INTRODUCTION:

Government Degree College, Narsampet was established on 3rd December, 1984 in Warangal District of united Andhra Pradesh. Narsampet is a major town located 45 Kilometers away from District headquarters. The college is affiliated to Kakatiya University, After formation of separate Telangana State on 2nd June 2014 and reorganization of new Districts in October 2016, Government Degree College, Narsampet was conferred as Identified College of Warangal District. Which located at Lat 17.93^0 , Long 79.90^0 . The total area of campus is 16 acres. The campus harbours many plants. The campus has rich diversity of plant species, Which includes herbs, shrubs, trees and climbers.

OBJECTIVES:

To evaluate the diversity of plant species in Government Degree College, Narsampet.

MATERIALS AND METHODS

The Flora is prepared based on repeated seasonal collections of plant specimens from the campus, either in the flowering or fruiting stage. Regular field visits were made during the year 2021 in different seasons to explore the various plant species. All the plant specimens available in the study areas were collected for authenticity and the herbarium specimens are prepared by following the method of Jain and Rao . The collected plant specimens were authentically identified with the help of standard floras . All the studied plant species have been arranged alphabetically, along with their Scientific name, family, vernacular names and habit. The families are arranged according to Bentham and Hooker's system of classification .

RESULTS

In the present investigation, a total of 97 species belonging to 44 families have been recorded. Of the 44 families, the most dominant family is Fabaceae- Caesalpinioideae with 08 species followed by Fabaceae-Faboideae (7 Species) Euphorbiaceae (6 Species) Amaranthaceae Asteraceae, Moraceae with 05 species Acanthaceae, Arecaceae, Malvaceae, Myrtaceae, Solanaceae ,Verbanaceae are represented with 03 species. Asclepiadaceae, Commelinaceae Fabaceae-Mimosoideae, Lamiaceae, Liliaceae, Nyctaginaceae, Tiliaceae with 02 Species. and remaining families with 01 Species (Table 1).

CONCLUSION

The study found that the plants recorded from the campus area are economically very important. Some of them are medicinal value; some are ornamental value and few are edible. The documentation of plant is the only way to preserve the fundamental knowledge of the plant resources and it will be useful to the campus students and faculties for further research. Due to over exploitation and deforestation in the natural habitat, few of the presently reported plant species are endangered. Strict conservational measures are to be taken to protect these plants species from becoming rare or endangered.



AIM

To Estimate the amount of casein present in different samples of milk.

INTRODUCTION

By changing the eating habits, lifestyle of people has been advanced. The people are demanding high nutritious and cheapest food resource for their proper growth and development. In this perspective, milk can contribute to ensure food security. Milk is a cheapest and basic source of all valuable nutrients required for the normal body growth and the brain development. Milk is a whitish liquid produced by the mammary glands of female mammals to feed or nourish their young ones. It is the richest and appreciable source of energy for infant mammals including human beings. Milk is an excellent source of proteins, fats, vitamins, minerals and antioxidants. It is a versatile ingredient used for the production of many dairy products i.e. cheese, yogurt, butter, creams, ice creams etc. It contains protein (3.4%), lactose (4.8%), fats (3.6%), water (87.5%), vitamins and minerals (0.7%) [2]. Consumption of milk varies according to the age groups of people. There are about six billion people in the world who consume milk and other milk products.

Casein is considered as a chief and major component of milk because it constitutes about 80% of milk protein while remaining are lactose and whey. It contains all the essential amino acids like Leucine (8.3%), Lysine (7.4%), valine (6.5%), isoleucine (5.5%), phenylalanine (4.5%), threonine (4.4%), methionine (2.5%), tryptophan (1.1%). It is white amorphous solid in pure form with hydrophobic interactions which make it water-insoluble. It is tasteless, odorless with isoelectric pH 4.6 and can be easily separated around this p^H . It readily dissolves in dilute acids and alkalies. In milk, calcium phosphate and casein form colloidal particles called casein micelles. These micelles have negative charge and on adding acid to milk the negative charges are neutralized.

Calcium caseinate + acetic acid \longrightarrow casein(s) + calcium acetate (aq)

The richest profile of amino acids present in the casein shows that it is a valuable source of energy for the development of the brain and the strengthening of muscles and bones. Casein is also used for the manufacturing of dairy products i.e. cheese, curd, ice-creams, milkshakes etc. Besides its nutritional value, casein has many other uses like binders in processed meat, paper coating, glues, the dressing of leather and man-made fibers.

Experimental

Estimation of Casein can be performed in 4 samples i.e Cow milk, Human milk, Goat milk, Sheep milk. Before working, all the milk samples were filtered to remove insoluble impurities like hair, dirt etc.

Requirements

Apparatus and chemicals

250ml beakers, Funnel, Glass rod, Chemical balance, Test tubes, Filtration flask, Bunsen burner, Different samples of milk, 1% acetic acid solution, Saturated ammonium sulphate solution.

PROCEDURE

- 20 ml of each sample milk was taken in a clean dry beaker and to it 20 ml of saturated ammonium sulphate solution was slowly added with stirring. Fat along with casein will precipitate out.
 - This solution was filtered and the precipitate was transfer into another beaker.
 - To the Precipitate 30 ml of water was added.
 - Only casein dissolved in water forming milky solution leaving fat undissolved.
 - The milky solution was heated to about 40°C and 1% acetic acid solution was added dropwise, when casein gets precipitated. . PH of each sample must be 4.6-4.7 and checked by pH meter.
 - Samples were kept undisturbed for 10-15 minutes at room temperature. Precipitates of acid casein were filtered off and washed with methanol to remove fats.
 - Casein in the form of white amorphous substance was dried to calculate percentage yield.
- . The experiments were performed in triplicate and percentage of casein was calculated by using the equation given below.

$$\text{percentage yeild of Casein} = \frac{\text{weight of casein (g)}}{\text{weight of milk (g)}} \times 100$$

Name of milk	Weight of casein	% of casein
Cow milk	0.62g	3.1%

Human milk	0.34g	1.7%
Goat milk	0.56g	2.8%
Sheep milk	0.39g	1.95%

The yield of casein precipitated from the various milk samples of cow milk, Human milk, Goat milk and sheep milk contains 0.62g, 0.34g, 0.56g, 0.39g respectively. This shows that the casein precipitated from the cow milk contains more amount of casein protein than the goat, sheep milk samples.

Conclusion

This study clearly indicated that the amount of casein precipitated from the cow milk was higher than that of the other milk samples. The quantitative analysis of casein precipitated from the various milk samples provide the ample scope to the cottage cheese manufacture.

According to the research findings, cow milk contains the largest amount of casein protein. Thus the cow milk is suitable for the best muscle growth and basic body building achievements. It was found that human milk contains the small amount of casein protein.

- ❖ These representations are of crazy-type, running numbers, single digit, single letter, Triangular, Fibonacci, palindromic-type, prime numbers, embedded, repeated digits, magic squares.

1 Crazy Representations

$$\begin{aligned}2020 &:= 1^{23} \times 4 \times (-5 + 6 + 7 \times 8 \times 9) \\ &:= 9 \times 8 \times 7 \times (6 - 5) \times 4 + 3 + 2 - 1.\end{aligned}$$

1. Pyramid Style: Ending in 0

$$\begin{aligned}2020 &:= -5 + (43 + 2)(1 + 0!) \\ &:= 6! - 5! + \sqrt{4} \times 3!! - 2 \times 10 \\ &:= 7 \times 6 \times (5 + 43) + 2 + 1 + 0! \\ &:= 8 \times (-7 + 65 \times 4) + 3 \times 2 - 10\end{aligned}$$
