MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MoU") is made and entered at Hyderabad, on this 23 day of APRIL, 2021, by and between: Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana (Government) having its office situated at 3rd Floor, Prof Jayashankar Vidya Bhavan, Nampally, Hyderabad-500001, (hereinafter referred to as "CCETS" which expression shall, unless it be repugnant to the subject or context thereof, be deemed to mean and include its successors and permitted assigns) of the FIRST PART;

AND

HDFC BANK LIMITED, a Banking company incorporated under the Companies Act, 1956 and licensed as a bank under the Banking Regulation Act, 1949, having its Registered Office at HDFC Bank House, Senapati Bapat Marg, Lower Parel, Mumbai 400013 and represented through its branch situated at No 8/2/681 /1/A , Ground Floor, Zoom House, Road No 12, Banjara Hills, Hyderabad -500034 (hereinafter referred to as the "Bank" which expression shall, unless it be repugnant to the subject or context thereof, be deemed to mean and include its successors and assigns) of the OTHER PART;

The "Bank" and "CCETS" shall hereinafter collectively referred to as the "Parties" and individually as a "Party".

WHEREAS:

HDFC Bank is engaged in the business of Banking.

CCETS is a department of Government of Telangana and is engaged in the service of Collegiate Education.

CCETS has rolled out a project in the field of information technology for digitizing various processes in its various departments/sections basis which the Citizens can avail various digitized services from the Government such as Online system of admissions including online fee collection

AND WHEREAS, HDFC Bank has its presence in the banking and financial industry since more than two decades and has come forward to facilitate in identifying some of the Service providers /Technology Partners engaged in the business of development of software technology, which will help CCETS to avail various facilities from the said technology service providers for online fee collection purpose..

AND WHEREAS, considering that the digital initiative of the CCETS which will inter-alia benefit the Bank's customers also, the Bank has agreed to provide necessary facilitation to the CCETS in pursuance of this MoU.

AND WHEREAS, to record the aforesaid understanding, the Parties agreed to execute this MoU on the terms and conditions more particularly mentioned in



NOW THIS MOU WITNESSETH AND IT IS NOW AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS UNDER:

1. TERM

The MoU shall be effective from 01Feb 2021 and shall unless terminated in pursuance of clause 8, shall remain valid and in force.

2. SCOPE OF THE MOU & ROLES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES:

- 2.1. The Bank Shall provide the service of (Free Of Cost) Q fix which is a user friendly Web and Mobile based school / college management software and ERP system focusing on next generation smart education ERP solution. It offers a single platform for educational institutes to connect with students & parents and facilitate online fees collection, communication management (notices, alerts, circulars, events, performance report, timetable, holidays etc.), online admissions and others. The Bank will also help in training the staff in use of Qfix.



2.2. The Bank has also agreed to facilitate CCETS in identifying the Service providers /Technology Partners who are engaged in the Business of development of software technology or the software application for various purposes which will help CCETS to avail various facilities from the said technology service providers for the purpose of its business.

2.3. Also, the Bank shall facilitate, CCETS by providing the necessary banking facilities which shall include but are not limited to offer of Payment Gateway, Cash Management solutions, provision of General banking facility including opening of various accounts, acting as preferred banker of the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education Entity as may be mutually agreed between the Parties.

3. Responsibilities of CCETS:


- a. Shall nominate a SPOC at O/o CCETS for coordinating with the bank.
- a. Shall direct all Government Degree Colleges (GDCs) working under its purview to nominate POC at the College level who shall contact and coordinate with Bank
- b. Shall direct the GDCs working under its purview to register in Qfix with official college email ID, which shall be used for all further communications with Bank.
- c. Shall direct the GDCs working under its purview, to upload students' data from their respective colleges into Qfix.
- d. Nominate its staff for training on Qfix (as per the interest of CCETS) and provide logistics and other facilities for training to the staff of GDCs, wherever required.
- e. Shall direct GDCs to inform fee payment dates (admission and examinations) at least 2-3days ahead of the actual line and also provide time to time intimations about late fee to the Bank.

4. Responsibilities of Bank:

- a. Shall open a savings bank account for all Government Degree Colleges as per the PAN submitted by them.
- b. Shall give Qfix access to all GDCs in the state.
- c. Shall provide on-board and usage training to all GDCs as and when requested for the same by CCETS.
- d. Shall provide technical assistance on day-to-day basis as and when required.
- e. Shall provide one Master admin login to CCETS
- f. Further, shall offer salary accounts to interested staff of CCETS, and shall offer zero balance savings account for interested students pursuing under graduation studies.

5. **CONSIDERATION**

The Parties agree to execute this MoU for mutual beneficial relationship.



6. REPRESENTATIONS, WARRANTIES AND UNDERTAKINGS BY THE PARTIES:

(A) Each of the Parties represents and warrants to the other as under:

- (a) It is duly organized, validly existing and in good standing, under the laws of the jurisdiction of its incorporation;
- (b) It has all the requisite power and authority to execute, deliver and perform its obligations under these presents and to comply with the terms and conditions contained herein;
- (c) These presents have been validly executed and delivered and constitute a legal, valid and binding obligation of such Party.

