



The research forum of the college has been striving hard for the past four years to inculcate the staff and students with research skills. It felt this as a fulcrum of all activities. The goal is also to help them nurture their skills so that they could hone their skills to optimum level.

3. The Context:

Research is hub of all activities at Higher Educational institutions. Research not only helps a teacher to improve his/ her teaching capacities but also spreads it influence on every qualitative thing one does. By keeping this in context the research committee (forum) has been employing various activities and programmes in the college to increase qualitative and quantitative output of research among the teaching staff. - ❖ Application for central research lab was processed

5. Evidence of Success

- Two staff were allotted guideship
- Three staff were awarded Ph D's in the year 2017-18 alone
- Staff have been serving as resource persons at various national international seminars
- Number of participations at International, National and state level seminars, workshops increased phenomenally.
- Number of staff who presented papers at the seminars increased gradually
- Books written by staff, contribution to books in the capacity of Chief Editors, Editorial
 members, Contributors and contributors of chapters increased in the consecutive few
 years.
- There has been a great increase in the number of research papers in journals and books with ISSN and ISBN
- Number of staff who enrolled for their Ph D's (Doctoral Programmes) has been steadily increasing.
- Staff were given opportunity to apply and pursue their Ph D in FDP's mode
- Many staff have been qualifying UGC Net and TS SET exams for the past 3 consecutive years.

2. Goal:

To meet the growing infrastructure requirements

3. The Context:

There has been a steady increase of admissions for both UG and PG courses. For the past 4 academic years the strength of students who join the college has been in an increase mode. But the number of classrooms is not sufficient to meet the demand. To meet this RUSA funds were utilised to the tune of Rs 1.26 crores. Rs 60 lakhs were allotted to meet the purchase of equipment in the academic year 2018-19. The research needs induction of funds to take off.

4. The Practice:

- All the measures were taken to meet the fund requirement

CRITERION – WISE INPUTS

CRITERION I: CURRICULAR ASPECTS:

The college has been serving the society for the past 6 decades. It has become the first Autonomous College in the district. The college was served by excellent teachers like Chukka Ramaiah. The students like the first chief minister of Telangana State, Sri. K Chandrashekar Rao garu, added feathers to its cap.

That the college has been registering the highest number of admission in UG first year for the past three academic years in Osmania University region, speaks volumes of its success. The state first ranker in Intermediate HEC group in March 2015, K Venkataswamy, joined the institution in BA programme.

All the curricular aspects of the college have been designed with vision and mission. The college was granted autonomy and redesigned its syllabus from the academic year 2015. All the departments have BOS and entire administrative structure was remodelled to suit the needs of autonomy. The next academic year will be a watershed year in the history of the college as its first batch after autonomy will complete its cycle. The college has also seen that the meetings of Academic Council and Governing Body were convened and academic administrative and financial resolutions were ratified. The college opted for CBCS which gives a lot of scope for improvement. The students of college who excel in their academics are given incentives in the form of cash prizes to the tune of Rs. 60,000/-. The students who get admission into central universities are given Rs. 50,000/- a year as cash incentives by the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana. All the reforms in higher education are possible only if implemented whole heartedly at the institutional level. The college implemented all the said reforms at the behest of its stakeholders.

CRITERION II: TEACHING-LEARNING AND EVALUATION:

The college follows transparency in admissions. Admission into the college in UG programmes are strictly according to rules and regulation made by the higher authorities. The admission into PG courses is governed by the Osmania University and the list of allotted candidates is sent to the college. The student data are preserved. Admission process into degree programmes has become online from the academic year 2016-17.

The college ensures that all the students from disadvantaged sections of society get scholarships. Remedial coaching is imparted to the students who have backlogs. Eminent personalities who have expertise in various fields are invited to extend their services to the students.

ICT enabled teaching is encouraged to make the class room interaction more effective. Students got admitted into various Central Universities and other state Universities for the past five years. From this year on the CCE under the aegis of the state Government has been benevolent to the students who got admission into central Universities. These students get Rs.50,000/- per annum in their post Graduation. The college had six such brilliant, hard working and diligent students. All of them were incentivized with the said cash prizes.

