E. Comprehension Passage (Seen)

The Right to Information Act is known as RTI. It is a revolutionary Act of the Parliament of India to make data available for Indian citizens in order to ensure transparency in governance. It is a substitute for the recent Freedom of Information Act, 2002. RTI can be called a 'Gateway to the citizens' for the quick search of information. Under the provisions of the Act, any citizen of India may demand information from a 'Public Authority', which is required to be answered inside 30 days. The Act likewise requires each public authority to preserve records for wide distribution and to proactively ascertain classifications of data. This law was passed by the Parliament on 15 June 2005. It came completely into power on 12 October 2005. More than 3.2 crore RTI applications have been documented since then. Aruna Roy is the leader of the Right to Information Movement. It is a legal right for all Indian citizens. The essential object of the Right to Information Act is to empower the citizens and bring transparency in to the workings of the Government.

All government organizations, regardless of whether they are under a state government or the Centre, fall under the purview of the Act. Twenty-odd organizations are clearly exempted from the RTI such as RAW, BSF, CRPE, CISE, the Intelligence Bureau, National Security Guard, etc. Each government organisation is expected to choose one representative as a Public Information Officer (PIO). It is the responsibility of the PIO to provide the information to the applicant within 30 days. Neglecting to do so mean a financial fine can be forced on the PIO. People who want information through RTI need to use a court fee stamp of Rs 10. Those who come under the 'Below Poverty Line' (BPL) classification need not pay this fee for filing an RTI, but all who want to receive copies of records from government offices will need to pay Rs 2 per page.

Bonalu Festival

The festival of Bonalu has become one of the official Hindu festivals of newly formed Telangana State. This is mainly celebrated in the twin cities of Hyderabad, Secunderabad and also in some parts of the state. The Goddess Mahankali and various incarnations of Shakti as, Mysamma, Muthyalamma, Pochamma, Yellamma and Peddamma are worshipped in this festival on a great scale. This is observed generally on the Sundays in Ashada Masam, in the months of July or August every year. The name Bonam itself is derived from the word Bojanam that means meal or food offered to the Goddess.

The devotees prepare rice cooked with the milk and jaggery in a new brass or earthen pot. It is adorned with the neem leaves and lighted lamp on the top of it. They make a procession to the temple by carrying the pots on their heads along with a new sari, bangles, turmeric and vermilion to offer Bonalu to the Mother Goddess.

It is believed that the festival is celebrated to ward off the diseases and usher in good health, peace and prosperity. This festival is supposed to have begun in 1869 when plague broke out in the twin cities. Then the people wanted to appease Mother Goddess whose anger was considered to be the cause for the epidemic. This is specially celebrated in Ujjain Mahankali Mandir, Lal Darwaza, Secunderabad for three days with great pomp and gaiety. The festival concludes with the immersion of Ghatam on the third and final day whereas the second day is celebrated as Rangam.

The women of Telangana celebrate the floral festival of Bathukamma, which begins on Mahalaya Amavasya of the Hindu calendar, with great enthusiasm. It is celebrated for nine days in Ashwayuja masam. The word means "Mother Goddess come alive". Recognising its cultural significance, the Telangana government has celebrated it as a state festival since 2014. The festival is performed over nine days, the first of which is called Engili pula Bathukamma and the last, Saddula Bathukamma. On the last day, women make small bathukammas which are flowers arranged in seven layers in a conical shape on a wide plate. Flowers like banthi, chamanthi, gummadi, tangedu, gunugu are used. They are placed in the courtyards and folk songs are sung around these floral arrangements, accompanied by clapping and playing. Towards dusk, the Bathukammas are carried by the women on their heads to water bodies and immersed in them. They then distribute maleeda, a dessert made with sugar or jaggery and rice flour. Celebrated near the end of the monsoon season, this festival expresses gratitude for the gifts of nature.