(B) Commissionerate of Collegiate Education agrees that, the Bank shall not be held responsible or liable nor Bank shall indemnify for any acts, deeds or things on part of the Service Provider for any software or solutions that shall be provided by the Service Provider to Commissionerate of Collegiate Education whose appointment is being facilitated by the Bank in pursuance of this MoU.


7. CONFIDENTIALITY

7.1. This clause shall survive the termination or expiry of the MoU.

7.2. Both Parties hereto shall protect all confidential information of the other Party which is in their possession or which may come during the course of MoU.

7.3. The Confidential Information shall not include following information:

- (a) if the Recipient can show that the Confidential Information received from the Disclosing Party is or has become generally available to the public through no violation of the terms of this MoU;
- (b) if such Confidential Information is in a written record in the Recipient's files prior to receipt from the Disclosing Party, subject to the Recipient having legally obtained such Confidential Information;
- (c) if the Recipient at any time lawfully obtains such Confidential Information in writing from a third party under circumstances permitting its disclosure except where such disclosure is made under obligations of secrecy or confidentiality; or
- (d) if such Confidential Information is disclosed with the prior written consent of the Disclosing Party, provided that any disclosure complies in all respects with the terms of such written consent.



8. TERM AND TERMINATION


- 8.1. Subject to clause 1, CCETS shall be entitled to terminate the MoU for convenience upon 30 days' notice in writing being served on the Bank whereas, the Bank shall be entitled to terminate the MoU for convenience at any time, by serving a notice of 30 days' in writing on CCETS.
- 8.2. The expiry or termination of this MoU shall be without prejudice to the accrued rights and obligations of the Parties and all such accrued rights and obligations shall remain in full force and effect and be enforceable notwithstanding such expiry or termination.
- 8.3. Upon termination of the MoU, the Bank shall cease to provide the Services contemplated in the MoU and Commissionerate of Collegiate Education is free to avail the services from any other Service Provider who can provide these services.

9. INDEMNITY:

- a. CCETS agrees to indemnify the Bank, for any loss or liability or any cost or expenses that may be incurred by the Bank on account of breach of any representation or warranties on part of CCETS or breach of any applicable laws on part of CCETS or any loss or liability that may be incurred by the Bank attributable to the gross negligence or willful misconduct on part of CCETS or any third party liability incurred by the Bank attributable to the acts, deeds or things on part of the CCETS
- b. Bank agrees to indemnify the CCETS, for any loss or liability or any cost or expenses that may be incurred by the CCETS on account of breach of any representation or warranties on part of the Bank or breach of any applicable laws on part of Bank or any loss or liability that may be incurred by the CCETS attributable to the gross negligence or willful misconduct on part of Bank or any third party liability incurred by the CCETS attributable to the acts, deeds or things on part of the Bank.

10. DISCLAIMERS:

- Without prejudice to any other provisions of this Agreement, the Bank shall not be liable to the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education for any loss or damage whatsoever or however caused or arising, whether directly or indirectly, in connection with the Services and/or this Agreement, including any loss or damage arising from:
- (a) Any interruption or stoppage in the work performed by the Bank.
- (b) Any inaccurate or faulty message received by the Bank in course of processing of a Transaction;



- The Bank does not represent that the services to be provided by the Bank will be provided uninterrupted, or that it will be free from errors. Provided that the Bank will make an endeavour to take all the necessary precautions to ensure that, there are no errors on part of the Bank while rendering the Services.

11. NOTICES

- 11.1. All notices, approvals, instructions, demand and other communication given or made under this MoU shall be in writing and may, be given by facsimile, electronic mail, personal delivery or by sending the same by pre-paid registered mail addressed to the relevant Party at its address or email set out below (or such other address or email as the addressee has by 5 (Five) calendar days' prior written notice specified to the other Party):

- 11.2. Any notice, approval, instruction, demand or other communication so addressed to the relevant Party shall be deemed to have been delivered (i) if given or made by registered mail, 5 (Five) calendar days after posting; (ii) if given by personal delivery at the time of delivery; and (iii) if given or made by email, upon receipt of an email delivery report confirming receipt by the other Party. Provided that email shall be immediately on the same day followed by a copy of the notice by a reputable overnight courier.

12. GOVERNING LAW, JURISDICTION AND ARBITRATION

This MoU shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of India. The Parties agree that if the process of the courts is required to be invoked for enforcement of provisions of this MoU, including for seeking of any interim relief prior, during or after invocation of this Clause, then the competent courts in Hyderabad, India shall have exclusive jurisdiction to adjudicate any dispute or difference by and between the Parties.

13. RELATIONSHIP OF PARTIES

This MoU is being entered into on a principal to principal basis and nothing contained in this MoU shall be deemed to create any partnership, agency, employment and/ or joint venture of/ with the other Party or the representatives of the other Party. Both Parties agree that it will not represent that it is an agent of the other Party nor hold itself out as such.

14. COUNTERPARTS

This MOU may be executed simultaneously in any number of counterparts, each of which shall be deemed an original, but all of which together shall constitute one and the same instrument.








15. AMENDMENTS



RUSA is a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (C.S.S.), launched in 2013 aims at providing strategic funding to eligible State Higher Educational Institutions. The Central Funding (in the ratio of 60:40 for General Category States) would be norm based and outcome dependent. The Funding flows from the Central Ministry through the State Governments, Union Territories to the State Higher Education Councils before reaching the identified Institutions. The Funding to States is made on the basis of critical appraisal of State Higher Education Plans, which would describe each State's strategy to address issues of equity, access and excellence in Higher Education.

