2. Goal:

The main aims of the JIGNASA Student Study Projects are:

- > To motivate the students to undertake the local issues being faced by the people as their research topics with a view to find out the solutions.
- ➤ To hone various skills such as Teamwork, Presentation Skills and Language Skills etc.,

3. The Context:

The University Grants Commission always encourages the HEIs to initiate participative, collaborative and project based learning which enable the students to acquire the not only subject knowledge but also various other skills require for employment and entrepreneurship. Keeping this in view, Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, initiated the JIGNASA Student Study Projects Programme to encourage the Govt. Degree College students toward research right from the Degree level. Since 2016-17, the Department of Commerce has been motivating the students to undertake the study projects and to forward the same for the State Level competitions.

4. The Practice

Every year as soon as the Proceedings of JIGNASA SSP is released, Faculty Members of the Commerce Department will create awareness about carrying out the study projects. They guide the students to choose suitable research problem related to the area where the College is located. As a Research Supervisor, Faculty Member concerned will extend guidance and support regarding conducting the survey, the execution and preparation of the project report.

5. Evidence of Success

- As of now, about 4 Student Study Projects were carried out under the Supervision of Commerce Faculty as part of JIGNASA SSP Programme. Of which about 3 projects were selected for State Level Presentation. In 2017-18, 2018-19 and 2021-22, JIGNASA SSP carried out by the Commerce Students were selected for State Level Presentation and the Students performed well.

1. Title of the Project: ECO-CAMPUS

- The college has addressed its waste disposal problem by vermicomposting.

- The solid wastes generated from the college canteen are used in vermicomposting pits to generate compost which is used in college gardening purpose.
- Currently the college has taken an initiative to construct rainwater harvesting structure at premises.
- The college has also installed LHD facilities in the classroom, seminar room and examination rooms. The campus harbours a diverse amount of flora and fauna elements.
- About 50 plant species including medicinal plants are there in the campus.
- The NSS unit of the college deserves a special mention for organizing regular campus cleaning campaigns, awareness program on emerging issues for environmental education.

5. Evidence of Success:

The data for campus audit project was basically collected by the undergraduate students of Botany, zoology and chemistry departments. This has developed a sense of responsibility in them and they get a better understanding of their role as advocates of environmental conservationists. The main problem encountered in the Green campus initiative is development and maintenance of proper infrastructure for the green practices.