The college has a huge demand for some courses. The college organizes orientation programmes for students in the first week of their admission. All the rules to be followed and the facilities available at the college are informed to them. The college was endowed with the services of doyens such as Chukka Ramaiah. 14 teachers have Ph.D's and more than 20 got through CSIR/UGC-

NET/SLET/SET.

The college has adopted external paper setting and evaluation. This ensures absolute transparency. The library has copious volumes of books. The students can use and benefit by using INFLIBINET N- LIST. The three batches of students have submitted their student Study Projects and two of them were awarded for the state first prize. Teaching is more students centred. Many teachers have enrolled themselves into Ph.D programmes.

The college has opted for CBCS. This has changed all the academic, administrative and financial set up of the college.

The students and staff of the college have presented MANA TV live sessions. The college was given opportunity to present "Best Practices in Government Degree Colleges" and the NCC and NSS units were given opportunity to present the service motto and extension activities on MANA TV.

CRITERION III: RESEARCH, CONSULTANCY AND EXTENSION:

Our college has research forum to monitor and help scholars. The college promotes research endeavour among staff and students. The college encourages the organizing of seminars, workshops and other research related activities. The staff have 14 Ph.Ds and more than 20 UGC/SLET/NET. All departments subscribed journals. The online resource such has INFLIBINET, N- LIST and plethora of e- books are available. Students of department of Telugu and Zoology have been awarded state first prizes in students Study Projects (Research). The number of participants in seminars, workshops increased phenomenally. The publication by the

faculty has a remarkable progress. Eight of the staff members have been sanctioned MRP's by the UGC worth Rs.20 lakhs approximately.

The department of commerce organized two National Seminars sponsored by UGC, the Department of Zoology organized one national seminar sponsored by UGC. The department of Telugu organized a national seminar sponsored by APSCHE and the department of Public administration organized a national workshop sponsored by TSCHE and ICSSR. Apart from this various departments of the college organized many state level, District level and college level research related activities.

Various departments reached MOU's with reputed and service oriented organizations.

CRITERION IV: INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES:

The college has potential to grow and serve the society. It has adequate number of class rooms and laboratories. The college grew with time. All the required infrastructure was provided.

The UGC women's hostel building was completed. A separate five roomed block was built by utilizing RUSA funds. The contribution of local philanthropist to construct a gate and an arch at the North East corner of the college has become a remarkable achievement for the college. The Commissionerate of Collegiate Education appreciated this effort. The local MLA and Minister for irrigation, marketing and Legislative affairs Sri T. Harish Rao garu donated an RO plant for the holy objective of providing potable water to students and staff.

To facilitate teaching and research all the departments were provided computers and printers. some of the departments prepared PPT'S for all topics in some subjects. The DIGI class room was sanctioned. The material such as three computers LCD projectors and three interactive white boards were sanctioned. The college already had two interactive white boards. The library is the second biggest in terms of its size and the number of titles /volumes it shelters. Salary details and other particulars of the staff are generated and maintained using computer technology. Integrated Library Management System- Library Automation Software SOUL (Software of University Libraries) 42900 Books Bibliographic information automated using through Online **Public** Access catalogue-OPAC/Webopac/Barcode Reader and Printer facility. INFLIBNET N-LIST Subscription Access to E-Resources, E-Books and e resources. Even students can access INFLIBINET.

The college offers three computer courses. Computer course is available as a self finance course. We have three computer labs and a TSKC lab. Basic computer literacy is guaranteed for all the students.

CRITERION V: STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

All the activities of the college are so designed that they work towards the all round development of the students. From this year class room mentoring system was initiated. All the skill development programmes and other activities. The college has a magazine named Lahari to cater to the needs of students' artistic talent. All the needy students get scholarship. Most of the students hail from socially and economically backward sections. They get reimbursement, services of health centre are provided to stake holders. Students are given coaching to serve the society. The alumni of the college are active. The first Chief Minister of the Telangana State, Sri.K.Chandrashekar Rao Garu is the alumnus of the college. The grievance redressal cell looks after genuine complaints and suggestion of the students. Not a single incident of ragging was reported. The college has an active women empowerment cell. To check the menace of sexual harassment the Internal Complaints Cell was established.