Ministry of Human Resources Development, Government of India has selected Osmania University to extend support under the RUSA 2.0 programme under the following two components: 1. Component 4 (Quality and Excellence in select State Universities (New)), and 2. Component 13 (Faculty Improvement). The Centre is one of the 22 Media Centers established by the UGC in premier institutions of the country to produce educational video programmes for 'Doordarshan' and UGC's 'Vyas Higher Educational Channel' and also to produce e-content for e-learning/Massive Open Online Courses (MOOCs) for Swayam portal of MHRD.

Whereas all the above public institutions have come together to create syllabus based video content for online learning of Self Enhancement Courses offered in Telangana.

About Massive Online Self Enhancement Courses (SECs)


A Self Enhancement Course is an academic class where a well-qualified instructor imparts pertinent knowledge and skill in a particular discipline. These courses provide access to modules for enhancing technological, personal and organizational skills of the students. The courses will be a blend of lab experiments, practical training in the form of videos, text, graphics, assignments, etc.


1. Commissionerate of Collegiate Education undertakes to:

- Appoint a committee for coordinating and monitoring the development and utilization of SECs in Colleges/institutions in Telangana.
- Provide necessary instructions to the faculty working in the concerned subjects to participate in the development of SECs as resource persons for each course.
- Provide necessary budget to EMRC, OU, through RUSA, Osmania University.
- Provide necessary instruction so that the each subject/course Coordinator is responsible for:
 - Design and development of pertinent curriculum for the respective subject/course.
 - Identify the resource persons and arrange participation of video recording at EMRC, OU.
 - Design and conduct weekly tests, term-end tests, etc, as required; and
 - Handle queries from enrolled students with the help of the Course Coordinator and respective universities.

2. Osmania University undertakes to

- Facilitate in Identifying Course Coordinators from respective departments.
- Facilitate the Course Coordinators to design the courses and syllabus with the help of domain experts.

- Coordinate between the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Course Coordinators and EMRC, for smooth creation of the content for the courses.
- Provide guidelines, when and wherever required, to the coordinators and resource persons for creation the course content.
- Provide budgetary provisions for production of the MOOCs, such as travel, stay, co- coordinator fee, subject expert fee, resource person fee, preview expert fee, etc., as applicable, from the funds provided by RUSA, Osmania University, for the purpose.

3. EMRC, OU, undertakes to:


- Produce videos at EMRC with the resource person and content provided by the course coordinator as per the standards required for SECs.
- Most of the programmes are shot in the EMRC studio unless warranted to shoot outside labs.
- Provide preview of the programme and corrections there on.
- Deliver the final product on a DVD to the Commissioner, Collegiate Education, Govt. of Telangana.


4. State Project Directorate, RUSA, Govt. of Telangana

- Shall see that the RUSA, Osmania University, provides funds to EMRC for production of video lectures for SECs.
- Shall see that the RUSA, Osmania University make payments to the travel, stay, coordinator fee, subject expert fee, resource person fee, preview expert fee etc.,
- Shall see that RUSA, Osmania University meet any other expenditure related to the development of SECs Courses.

Commercials:

- a. The cost of each lesson of 25- 30 minutes duration shall be of Rs.18,000/- that includes honorarium for coordinator and resource persons, charges for editor, graphics, preview, consumables, hospitality, etc. And no TA/DA or accommodation shall be provided to the persons involved in the video production.
- b. The required number of lessons for each SEC is a minimum of 25 and a maximum of 30 lessons and not less than 25.
- c. An advance of Rs.18,00,000/- (i.e., @ Rs.18,000/- for 100 lessons) shall be provided by RUSA, OU, to Director, EMRC, OU, through RTGS / draft / cheque in **A/c. No. 52198264755, IFSC Code. SBIN0020071, SBI, OU branch, Hyderabad** by the **RUSA, OU**.
- d. On 10th of each month 30 lessons will be submitted to CCE and payment for the same shall be released by RUSA, OU, by the end of the month.


Exit Clause:





MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING

22nd JULY, 2021

This Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) is made on the ~~14th December 2020~~, at Hyderabad, Telangana State

BETWEEN

Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC) through its representative duly authorized by the Director, having its office at IUAC Campus, Aruna Asaf Ali Marg, New Delhi -110067 (India) (hereinafter called content provider) which expression shall unless it be repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to mean and include its successor and/or permitted assigns.

AND

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education (CCE) as the representative of State Government of Telangana, on behalf of 6 State Universities, for the students pursuing UG programme in the affiliated colleges, having its office at Vidyabhavan, Nampally, Hyderabad (hereafter called the Content User) which expression shall unless it be repugnant to the context or meaning thereof be deemed to mean and include its successor or and permitted assigns

WHEREAS Consortium for Educational Communication (CEC) is an Inter University Center established by the University Grants Commission (UGC) under section 12 (CCC) of the UGC Act, 1956;

AND WHEREAS CEC is the nodal agency at National Level, to address the educational needs of the country through the use of various media of communication and one of the objective of the CEC is of production of educational programmes specially video, audio and related support material and also dissemination of educational programmes through both broadcast and non broadcast mode;

AND WHEREAS in accordance with the policy of the Government of India and the UGC, the CEC has been addressing the needs of higher education through the use of powerful medium of television along with appropriate use of emerging Information Communication Technology (ICT) and CEC intends to increase the reach and access of its educational content in various disciplines/ subjects / courses related to UG/PG education for the benefit of students and teachers in higher education;

AND THEREFORE, CEC has agreed to provide the e-content / digital content to the user on the following terms and conditions, as agreed to between the parties:

1. Objectives of the MoU:

Through this MoU, it is envisioned that a framework of cooperation shall be developed between the parties towards sharing of content already developed by EMRC of Osmania University and other EMRCs across the country which is solely for the benefit of students pursuing UG Programme under the 6 State Universities of Telangana and not for any commercial purpose.

