NIZAMPUR VILLAGE

To know and to reach the society the Department has conducted ‘Mana ooru mana Charitra’ project in collaboration with Telugu academy by following CCE orders.

Students visited the village. They collected village history and other information from local elder people and political leaders of the village. They have taken information of temples, public institutes and other places of the village. Total collected data along with photographs documented. During the project students sensitize the villagers to understand and develop the historical social and political value of the village.

Historical view of the village:

In history once Telangana was ruled by Nizam kings .This village has got its name as Nizampur as it was under the rule of Nizam dynasty.This village has its own antiquity with 3 ancient temples. They are agraharam temple, Mallikarjuna temple and Gadimaisamma temple. In total there are 14 temples, two mosques and two churches. These are the religious and spiritual centers of the village. Villagers living standards are good but in olden days they are dependent on Mandal headquarter Sadasivpet for their lively hood. Majority people of this village are Hindus (70%), then Muslims (20%) and Christians also living and a great harmony existed in

between all these social and communal groups. There is a monument in this village. Once entering into the village we can find a old fort which is also locally called as burj. This is an ancient structure which was evidence for the great history of the village. Villagers are happily participated in local festivals like Durga maa jatra and Beerappa jathara.

Geographical features

Nizampur is a village panchayat located in Sangareddy District of Telangana state, India. The latitude 17.6793439 and longitude 78.003126 are the geo coordinate of the village. It is situated 8km away from sub-district headquarter Sadasivpet (tehsildar office) and 28km away from district headquarter Sangareddy. The total geographical area of village is 1666 hectares. Nizampur has a total population of 2,982 peoples, out of which male population is 1,489 while female population is 1,493. There are about 727 houses in Nizampur village. In this village, water resources are available in the form of lake, bore wells and canals. There are 308 bore wells in the village and three canals are there in and around the village. River Manjeera is flowing near to the village. So the villagers get drinking water from river canals and bore wells. In agriculture mainly cotton and paddy or the main crops. Nearly 1625 acres of agriculture land cultivated by villagers and wasteland area is approximately 39 acres. There is a forest with an area of 80 acres around the village and residential area occupied nearly 100 acres in the village. Villagers are living harmoniously in the village. Hindu population is more than 60% in the total village population. Muslim population is of 25% and nearly 10% of Christians also lives in the village. Hindus worships in the temples and Muslims in mosques and dargahs and Christians in churches. There are 14 temples in the village.

This village has given a great contribution during first and in second stages of Telangana movement. Villagers played memorable role in Telangana agitation movement. Most of the villagers participated in the final stage Telangana movement. Three people were arrested in Telangana movement. They are Vishnuvardhan Reddy, Karunakar and Satyanarayana. Karunakar was sarpanch and Satyanarayana was ward member at the time of Telangana movement. After formation of Telangana, villagers got fruits such as Mission bhagirata, Rythu Bandhu, Old age pensions, Swachh Bharat etc from Telangana government. Nearly 600 people were beneficiaries of old age pensions and 300 of widow pension and 100 of handicapped pensions. Nearly 300 villagers got Kalyana lakshmi and Shaadi mubarak schemes in the village.

After Telangana state formation greenery has increased in the village as part of plantation program. In this programme roadside tree plantation developed. In Telangana movement one member Subhash sacrificed his life and that time. Villagers participated in strike. They have supported Telangana movement whole heartedly. After Telangana formation there is an increase in the duties of the Sarpanch and online governance has increased very much. Some people got vehicle loans from banks and some people got machinery loan for agriculture.

This village economically developed village. It has 96 self help groups. SBI Bank branch located at Nizampur village and it is providing agriculture loans to farmers and other loans to the villagers. Generally cotton, paddy, sugarcane, vegetables, turmeric are the main crops in the village. Most of the villagers cultivate cotton and paddy crops. All kind of professions in handicrafts like Carpenters, potters, sculptures etc., are present in the village in earlier days. All artisans were existed in the village in olden days. Even now also we can see carpenters, goldsmiths, barbers and Purohit etc., in the village. Generally farming is depending on the canals and bore Wells. This village has four poultry farms and one dairy form. Generally sheep population is 3000, nearly 200 cows and thousand buffaloes are there in the village. Village has high school and primary school both of these has electricity facility. Street lights are well arranged in the village. Villagers have entertainment with the help of the street plays, Jathara dances and folk songs. Villagers have participated in beerappa jatara, Bonalu and Durga maa jatara have been divided into Saudi present in the village and here we can established between different. This village commercially not very well developed but we can observe some shops of fast food centres ,belt shops, hotels and shops are there in the village. Nearly from 20 years the business have been developed in the village generally the people the businessman will get loans from the bank. This village has State Bank of India branch. This Bank provides gold loans, crop loan, house loans, vehicle loans and group loans. Hotels are in most demanded business centers in this village. Villagers still the dependent on the Mandal headquarter Sadashivapet for their needs. In cultural view villagers generally they are interested to visit temples and churches and mosques every day. cultural programs will takes place and in this village there was a telugu poet but unfortunately now he is no more. His name was Anantharam .90% literacy rate is present in the village. Generally local festivals are beerappa jatar,a yellamma jathara durgamma jatara .this is about the cultural aspects of the village