CRITERION VI: GOVERNANCE, LEADERSHIP AND MANAGEMENT:

The college has a well articulated vision and mission. The academic administrative and financial matters are guided by values. With the college embarking on autonomous status new administration has come into focus. Board of Studies were formed. They adopted new syllabiin their respective subjects. As per our Green Audit survey total number of vegetation present in the campus 650 Which includes moderate size to large trees.

We found the thick vegetation in the U.G and P.G Zoology Wings and less vegetation found right side and back side of the college building.

About 2.0 m³ water is consumed to filter 500 liters of drinking water required for approx. 2 days. The capacity of water purifier located in the college main building beside central staircase is about ltr/day. The water drained out from the purifier unit is used for the plants.

D. Water Harvesting:

In the college campus rain water and roof top water is diverted in to four water percolating / harvesting pits. Still there is a need for more harvesting pits. Some of the water is going out through drainage. Fish pond about 30'X20' sized is being maintained by Dept. of Zoology.

3) Electricity Consumption:

Electricity Consumption per Year was 1301 KWH. Avg. Electrical Consumption per Month was 108.4 KWH. Avg. Electrical Consumption per Day was 4.33 KWH

4) Waste management:

A) Domestic waste:

The waste (Dry & wet) generated in the campus is collected in the waste bins through trolleys and dumped into compost pits located in the campus. This waste is covered with soil layer and made into the compost by anaerobic way. This compost is being used for potted plants of the college. The polythene waste is also collected separately and given to municipality vehicles. This waste management process is collectively done by the supporting staff, NSS volunteers and nature club members under supervision of faculty. Still there is a need for proper waste management.

B) Vermi compost:

So far there is no Vermi compost pit in the institute is planning to start vermi culture composting pits in this year on 10 Sq. meter land by the department of Zoology with the help of NSS and natures club. The main benefits of the process are to reduce the waste in the environment and also it is cost savings process and also useful in the Eco management.

C) Wooden Waste Management:

The wooden waste is dumped in the cellar rooms

D) E- Waste Management:

The total Number of Computers in the Institute is 150 no.s. Printers -40 no.s, Xerox Machines are 6 nos.

- 1. The E-waste and defective item from computer lab is being stored properly.
- 2. The institution has decided to contact approved E- waste management and Disposal facility in order to dispose E-waste in scientific manner

5) AWARENESS PROGRAMMES:

Awareness programmes are being conducted by Life science, nature club, NSS P.Os to the students and general public

College is actively engaged in Haritha haram and Swachh Bharath Which is helpful in clean and green campus

Nature club people are sensitizing the students in Biodiversity conservation like arranging nests and water for the birds in the summer.

6) AUDIT REMARKS:

- As the campus spread in the vast area of 13 acres there is a need for more plantation backside of the college building and there is a scope for more vegetation in and around the college. The department of Botany is maintaining botanical garden but there also chance for herbal garden in the campus.
- ➤ The wooden waste can be used for the making of new furniture
- We suggest for roof garden even.
- In water management there is a need to conserve the water by reducing and reusing the water and also need of more water harvesting pits. The drainage and seepage water must be diverted into pond like structure by constructing the small check dams.
- Energy can be conserved by substituting existing energy sources with natural ventilation and light. As far as possible need to utilize alternative energy source like solar lighting. In the places like library we can reduce power consumption by replacing the normal bulbs with LED bulbs.

Conclusion

Green Audit is the most efficient & ecological way to solve such an environmental problem. The experiments on the nature by avoiding natural rules, this can be a one major reason behind Green audit process. Green Audit is one kind of professional care which is the responsibility of each individual who are the part of economic, financial, social, environmental factor. It is necessary to conduct a green audit in college campus because student aware of the green audit and its advantages to save the planet & they become good citizen of our country. Thus Green audit Become necessary at the college level. There is a scope for in depth study about the college campus vegetation and biodiversity