2. Term of MoU

- i. The present MoU shall be initially for a period of five years unless determined or terminated earlier.
- ii. At the end of term of five years, the MoU may be renewed solely at the option of CEC subject to such terms and conditions as may be lead down by the CEC. However, the benefit of renewal may be provided to only such content users, which has not defaulted in observance of the present MoU during the period of five years or in case of any default on the part of content user, the content user shall have to rectify / remedy such default to the satisfaction of CEC in order to be eligible for renewal.

3. Modalities for providing content:

- i. The content would be provided offline through a portable medium for its storage on local server with access platform like Digital Lounge/Digital Corner etc.
- ii. For this, a formal MoU shall be signed between CEC and CCE. The EMRC center at Osmania University will provide space, infrastructure including one high end server and access terminals and LAN networking etc. for creating a digital access platform/station such as Digital Lounge or any other suitable arrangement to be made by the user Institution, etc.in central library or at any appropriate location in the university/institution or institutions under Academic / Administrative Control.
- iii. e-resources would be provided as Open Educational Resources (OER) under Creative Commons Non-Commercial (CCNC) License.

- iv. e-resources would be provided off-line to the registered members and through them to their constituents or affiliated institutions.

4. Execution:

The content may be provided on first come first serve basis under MoU.

5. Membership Charges & Others:

- i. One time Registration Charges (non-refundable) –

- Waiver to the Content User under 5.1 (b) as the content is solely used for the benefit of students pursuing UG Programme with all subjects under the 6 State Universities of Telangana and not for any commercial purpose.

- ii. Annual subscription charges —

- Waiver to the Content User under 5.2 (ii) as the content is solely used for the benefit of students pursuing UG Programme with all subjects under the 6 State Universities of Telangana and not for any commercial purpose.
- The Digital content available as OER with CEC shall be provided free of charge to content user.
- Portable Media / Media cost for transfer of content shall be provided by the State.

6. Terms and Conditions (CEC)

- i. Service Related

- CEC shall provide e-resources available with CEC as OER to the offline on suitable media to transfer the same to storage on the local server in Digital Lounge / any other suitable arrangement for storage and access made by the member institution/user institution.
- The Content User, at its discretion, may devise mechanism to check excessive simultaneous downloads using robots or other mechanism or after alerting the registered user may discontinue the services until such time the registered user disables such mechanisms that enables such downloads.

- ii. General

- CEC shall make every effort and has built-in robust internal review of the content and shall rectify if and when errors are noticed or brought to its attention. However, CEC shall not be liable and would remain indemnified for damages – material or otherwise- if any, caused to the Registered User on account of reliance to such e-resources.

- CEC shall continue to make additions /revisions to the e-resources from time -to-time as it deems necessary and all such newly added content and / or revisions shall be made available to the Registered User at no additional cost. However, CEC shall not be liable for damages - material or otherwise - if any, caused by the difference between the content of the e-resources accessed prior to additions and / or revisions and after such additions / revisions.
- The copyright of the e-resources shall vest with CEC which is the content provider. No reproduction of the e-resources in part or in full or in any manner for commercial purposes shall be made of the e- resources accessed by the Registered/Authorized content user. Any part of the e-resources accessed by the Registered User and used for academic and /or research purposes shall be acknowledged following the generally accepted convention of citation prevalent at the time of such usage.
- If any commercial usage of the any part of the e-resources accessed or reproduction / use of any part of the e-resources for academic and / or research purposes without acknowledging the content provider CEC, shall be considered as Default in Use and CEC shall have the right to terminate the access to e-resources from the date on which the Default in Use had come to attention of the CEC and Registered member shall ensure that the default user will not and could not use the content after termination of his right to access the content.
- The liability of the CEC to provide the access to the e-resources is subject to the continued technical feasibility such as available bandwidth or any such event or conditions at the premises of the authorized User / wherein CEC has no control of such events or conditions.
- Disruptions to the access by the authorized User on account of technical conditions prevailing at CEC end, in so far as it relates to the equipment and facilities within the premises and control of CEC shall rectify such technical difficulties within shortest possible time period. If conditions are such that, it is beyond the control / means of CEC or not feasible technically, then, CEC shall not be liable for any disruption in services.
- The CEC, as content provider, would not discontinue the access to e-resources on account of excessive downloads at users end. Instead, the

content provider should devise mechanism to check excessive simultaneous downloads using robots, malware or other mechanism.

