They sing and dance around the Bathukamma. This group dance symbolizes unity, love and sisterhood. At sunset, women carry the Bathukamma on their heads. They walk together towards the nearest lake or river. They immerse the Bathukamma in water. Then they distribute sweets among family and neighbours.

Bathukamma festival is a celebration of nature. It is a symbol of Telangana's cultural identity. Keeping up the spirit of the festival, the lady staff members and girl students of the college participated in the dance. The male staff and boys also showed their enthusiasm by their active participation. The principal of the college, Dr. Ch. Rama Raju and faculty members Smt. S. Savithribhai Phule Jayanthi 3/1/2022

The Women Empowerment Cell of MKR Government Degree College Devarakonda organized the birthday celebrations of the eminent 19th social reformer, Savitribai Phule on 3 January 2022.

Ms. S. Sarada Devi, Assistant Professor of Commerce inaugurated the event and said that Savitribai Phule was a pioneer of women's education in the country. Revered as the country's first woman teacher, she was the wife of Jyoti Rao Phule.

The In-chargePrincipal, J. Vishwanadh Kumar, spoke on the occasion and said that Savitribai Phule was the first female teacher of India, a social reformer who is known to work for women and lower caste. She raised her voice against the oppressive social system prevalent in the society of Pune (Maharashtra) in the 19th Century. Medical Camp

Eminent Gynecologist, Dr. Shanti Swaroopa was the chief guest and doctor who checked the health of students. A total of 150 students and 13 faculty members attended the camp.

Smt. S. Sarada Devi, Assistant Professor of Commerce, spoke on the occasion and said that she was proud to organize such an important event as health is wealth. She emphasized the need for regular checkup and special care to be taken by women about their health. Dr. Shanti Swaroopa spoke about hemoglobin and said that it is a protein in the red blood cells that carries oxygen to the body's organs and tissues and transports carbon dioxide from the organs and tissues back to your lungs. If a hemoglobin test reveals that the hemoglobin level is lower than normal, it means that one has a low red blood cell count (anemia).

The nurses conducted hemoglobin and other blood tests on the students. They gave medicines to students who are found to be anemic. They also checked the general health of the students and gave medicines accordingly.

At the closing ceremony, the principal, Dr. Ch. Rama Raju, spoke and lauded the WEC, NSS and Bhagya for organizing such a great event. He stressed the need for students to take care of their health.







11/4/2022

The Women Empowerment Cell in association NSS Units I & II organized Jyothiba Phule Jayanthi on 11/04/2022. A total of 40 students and 5 faculty members attended the event.

Sk. Arifa, Lecturer in Mathematics gave a welcome speech and said that Jyotirao 'Jyotiba' Govindrao Phule was a prominent social reformer and thinker of the nineteenth century India. He led the movement against the prevailing caste-restrictions in India. He revolted against the domination of upper castes and struggled for the rights of peasants and other low-caste people.

The principal, Dr. Ch. Rama Raju spoke on the occasion and said that Mahatma Jyotiba Phule was a pioneer for women education in India and fought for the education of girls throughout his life. He is believed to be the first Hindu to start an orphanage for the unfortunate children. NSS Officer Mr. V. Makatlal spoke and said that Savitribai was taught to read and write by her husband Jyotirao. In 1851, Jyotiba established a girls' school and asked his wife to teach the girls in the school. Later, he opened two more schools for the girls and an indigenous school for the lower castes, especially for the Mahars and Mangs.

Jyotiba realized the pathetic conditions of widows and established an ashram for young widows and eventually became advocate of the idea of Widow Remarriage. In 1873, Jyotiba Phule formed the Satya Shodhak Samaj (Society of Seekers of Truth). He undertook a systematic deconstruction of existing beliefs and history, only to reconstruct an equality promoting version.

In the event, the photo of Jyotiba Phule was garlanded. The event ended with a vote of thanks proposed by Sk. Arifa, Lecturer in Mathematics.

Gender Sensitization through Literature

Some feminist writers are expressing their views in an entirely new perspective. The feminist writers include not only female writers, but also male writers, e.g., Chalam, Kodavatiganti Kutumba Rao etc., are such progressive male writers who strived for the emancipation of women.

Women writers are portraying women's world and women's problems through their own eyes. They are choosing the issues that only women can discuss and are expressing their views without any inhibitions. In a girl's life, marriage should be a sweet feeling. However, she realizes that her dreams are all untrue in this patriarchal society. Society forces her to think of marriage as a life in a cage of knives or self-immolation in a bonfire.

Mr. G. Kotaiah, Lecturer in Telugu spoke and said that the feminist Telugu literature has dealt with the typical problems of middle-class society. However, in India still 80% of the population is agrarian. The problems of women in the villages are entirely different from the city dwelling middle class women. Feminists have to focus on the problems of majority of women who live in villages.

The college principal, Dr. Ch. Rama Raju, said that women in villages are not caged in the kitchen or ogled at in bus stops or manhandled in trains and buses. Women in villages face problems like illiteracy, ignorance, poverty, superstitions, alcoholism, divorce, cruelty of husbands etc. Women are exploited in a different way in the villages. Feminists have to devise special programs to elevate the lives of women in the villages. The emancipation of women is tied to the emancipation of all through education.


