be referred to as "TSCHE" as SECOND PARTY

AND

India Matters Foundation, an apolitical, autonomous, registered Public Charitable Trust and non-profit organisation established under the Trust Act and yet to obtain the registration under section 12AA of Income tax Act (Under Process). It is represented by its Managing Trustee Mr. Vijay Kumar Nair having their office at E1, 80 Nungambakkam high road, Chennai-600034, Tamil Nadu and herein after unless the context otherwise requires be referred to as "IMF" as THIRD PARTY

(Three Parties are hereinafter jointly referred to as "Parties" and individually as a "Party")

Introduction

A. Whereas CCETS is a non-profit organisation created by the Government of Telangana to promote education, giving special attention to backward and rural areas. It aims to strengthen education at under graduation level especially for underprivileged sections of the society.

- B. Whereas, the Telangana State Council of Higher Education (TSCHE) is primarily a coordinating body between the University Grants Commission (UGC), the State Government and the Universities. The Council coordinates and determines the standards in institutions of Higher Education, Research, Scientific and Technical Institutions in accordance with the guidelines issued by the University Grants Commission from time to time. The Act 16 of 1988 envisages three distinct functions to TSCHE; (a) Planning and Coordination, (b) Academic Functions and (c) Advisory Functions.
- C. India Matters Foundation (IMF) is an autonomous public charitable trust and non-profit organization working with an objective of youth development through its charitable activities.
- D. Whereas IMF in furtherance of its objective, engages in establishing "Global Education and Careers Forum" a leading professional consortium. The consortium comprises of Government agencies, NGOs, and Educators in India & abroad who share the common vision of empowering youth with globally demanded skills, knowledge and experiences to be successful in the 21st century's Global Market Place. The consortium works to facilitate exchange of views, knowledge and skills between educators from different countries.
- E. Whereas Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, in the State of Telangana is desirous of engaging in career guidance, overseas education counselling services and employability skill enhancement initiatives, for the students pursuing under graduation in the state.
- F. Telangana State Council of Higher Education is interested is to stimulate and facilitate the development of collaborative and mutually beneficial programs which serve to enhance the intellectual life and cultural development in Telangana and to contribute to increased international cooperation in the field of Higher Education.

CCETS, TSCHE & IMF desire to enter into this Memorandum setting out the terms and conditions under which the purpose and scope of this MoU will be achieved.

Article 1

Effective Date

The parties hereby agree that the effective date of this MoU shall be the date on which it is signed. The Preamble to this agreement constitutes an integral part thereof.

Article 2

Purpose and Scope

Purpose: This MoU outlines mutual cooperation among the three parties in the space of Popularising the student academic verification services (SAVS) platform developed by the Telangana State Council of Higher Education, Capacity building in the higher education sector, overseas education support services, and the creation of a platform for students to interact with global forums to showcase their skills and knowledge.

Roles and Scope of cooperation: The parties agree to, in the spirit of mutual cooperation, use the best efforts towards fulfilment of their respective obligations in achieving the purpose of this MoU.

2.1 Responsibilities of CCETS

- Will recommend and encourage all Degree Colleges working under its ambit to partner with "Global Education and Careers Forum".
- Will recommend and encourage all Government Degree Colleges under its purview to motivate their final year students to make use of the "Global Education and Careers Forum platform to enhance their global employability skills.
- Ensure that the necessary infrastructure like well-equipped class rooms and auditoriums are made available to facilitate selection and mentoring programs by Global Education and Careers Forum.

- Identify and nominate faculty who will work with international partners of the forum, in organising various activities such as competitions.
- Extend support in inviting speakers from higher offices and media who share the vision of enhancing employability skills in students pursuing under graduation.
- Extend support in conduct of Global Education and Careers Forum activities in GDCs without affecting the normal academic work in the college.

2.2 Responsibilities of TSCHE

- Assist in popularising the student academic verification services (SAVS) platform among Global Universities.
- Engage in identifying, coordinating, and developing, faculty development sessions in association with Global University partners of GECF
- Encourage higher education institutions in the state to develop an echo system that assists study abroad aspirants on campus.
- Identify and assist to develop partnerships, seminars, and workshops that increase international cooperation in the field of Higher Education.

2.3 Responsibilities of IMF

Through Global Education and Careers forum, IMF will

- Design, structure and organise student & faculty centric seminars, workshops and competitions that help enhance the skills and knowledge of students to meet the global bench-mark.
- Organise selections to identify suitable students who are interested in pursuing higher education in international universities.
- Introduce the selected students to the concepts of global work and study skills through international seminars and one-to-one mentoring.