7. Member institutions recognize the following obligations on its part:

- i. The Content User will provide space, infrastructure including one high end server with at least 10TB space and minimum 10 student terminals / systems and LAN Networking and creating / establishing a Digital Lounge in central, library or any appropriate location in the University/Institutions under the academic administrative control as an arrangement for content access facilities.
- ii. Members of Academic Staff, other employees, management, registered students, researchers, alumni members of the Authorized User shall have access to e-resources made available by/ through the CEC.
- iii. The Content User shall be permitted by the registered member to access the e- resources made available to the Registered member under this MoU shall be allowed to view, search, browse and download the e-resources for teaching, learning, referral, research or any other academic activities.
- iv. The Content User shall institute appropriate protocol to manage and supervise the access to and the usage of the e-resources being accessed so as to ensure that proposed usage of access devices and content are made and keep records of the user profile.
- v. The Content User shall ensure the integrity of the e-resources accessed at its physical address or under IP address is maintained. The Authorized User shall be liable to indemnify CEC, any loss of the e-resources or damage to the integrity of the e-resources or modification of the e-resources arising out of such unauthorized access and/or usage.
- vi. The Authorized User shall fully cooperate with CEC and any other State or Central agencies for any consequences arising out of any unauthorized access to and use of e-resources made available to the Authorized User / Registered Member under this MoU.

8. Force Majeure Event

Any failure or delay of a Party to perform any obligation under this MOU solely by reason of acts of God, government acts / restrictions, riots, wars, strikes, lockouts, fire, flood, power failures, or other causes beyond its control (a "Force Majeure Event") shall not be deemed to be a breach of this MOU provided, however, that the Party so prevented from complying shall continue to take all action within its power to comply as fully as possible with the provisions of this MOU. Performance

of this MOU shall resume as soon as practicable after such Force Majeure Event has come to an end or has ceased to exist.

9. Termination

- i. If any commercial usage of the any part of the e-resources accessed or reproduction/use of any part of the e-resources for academic and/or research purposes without acknowledging the e-resources provider, CEC, comes to notice, it shall be considered as Default in Use and CEC shall have the right to terminate the access to e-resources from the date on which the Default in Use had come to attention/ knowledge of the CEC. In the event of Authorized User being declared as Default in Use, the subscription amount of the unexpired period shall be confiscated and the status as the Authorized User shall cease from date on which the Default in Use had come to attention of the CEC. It is obligatory on the part of Authorized user that there is no misuse of content or commercial gain and it is being used only for the academic and research purposes and Registered Members shall ensure that there is no misuse of content or commercial gain and it is being used only for the Academic and Research purposes for which it was provided.
- ii. The MoU shall cease to be operative in the event a determination is made to the effect that continuation of the operation of this MoU would result in any damage or loss to CEC or irreparable damage to the e-resources made available under this MoU. Such determination shall be made by CEC or CEC in consultation with the Registered Member. Such determination shall be conveyed to the Registered Member through post or email to the address to where the correspondence is normally sent/ made.
- iii. The MoU shall cease to be operative by mutual agreement. The MoU shall cease to be operative by giving 15 days' notice to the other party of its intention to withdraw from MoU. During the notice period, the Registered User shall not access the e-resources. Any such access to and/or usage of the e- resources by the Content User shall be considered unauthorized access and usage and CEC shall have the right to get indemnified for such usage.

10. Correspondence & Notices

All correspondence including Notices shall be served to the registered address / email address provided in this MoU or last known address/email and such delivery shall deemed to have been served to the User.

11. Resolution of the Dispute or Disagreement

- i. The provisions of this MoU shall be governed by laws of India in so far as it relates to the subject matter of this MoU.
- ii. In the event of disagreement or dispute in matters pertaining to the MoU shall be addressed through mutual discussion and agreement in the first instance. Instance of such dispute or disagreement shall be communicated to the other party through a written communication to the physical address/email of the other party.
- iii. In the event such mutual discussion does not result in an agreement, such disputes shall be settled under the laws of arbitration applicable to India by the sole arbitrator in accordance with the rules. The Chairman of GB, CEC shall be the sole arbitrator for this purpose. The place of the arbitration shall be in New Delhi (India) and shall be carried out in the English language.
- iv. In cases of ambiguity by interpretation of provisions of Clauses of MoU or where the MoU is silent, Director, CEC, would be final authority to decide on the issue.

This Memorandum of Understanding ("MOU") is entered into and effective as of 20th Feb 2019, by and between:

Miles Education Private Limited, a Private Limited Company duly incorporated and registered in India under the Companies Act, 2013, bearing Corporate Identification No. U22219TG2011PTC076218 and having its Registered Office situated at Ground -1 Floor, JST - Silicon Towers, Kondapur, Hyderabad 500084 (hereinafter referred to as the "**Miles**")

And

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Hyderabad having its registered office at 3rd Floor Vidya Bhavan, Opposite to Latha Talkies, Nampally, Hyderabad-500001 and hereinafter unless the context otherwise requires be referred to as "**CCETS**".

Whereas:

- A.** Miles Education up skills students and professionals across the world to help them be future-ready and enable their career progression. Founded by Harvard and Stanford alumni, Miles provides training towards globally recognized certifications in finance and accounting, digital marketing, leadership and strategy, business analytics, and emerging technologies. Furthermore:
 - a.** Miles is a Platinum Approved Course Provider with the Institute of Management Accountants, U.S. (hereinafter referred to as "IMA") to provide U.S. CMA (Certified Management Accountant) training.
 - b.** Miles is a Registered Course Provider with the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants, U.S. (hereinafter referred to as "AICPA") to provide U.S. CPA (Certified Public Accountant) training.
 - c.** Miles is the Platinum Approved Training Partner with Wiley to provide training for Wiley Certified Business Analyst (WCBA).

