BEST PRACTICES

Best Practice-I

1. Title of the Practice

Massive plant covering of the college.

2. Objective

- To convert deserted land of the college into a green land by planting trees.

3. The Context

- The college earlier used to run in Government junior college, Sadasivpet. College building was constructed and is shifted into the present building few years back. The college is away from the city and is a deserted land without trees.
- Due to lack of trees, it is very hot in the college campus particularly during summer seasons. So in view of this situation plantation of plants in the college premises is taken in a large scale.
- To bring environmental consciousness among the students.

4. The Practice

In the month of July and August plantation of plants is done before and after the college hours. Academic activities are not disturbed during these programmes. The plantation is done by students, staff and the Principal of the college. Students particularly who are enrolled in NSS and NCC are assigned the work of watering the plants before the college hours. Students water the plants regularly.

5. Evidence of success

Greenery of the college campus improved. The students and the staff feel very much happy to see the improvement in the greenery of the college. The hotness in the college started decreasing in the college during summer season. NSS programme officers of the Osmania University appreciated the deed.

6. Problems encountered and resources required

Initially students were reluctant to participate in this programme, but after convincing students started participate actively. By seeing the increase in the greenery many students voluntarily came forward to protect the planted plants.

Best Practice- 2

1. Title of the Practice

Watching MANA TV lessons by the students regularly.

2. Objective

- To improve the understanding of subject lessons and to improve the student result.

3. The Context

Most of the students joining in the college are compartmental students. These students need more attention to pass in the annual university examinations. These students if shown the lessons in the form of video lessons have more chances to pass in the annual examinations. The pass percentage of the students can be increased by the programme.

4. The Practice

Academic syllabus and lessons are explained and taught by the college faculty regularly in the college. These lessons are explained by eminent faculty as video lessons and are telecasted over MANA TV every day. The college has a lecture hall with a TV having a connection with MANA TV. Every day the students of a particular subject in which the lesson is telecasted are asked to assemble in the lecture hall with TV and the telecasted lesson is viewed by the students. A faculty of the college known as MANA TV coordinator take cares of this programme. A record is maintained for take the signatures of the students and the lesson telecasted with date.

5. Evidence of success

- More students started watching MANA TV lessons.
- Improvement in the learning process of the students is seen.