- Mentor selected students by organising soft skills development work shops and in the area of cross-cultural communication skills as required.
- Organise Inter College and Interstate competitions whichprovide a platform to the students to showcase their abilities.
- Organise Faculty Development Programmes to the nominated faculty who will be overseeing the said project in their respective colleges.
- Organise webinars on topics related to "Employability Trends in specific subject areas" in association with international universities.
- Organise international summit titled "Global Education and Careers Summit, consisting of panel discussions, Familiarisation trips and other suitable engagements for heads of educational institutions to engage with international educators.
- Organise events for students to meet International educators which will help them explore higher education opportunities.
- Provide promotional materials whereever necessary.
- Issue appropriate certificates to the participants.

ARTICLE 3

Term

The MoU will be effective for a period of three (3) years from the date of signing. The MoU may be extended on mutually agreed terms for a further period of one year or for such other period as mutually agreed by parties.

ARTICLE 4

Financial liabilities

The program is free of cost. India Matters Foundation and/ or Global Education and Careers forum shall not charge any fees on whatsoever account/name either from the students or the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education-Telangana or its affiliated institutions for conducting the aforesaid program.

However, students who get selected to pursue higher education in foreign universities will have to pay the Tuition fee and Application fee

as mentioned in their admission letter directly to the University concerned.

Article 5

Confidentiality

- 5.1 This document is confidential. Both the parties agree to maintain in confidence, and not reveal to any person or body, rights and obligations of the parties or any information or data which it receives through the other pursuant to this Agreement. The provision of Confidentiality shall survive the termination of this MoU and continue to bind the parties.
- 5.2 Three parties hereby declare that they know that this undertaking will be in force during the validity of this MoU, as well as at any time after this MoU is terminated.
- 5.3Three parties declare that they know that the undertaking pursuant to this agreement is a pre-requisite for each party to enter into this MoU with the other, and that without this declaration each would not be willing to enter into an agreement with the other.

Article 6

Intellectual Property

- 6.1 Intellectual property means all systems, processes, procedures, propositions descriptions, models, copyrights, trademarks, trade secrets, and patents, utility models, methods and other intellectual property rights recognized in any jurisdiction worldwide, including all applications and registrations.
- 6.2 The materials provided by IMF and "Global Education and Careers Forum" are protected by copyright, including without limitation by copyright Law and other applicable laws in India.

- 6.3 CCETS, TSCHE & IMF will not reveal, make use of or commercialize any of the confidential information provided by CCETS/TSCHE/IMF either during the currency or after termination of the related Agreement for a period of five years.
- 6.4 IMF will retain the right of ownership to all the Intellectual Property Rights. CCETS & TSCHE shall not use intellectual property that is in any way based on the systems, processes, protocols, propositions and models of IMF, even though CCETS & TSCHE may have amended and added to the foundation Intellectual Property.
- 6.5 The data of the students should not be shared to anyone without the permission of CCETS & TSCHE other than for the project for which the students have registered.

ARTICLE 7

General Provisions

7.1 Three Parties agree to maintain at all times, a one-point contact for undertaking and overseeing the initiatives listed out in this MoU. Any change in the contacts will be promptly notified to the other party.

7.3 Terms and Termination:

The terms and conditions agreed under this MoU shall commence on the date of signing and shall remain in effect until terminated.

This MoU may be terminated by any of the Parties by giving not less than 3 months' notice in writing to the other Party.

- 7.4 Amendments: Any of the party may request changes to this MoU. Any changes, modifications, revisions, or amendments to this MoU which are mutually agreed upon by and between the parties to this MoU shall be incorporated by written instrument, and effective when executed and signed by all parties to this MoU.
- 7.5 Applicable Law: The construction, Interpretation and enforcement of this MoU shall be governed by the laws of India. The courts of Hyderabad shall have jurisdiction over any action arising out of this MoU and over the parties, and the Venue shall be Hyderabad, India.
- 7.6 This MoU supersedes all prior oral or written communications, discussions and representations communicated among the parties hereto in respect of the subject matter of this MoU.
- 7.7 Any notice under this MoU will be in writing and delivered by hand or by registered post acknowledgement due, to the other party at the registered office or as may be substituted by the notice. Any notice sent by e-mail/ post will be effective on the date of receipt.
- 7.8 Severability: Should any portion of this MoU be judicially determined to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the MoU shall continue in full force and effect, and either party may renegotiate the terms affected by the Severance.
- 7.9 Third party Beneficiary Rights: The parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of a third party beneficiary, and this MoU shall not be construed so as to create such status. The rights,

duties and obligations contained in this MoU shall operate only among the parties to this MoU, and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this MoU. The provisions of this MoU are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing their obligations under this MoU. The parties to this MoU intend and expressly agree that only parties signatory to this MoU shall have any legal or equitable right to seek to enforce this MoU to seek any remedy arising out of a party's performance or failure to perform any term or condition of this MoU, or to bring an action for the breach of this MoU.