- B.** Miles has promoted CareerGraph which is a bridge between the academia and the industry. On the CareerGraph.com platform, students get an opportunity to "experience" and work on projects from companies as part of their "learning".

- C. The Parties share the common interest of providing holistic learning and education opportunities for students to engage in project-based learning to enhance their future career prospects.

Miles and CCETS desire to enter into this Memorandum setting out the terms and conditions under which the purpose and scope of this MOU will be achieved.

Article 1 Effective Date

The Parties hereby agree that the Effective date of this MOU shall be the date on which it is signed. The preamble to this Agreement constitutes an integral part thereof.

ARTICLE 2 Purpose and Scope

Purpose: This MOU outlines the mutual cooperation between the two parties for helping in bridging the gap between the academia and the industry. On the CareerGraph.com platform, students get an opportunity to "experience" and work on projects from companies as part of their "learning".

Role and scope of cooperation: The Parties agree to, in the spirit of mutual cooperation, use best efforts towards fulfillment of their respective obligations in achieving the purpose of this MOU.

This MOU outlines the commitments of both the Parties.

2.1 Responsibilities of CCETS –

- a) CCETS will recommend and encourage all Government Degree colleges to engage their students in project-based learning on the CareerGraph platform, and motivate its faculty to effectively mentor and evaluate their respective students.
- b) CCETS would recommend and encourage all the Government Degree colleges under them to work with Miles to offer globally recognized international professional programs including U.S. CMA, U.S. CPA, Digital Marketing and Wiley Certificate in Business Analytics to their students

2.2 Responsibilities of Miles – Miles will award CCETS the status of "CareerGraph Partner Institution" wherein:

- a) Miles will provide free access to all the students studying in Government Degree colleges under CCETS to the real-time, multi-functional and multi-dimensional projects on the CareerGraph.com platform.
- b) Faculty members of all the Government Degree colleges under CCETS will be provided free faculty login access and they would be able to mentor GDCs students and evaluate their projects directly on the CareerGraph platform.

- c) All Students Government Degree colleges under CCETS will have an option to enroll for value-added "Pre-Internship" by paying nominal fee born by the students. Under this option, CCETS students will be provided access to insights from industry, additional evaluation of their project by CareerGraph and Industry experts, a verifiable certificate and increased opportunity for internships.

Article 3

Intellectual Property

- 3.1 Intellectual Property means all systems, processes, procedures, proposition descriptions, models, copyrights, trademarks, trade secrets, and patents, utility models, methods and other intellectual property rights recognized in any jurisdiction worldwide, including all applications and registrations.
- 3.2 All Intellectual Property brought-in/used by Miles for any of the activities/projects undertaken under this MOU shall belong to Miles at all times.
- 3.3 The Materials provided by Miles are protected by copyright, including without limitation by Copyright Law and other applicable laws in India.
- 3.4 CCETS will not reveal, make use of or commercialize any of the confidential information provided by Miles either during the currency or after termination of the related Agreement for a period of 3 years.
- 3.5 Miles will retain the right of ownership to all the Intellectual Property Rights.
- 3.6 CCETS shall not use Intellectual Property that is in any way based on the systems, processes, protocols, propositions and models of Miles, even though CCETS may have amended and added to the foundation Intellectual Property.
- 3.7 The data of the students should not be shared to anyone without the permission of CCE other than for the project for which the students have registered.

ARTICLE 4

General Provisions

- 4.1 Both Parties agree to maintain at all times, a one-point contact for undertaking and overseeing the initiatives listed out in this MOU. Any change in the contacts will be promptly notified to the other Party.

- 4.2 This MOU references good faith efforts by both CCETS and Miles and is an expression of the Parties' current intent and recognizes the fact that the execution of some of the terms of the MOU could require the Parties to enter into definitive agreements. It is understood that without such definitive agreements, the terms of the MOU are not legally binding and will not be relied upon by any party for any purpose and no party is or will be bound by the terms of this MOU, unless and until definitive agreements are signed.
- 4.3 **Term and Termination:**
The Terms and Conditions agreed under this MOU shall commence on 20th Feb, 2019 and shall remain in effect for 3 years or until terminated, whichever is earlier.
- This MoU may be terminated by either of the Parties by giving not less than 3 months' notice in writing to the other Party.
- 4.4 **Applicable Law:** The construction, interpretation and enforcement of this MOU shall be governed by the laws of India. The courts of Hyderabad shall have jurisdiction over any action arising out of this MOU and over the parties, and the venue shall be Hyderabad, India.
- 4.5 This MOU supersedes all prior oral or written communication, discussions and representations communicated between the parties hereto in respect of the subject matter of this MOU.
- 4.6 Any notice under this MOU will be in writing and delivered by hand or by registered post acknowledgement due, to the other party at the registered office or as may be substituted by the notice. If any notice sent by e-mail, post will be effective on the date of receipt.
- 4.7 **Severability:** Should any portion of this MOU be judicially determined to be illegal or unenforceable, the remainder of the MOU shall continue in full force

and effect, and either party may renegotiate the terms affected by the severance.

