## **Bathukamma Celebrations**

The Women Empowerment Cell organized Bathukamma celebrations on 8th October 2021 in the college. A total of 25 students and 13 students participated in the festivities.

Bathukamma is a festival of flowers. It is a vibrant festival of Telangana. It is celebrated for 9 days during the monsoon season

At the beginning of the festival, women visit their parents' homes. They clean the house. Menfolk go out into the fields. They collect a variety of flowers such as marigold, chrysanthemum, jasmine, etc. Women arrange these colorful flowers on a brass plate. This floral arrangement is called Bathukamma.

The grand finale of the festival is called Saddula Bathukamma. It takes place 2 days before the Dasara festival. In the evening, women wear colorful dresses. They join hands and form a circle. They sing and dance around the Bathukamma. This group dance symbolizes unity, love and sisterhood. At sunset, women carry the Bathukamma on their heads. They walk together towards the nearest lake or river. They immerse the Bathukamma in water. Then they distribute sweets among family and neighbours.

Bathukamma festival is a celebration of nature. It is a symbol of Telangana's cultural identity. Keeping up the spirit of the festival, the lady staff members and girl students of the college participated in the dance. The male staff and boys also showed their enthusiasm by their active participation. The principal of the college, Dr. Ch. Rama Raju and faculty members Smt. S. Sarada Devi, Assistant professor of Commerce, Smt. K. Swarnalatha, Assistant professor of Library Science, and other non-teaching staff and students took part to make the event a grand success.

# Savithribhai Phule Jayanthi 3/1/2022

The Women Empowerment Cell of MKR Government Degree College Devarakonda organized the birthday celebrations of the eminent 19th social reformer, Savitribai Phule on 3 January 2022.

Ms. S. Sarada Devi, Assistant Professor of Commerce inaugurated the event and said that Savitribai Phule was a pioneer of women's education in the country. Revered as the country's first woman teacher, she was the wife of Jyoti Rao Phule.

The In-chargePrincipal, J. Vishwanadh Kumar, spoke on the occasion and said that Savitribai Phule was the first female teacher of India, a social reformer who is known to work for women and lower caste. She raised her voice against the oppressive social system prevalent in the society of Pune (Maharashtra) in the 19th Century. Her contribution revolved around rationality and human reasons such as truth, equality and humanity.

The other staff members spoke and said that Jyoti Rao Phule and Savitribai Phule considered education to be a tool to bring changes in the conditions of socially oppressed classes. The idea behind promoting education was to eliminate the idea prevalent at that time that lower-caste people and women were not competent enough to take it. A few students spoke and said that the duo (Jyoti Rao Phule and Savitribai Phule) is revered as the first social reformers who recognized the importance of education to fight the social menace of inequality. Savitribai Phule gave importance to the education of women to promote social transformation.

# Medical Camp

The Women Empowerment Cell in association with NSS, Bhagya, Department of Physical Education and NVT Sports Authority Devarakonda organized a Medical Camp on 24 February 2022 to check Hemoglobin levels and general health of girl students. Eminent Gynecologist, Dr. Shanti Swaroopa was the chief guest and doctor who checked the health of students. A total of 150 students and 13 faculty members attended the camp.

Smt. S. Sarada Devi, Assistant Professor of Commerce, spoke on the occasion and said that she was proud to organize such an important event as health is wealth. She emphasized the need for regular checkup and special care to be taken by women about their health. Dr. Shanti Swaroopa spoke about hemoglobin and said that it is a protein in the red blood cells that carries oxygen to the body's organs and tissues and transports carbon dioxide from the organs and tissues back to your lungs. If a hemoglobin test reveals that the hemoglobin level is lower than normal, it means that one has a low red blood cell count (anemia).

The nurses conducted hemoglobin and other blood tests on the students. They gave medicines to students who are found to be anemic. They also checked the general health of the students and gave medicines accordingly.

At the closing ceremony, the principal, Dr. Ch. Rama Raju, spoke and lauded the WEC, NSS and Bhagya for organizing such a great event. He stressed the need for students to take care of their health.

