Nouns

uncountable nouns don't take plural forms. They are: news, information, furniture, scenery, poetry, advice, knowledge, politics, alphabet, imagery, luggage, diesel, petrol, wheat, sugar, rice, water, milk, tea, coffee, weather, climate, atmosphere etc.

9. Complement vs. Compliment

The word good is an adjective, whereas the word well is an adverb.

- How are you today? I am doing well.
- I feel good today.

Loose is an adjective, and lose is a verb.

- This shirt is too loose on me.
- How did you lose your phone?!

Stationary means "not moving," whereas stationery refers to paper and writing materials.

- Of course the door will remain stationary if you don't push it the right way!
- I love this stationery you printed your resume on!

Pronoun Disagreement

If the noun is singular, the pronoun must be singular. If the noun is plural, the pronoun must be must be plural as well.

- Incorrect: "Every girl must bring their own lunch."
- Correct: "Every girl must bring her own lunch."

Incorrect: There is no place in the hall.

Correct: There is no room in the hall.

Incorrect: I gladly avail of your offer.

Correct: I gladly avail myself of your offer.

Incorrect: This option is preferable than any other.

Correct: This option is preferable to any other.

Incorrect: Don't go in the sun.

Correct: Don't go out in the sun.

Incorrect: They had no sooner arrived then they were arguing.

Correct: They had no sooner arrived than they were arguing.

Incorrect: I, you and he will do it together.

Correct: You, he and I will do it together.

Incorrect: You like ice cream, isn't it?

Correct: You like ice cream, don't you?

Incorrect: Either of the plans are equally

dangerous.

Correct: Either of the plans is equally

dangerous.

Incorrect: Would you like to drink?

Correct: Would you like something to drink?

Incorrect: Be careful or you'll have a cold.

Correct: Be careful or you'll catch a cold.

Incorrect: The head office is in Tokyo.

Correct: The main office is in Tokyo.

Incorrect: He made a world record.

Correct: He set a world record.

Incorrect: He is our common friend.