- 4.8 **Third Party Beneficiary Rights:** The parties do not intend to create in any other individual or entity the status of a third party beneficiary, and this MOU shall not be construed to as to create such status. The rights, duties and obligations contained in this MOU shall operate only between the parties to this MOU, and shall inure solely to the benefit of the parties to this MOU. The provisions of this MOU are intended only to assist the parties in determining and performing their obligations under this MOU. The parties to this MOU intend and expressly agree that only parties signatory to this MOU shall have any legal or equitable right to seek to enforce this MOU to seek any remedy arising out of a party's performance or failure to perform any term or condition of this MOU, or to bring an action for the breach of this MOU.



Memorandum of Agreement

This Memorandum of Agreement is made between

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana (CCETS)

and

Spoken Tutorial Project, IIT Bombay (ST- IIT Bombay)

The Commissionerate of Collegiate Education is created to promote quality education, giving special attention to the areas located in backward and rural areas. It also strengthens the women education at undergraduate level and works towards educational opportunities for weaker sections of the society.

The Spoken Tutorial project developed by IIT Bombay for MHRD, Government of India is the initiative of the National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology (ICT), launched by the Ministry of Human Resources and Development, Government of India. The uses of spoken tutorial is to advocate and popularize numerous Open Source software and their utilization.

Spoken tutorial project intends to provide opportunity to conduct software training from ST-IIT Bombay to all the Government Degree Colleges (GDCs) in Telangana state. As the programme is funded by the National Mission on Education through ICT, MHRD, Government of India it charges a nominal annual User Fee of Rs.25000/year/college. The program will provide the following benefits to the students of GDCs under purview of CCETS-

1. Students and Teachers receive hands on training through a particular FOSS (Free and Open Source Software) like Linux, Scilab, LaTeX, PHP & MySQL, Java, C/C++, Libre Office etc. The students who complete the required training hours will be awarded Certificates by Spoken Tutorial Project, IIT Bombay.
2. The training enhances IT, Software skills and employability for the students and any number of students and faculty can take any number of courses and Certificates in a year with User Fee of Rs. 25000/year/college.

The Commissionerate of Collegiate Education (CCE), Telangana State and **Spoken Tutorial Project,** IIT Bombay does hereby agree to the following broad terms of cooperation as under:

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education shall-

- Identify a Chief Central Co-ordinator from the department who will actively work and co-ordinate with Spoken Tutorial team, IIT Bombay to roll-out and introduce the project into all degree colleges in the state.
- Put up the signed agreement note on the CCE website along with Spoken Tutorial site link and Telangana training manager Ms. Swati Dongardive's contact details and issue notifications to all the Principals of Government Degree Colleges to make the Payment through NEFT, introduce and roll-out the Spoken Tutorial based software training in colleges.
- Conduct a Master training program for a faculty member in each GDC through Faculty Development Training Program for running Software training SELF learning way in their respective Colleges as one of the initiatives under capacity building.
- Offer General IT Skills package in Telugu also.
- Issue circular to all the GDCs to introduce and roll-out the Spoken Tutorial based software training in the GDCs.
- Have a monitoring system on department's website ccets.cgg.gov.in to track the progress made by the different colleges, suggest bi-monthly reports from colleges to CCE and ST, IIT Bombay.

The Spoken Tutorial Project, IIT Bombay shall-


- Work as a mentor for the GDCs in the Telangana State.
- Support the training and execution by CCE by providing manuals and continuous guidance at the unit level that is the Government Degree College.
- Nominate a Representative who will work with the Faculty Development Training Program in CCE.


- Provide guidance and learning path for progressively higher levels of learning through advanced courses.
- Provide the knowhow and course content material that includes CDs/DVDs, online material, instruction sheets and any other training material related to the GDCs.
- Issues Completion Certificates, who undergo training and qualifies the Online assessment test
- Participation Certificates shall be issued to the students who undergo the training and do not take the online test.
- Provide the promotional materials like posters, brochures, leaflets, banners etc. to the CCETS and the GDCs in TS.

General

- This agreement is for a duration of one year from the date of signing and can be renewed and modified from time to time if necessary, based on mutual consent.
- IIT Bombay-ST permits the colleges with less than 100 number of students to learn along with nearby college students and will not expect the User Fee of Rs.25000/college/year.
- The interpretation of any clause will rest with CCE TS.

As FIRST PARTY

And

- Organise Inter College and Interstate competitions which provide a platform to the students to showcase their abilities.
- Organise Faculty Development Programmes to the nominated faculty who will be overseeing the said project in their respective colleges.
- Organise webinars on topics related to "Employability Trends in specific subject areas" in association with international universities.
- Organise international summit titled "Global Education and Careers Summit, consisting of panel discussions, Familiarisation trips and other suitable engagements for heads of educational institutions to engage with international educators.

- Organise events for students to meet International educators which will help them explore higher education opportunities.
- Provide promotional materials where ever necessary.
- Issue appropriate certificates to the participants.

Raj Iyer, Chief Youth Employment Officer, through its authorized signatory (hereinafter referred to as "Naandi" which expression shall mean and include its heirs, successors, executors, administrators, authorized representatives and permitted assigns) as SECOND PARTY.