The camp concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by Ms. S. Sarada Devi, Assistant professor of Commerce.







# **Donation Received- 3 Sewing Machines**



# <u>Jyothiba Phule Jayanthi</u>

#### <u>11/4/2022</u>

The Women Empowerment Cell in association NSS Units I & II organized Jyothiba Phule Jayanthi on 11/04/2022. A total of 40 students and 5 faculty members attended the event.

Sk. Arifa, Lecturer in Mathematics gave a welcome speech and said that Jyotirao 'Jyotiba' Govindrao Phule was a prominent social reformer and thinker of the nineteenth century India. He led the movement against the prevailing caste-restrictions in India. He revolted against the domination of upper castes and struggled for the rights of peasants and other low-caste people.

The principal, Dr. Ch. Rama Raju spoke on the occasion and said that Mahatma Jyotiba Phule was a pioneer for women education in India and fought for the education of girls throughout his life. He is believed to be the first Hindu to start an orphanage for the unfortunate children. NSS Officer Mr. V. Makatlal spoke and said that Savitribai was taught to read and write by her husband Jyotirao. In 1851, Jyotiba established a girls' school and asked his wife to teach the girls in the school. Later, he opened two more schools for the girls and an indigenous school for the lower castes, especially for the Mahars and Mangs.

Jyotiba realized the pathetic conditions of widows and established an ashram for young widows and eventually became advocate of the idea of Widow Remarriage. In 1873, Jyotiba Phule formed the Satya Shodhak Samaj (Society of Seekers of Truth). He undertook a systematic deconstruction of existing beliefs and history, only to reconstruct an equality promoting version.

In the event, the photo of Jyotiba Phule was garlanded. The event ended with a vote of thanks proposed by Sk. Arifa, Lecturer in Mathematics.

# Gender Sensitization through Literature 16/4/2022

The Women Empowerment Cell in association with the department of Telugu organized an Extension Lecture on 'Gender Sensitization Through Literature' (Topic: Telugu Sahityam Linga Bedhalu) on 16/04/2022. The resource person was Dr. Subhashini, Assistant Professor of Telugu. A total of 150 students and 6 faculty members participated in the event.

Smt. K. Renuka, Lecturer in History, gave a welcome speech and said that literature is a powerful means to enhance gender sensitization. She introduced the guest speaker and said that it was very fortunate to have such an eminent speaker as a guest. She handed over the proceedings to the speaker.

Dr. Subhashini said that feminism is a campaign for the rights of women, including social, political, and economic equality with men. The goal is equal social, economic and employment opportunities for women. Literature is a means for the propagation of ideas in the society. Feminists have used this effectively. Some feminist writers are expressing their views in an entirely new perspective. The feminist writers include not only female writers, but also male writers, e.g., Chalam, Kodavatiganti Kutumba Rao etc., are such progressive male writers who strived for the emancipation of women.

Women writers are portraying women's world and women's problems through their own eyes. They are choosing the issues that only women can discuss and are expressing their views without any inhibitions. In a girl's life, marriage should be a sweet feeling. However, she realizes that her dreams are all untrue in this patriarchal society. Society forces her to think of marriage as a life in a cage of knives or self-immolation in a bonfire.

Mr. G. Kotaiah, Lecturer in Telugu spoke and said that the feminist Telugu literature has dealt with the typical problems of middle-class society. However, in India still 80% of the population is agrarian. The problems of women in the villages are entirely different from the city dwelling middle class women. Feminists have to focus on the problems of majority of women who live in villages.

The college principal, Dr. Ch. Rama Raju, said that women in villages are not caged in the kitchen or ogled at in bus stops or manhandled in trains and buses. Women in villages face problems like illiteracy, ignorance, poverty, superstitions, alcoholism, divorce, cruelty of husbands etc. Women are exploited in a different way in the villages. Feminists have to devise special programs to elevate the lives of women in the villages. The emancipation of women is tied to the emancipation of all through education.

The meeting concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by N. Bala, Assistant Professor of Commerce.





