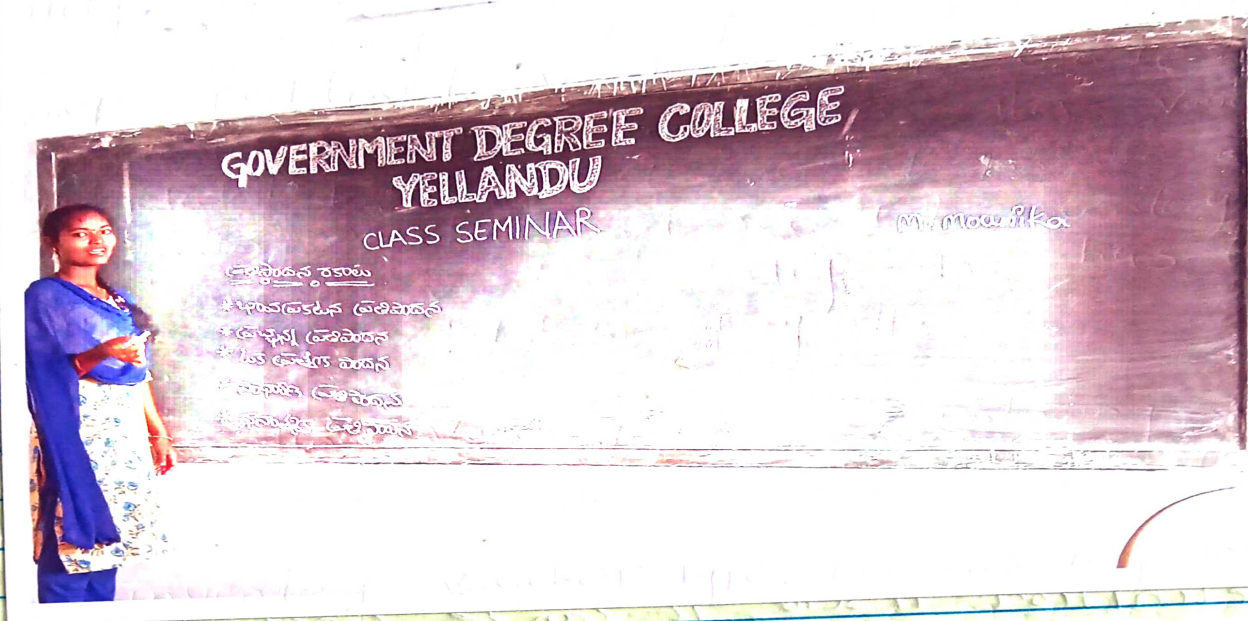

offer: An offer is the first step in the formation of a contract, it marks the beginning of contractual obligation between the parties. As is a known fact that Acceptance can only be made to a prior offer, an offer is essential for the formation of a contract.

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An offer is defined under Section 2(a)

of the Indian Contract Act -

when one person signifies to another his willingness to do or to abstain from doing anything with a view to obtaining the assent of that other to such act or abstinence, he is said to make a proposal.

The words proposal and offer can be used interchangeably for brevity. The person who makes the promise is called the "promisor" and the person to whom the offer is made is called the "promisee". From the definition itself, it can be construed that an offer can be both positive as well as negative, i.e. the doing of an act as well as the "not doing" of an act.





We the Commerce department visited "Usha Tiles" Factory, vemulavada Yellandu on 04/11/2021 as a part of Educational field visit.

Bricks play a primary role in construction at all levels, beginning from thatched roofs to multi-storeyed buildings. Over many years the process of brick making has not changed except for minor refinements. Bricks are the oldest construction material which has been broadly used at present due to its durability, availability and low cost. Refined brick making and burning techniques have exceptionally improved the quality of buildings.

The process of manufacturing of bricks from clay involves preparation of clay, molding and then drying and burning of bricks. The bricks are building materials which are generally available as rectangular blocks. The bricks do not require any dressing and brick laying is very simple.

### Manufacturing process of Bricks

Supervisor of the factory explained the students that there are four different operations in manufacturing of process of bricks.

- preparation of clay
- Molding
- Drying
- Burning.

He has explained the students to which places these bricks are transported and the financial position of their factory, their profit turn over ratio.