(Both Parties are hereinafter jointly referred to as "Parties" and individually as a "Party")

Introduction

WHEREAS CCETS is a non-profit organization created by Government of Telangana to promote education, giving special attention to the areas located in backward and rural areas. It aims to strengthen education at undergraduate and post graduate level especially for women and underprivileged sections of the society.

WHEREAS Naandi Foundation is an apolitical, autonomous Public Charitable Trust and a not for profit organisation having registration under section 12AA of income tax act, 1961 is tax exempt and is recognised by tax authorities as an organisation established for 'charitable purpose'

WHEREAS Naandi is working with an objective of people centred development through its charitable activities in whole of India, without distinction of caste, creed or religion, etc

WHEREAS Naandi engaged, inter alia, in improving the livelihoods of the underprivileged communities through its various social initiatives, developmental programs, in various states of India. Naandi's activities include, education to underprivileged children with a specific focus on girl child education, improving livelihoods of small and marginal farmers through its farming practices, employable training and skill development programs to underprivileged youth, provision of safe drinking water to communities, etc

WHEREAS Naandi, in furtherance of its objectives and as a part of its skill development program to underprivileged youth, wish to build and enhance the employability skill set of the underprivileged youth/students in colleges under the **Commissionerate of Collegiate Education in the State of Telangana**.

WHEREAS the **Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, in the State of Telangana**, is desirous of engaging in employability skill building program of the underprivileged youth/students in Government Degree Colleges at undergraduate and post-graduate levels, in the State of Telangana.

WHEREAS both the parties having recognised each other's intention of supporting the underprivileged youth / students, studying in Government Degree colleges in the State of Telangana have decided to work together in the space of employability skill development initiative.

WHEREAS both the parties have decided to reduce the mutually agreed terms and conditions into writing

NOW IT IS HEREBY AGREED BY AND BETWEEN THE PARTIES HERETO AS UNDER:

I: The employability skill development program (MPC)

- 1.1 The program shall be carried out in Government Degree and PG Colleges, in the State of Telangana. A list of such colleges/institutes is given in Annexure - I enclosed herewith which is a part of this MOU.
- 1.2 The beneficiaries/students shall be the underprivileged students studying in the final semester under this program in Government Degree and PG Colleges, in the State of Telangana.
- 1.3 The skilling program shall be for a duration of 40 hours or as the case may be decided mutually by the parties.
- 1.4 The program shall include Soft-Skills, Communication Skills, Life Skill and Interview preparations for the beneficiaries under employability skill development program. The

beneficiaries may be trained in any other skill set, as mutually decided by both the parties, that improves their employable skill and livelihoods.

- 1.5 The first party or the respective college/institute/university shall select the beneficiaries/students for the said program.

II: Obligations of the First Party

- 1.1 Ensure that the necessary infrastructure like well-equipped class rooms are made available where the program shall be implemented.
- 1.2. Ensure that each of the selected colleges/ Institutes identify one resource person from their faculty to co-ordinate between the beneficiaries/students, the Institute management and the second party. Contact details of such identified resources shall be with the rest of the team.

III: Activities of the Second Party (Naandi):

- 1.1. Prepare content that will be most effective in training the beneficiaries/students.
- 1.2 Provide the first party a detailed Course Schedule containing curriculum and day wise lesson plans of courses to be conducted
- 1.3 Ensure that well-trained trainers are identified for each Institute to ensure overall success of the Project.
- 1.5 Monitor the program by conducting periodic assessments to ensure that the trainers do a quality job.
- 1.6 At periodic intervals, give a narrative report to the first party with the challenges met, opinion about the program, suggestions for improvement and feedback from the trainees. Similarly, parameter-based impact evaluation report shall be prepared by second party and submitted to first party periodically on completion of trainings for all students. A consolidated impact report shall be submitted on evaluating impact at project intervention level.

IV. TERM:

The MoU will be effective for a period of twelve months from the date of signing. The MOU may be extended on mutually agreed terms for a further period of one year or for such other period as mutually agreed by parties.

V. Free of Cost:

The Program is free of cost. Naandi shall not charge any fees on whatsoever account/name either from the students or the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education - Telangana or its affiliated institutions, for conducting the aforesaid program.

VI. Certification:

Certificates shall be awarded by Naandi to the students on successful completion of the training and clearing of the assessment held post completion of the program.

VII. General Terms

Amendments to the MoU:

No amendment or modification of this MoU shall be valid, unless the same is made in writing by both the parties or their authorized representatives and specifically stating the same to be an amendment of this MoU. The modifications/changes shall be effective from the date on which they are made/ executed, unless otherwise agreed to.

Compliance with laws, statutes, rules and regulations of Government / local authority:

Both the parties shall comply with all laws, statutes and rules & regulations of Central and State Governments or Local authorities that may be applicable from time to time as required under this MoU.

Termination:

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana State, shall have the right to terminate the MoU, in case if the Naandi fails to fulfil their obligations as mentioned in the MoU, or violates any of the clause mentioned in the MoU.

Assignment :

Naandi shall not be entitled to assign any of its rights, benefits or obligations under this MoU without written consent of the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana State.

Relationship:

Nothing contained in this MoU will be construed as creating any agency, partnership, joint enterprise or other similar relationship between the parties. Neither party will have authority to contract for or