ASB is a committee under Institute of Chartered Accountants of India (ICAI) which consists of representatives from government department, academicians, other professional bodies viz. ICAI, representatives from ASSOCHAM, CII, FICCI, etc. ICAI is an independent body formed under an act of parliament.

The resource persons mentioned that the Ind AS are named and numbered in the same way as the International Financial Reporting Standards (IFRS). This shall be applied to the companies of financial year 2015-16 voluntarily and from 2016-17 on a mandatory basis.

The event was attended by 30 students and 3 faculty members of the college. Ms. S. Sarada Devi coordinated this online event. She spoke at the end of the event and said that such

programs benefit the students as they become aware of the latest accounting practices and procedures. They gain practical knowledge. The principal, Dr. Ch. ## II. <u>A BRIEF REPORT</u>

On the occasion of World Consumer Rights Day, an event was organized by the department of Commerce in association with Consumer Club of MKR GDC Devarakonda on 15/03/2022.

The faculty of the department, Ms. S. Sarada Devi, Assistant professor of Commerce, and Mr. N. Bala, Assistant professor of Commerce, welcomed the audience. Both gave speeches highlighting the importance of consumer rights.

Ms. Sarada Devi said that the consumer movement marks 15th March with World Consumer Rights Day every year, as a means of raising global awareness about consumer rights and needs. Celebrating the day is a chance to demand that the rights of all consumers are respected and protected, and to protest against market abuses and social injustices which undermine those rights.

N.Bala, said that World Consumer Rights Day was inspired by President John F Kennedy, who sent a message to the US Congress on 15th March 1962, in which he formally addressed the issue of consumer rights. He was the first world leader to do so. The consumer movement first marked that date in 1983 and now uses the day every year to mobilize action on important issues and campaigns.

The principal, Dr Ch.RamaRaju, spoke on the occasion informing the students about their rights as consumers.

A total of 60 students and 8 faculty members participated in the event. A Q &A session was arranged where the students got their queries clarified from the resource persons. The event was concluded with a vote of thanks proposed by the Students of Department of Commerce.

#### II. <u>A BRIEF REPORT</u>

An extension lecture was organized by the department of Commerce for B. Com. II year students. The resource person was Mr. M. Satyanarayana, Lecturer in Commerce, Kranthi Degree College, Konda Mallepally. The topic was probability.

Mr.N.Bala, Assistant professor of Commerce gave a speech introducing the guest and welcoming everybody. He then handed over the proceedings to Mr. M. Satyanarayana.

The guest speaker gave an elaborate lecture on the topic. He said that probability is the branch of mathematics/statistics concerning numerical descriptions of how likely an event is to occur, or how likely it is that a proposition is true. The probability of an event is a number between 0 and 1, where, roughly speaking, 0 indicates impossibility of the event and 1 indicates certainty. The higher the probability of an event, the more likely it is that the event will occur. A simple example is the tossing of a fair (unbiased) coin. Since the coin is fair, the two outcomes ("heads" and "tails") are both equally probable; the probability of "heads" equals the probability of "tails"; and since no other outcomes are possible, the probability of either "heads" or "tails" is 1/2 (which could also be written as 0.5 or 50%).

He spoke about the importance of probability topic to Commerce students. He solved many problems from the textbook. In the Q & A session, the resource person answered all the queries posed by the students. The event concluded with the felicitation of the guest and a vote of thanks proposed by N. Bala, Assistant professor of Commerce.

He informed the staff that a mutual fund is an investment vehicle where many investors pool their money to earn returns on their capital over a period. This corpus of funds is managed by an investment professional known as a fund manager or portfolio manager. It is his/her job to invest the corpus in different securities such as bonds, stocks, gold and other assets and seek to provide potential returns. The gains (or losses) on the investment are shared collectively by the investors in proportion to their contribution to the fund.

He explained the various benefits of investing in mutual funds. He elaborated on the mutual fund options offered by HDFC Bank. He gave tips on the selection of best mutual funds available in the market.

In the Q & A session, the staff got their queries about investment instruments and mutual funds clarified by the resource person. The principal, Dr. RamaRaju spoke and said that he learned a lot in the program. He appreciated the speaker and the department of Commerce for organizing the event.
