TELANGNA UNIVERSITY UG COURSES

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM RULES & REGULATIONS

These Regulations shall be called Telangana University regulations governing Undergraduate Programmes under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS). The Choice Based Credit System is offered only to the students admitted in Constituent Colleges and Affiliated Colleges to Telangana University from the Academic Year 2019-2020.

These Regulations shall come into force from the Academic Year 2019-2020.

1) DEFINITIONS OF KEY WORDS:

- 1. University: Telangana University, Dichpally, Nizamabad.
- **2. Academic Year:** Two consecutive (one odd + one even) semesters constitute one academic year.
- **3. Semester:** Each semester will consist of 15-18 weeks of academic work equivalent to 90 actual teaching days. The odd semester may be scheduled from July to November and even semester from December to April.
- **4. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):** The CBCS provides choice for students to select from the prescribed courses (core, elective and Foundation Courses)
- **5. Programme:** An educational programme leading to award of a Degree or certificate.
- **6. Course:** Usually referred to, as 'papers' is a component of a programme. All courses need not carry the same weightage. The courses should define learning objectives and learning outcomes. A course may be designed to comprise lectures/ tutorials/laboratory work/ field work/ outreach activities/ project work/ vocational training/viva/ seminars/ term papers/assignments/ presentations/ self-study etc. or a combination of some of these.
- 7. **Degree:** Means undergraduate Degree.
- **8. Board of Studies:** Means UG Board of Studies of the University in the discipline/subjects concerned.
- 9. Academic Senate: Means Academic Senate of Telangana University.
- **10. Fee:** Means the fee prescribed by the University for the Undergraduate Programmes from time to time.
- **11. Credit:** A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week.
 - i) 1 Credit= 1 Theory period of one hour duration.
 - ii) 1 Credit= 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration.
 - iii) 1 Credit= 1 Practical period of two hour duration.

- **12. Grade Letter:** is an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course (Paper). It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper. Grade letters are A+,A,B+,B,C+,C,D,F,Ab(Absent).
- 13. Grade Point: It is a numerical weightage allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.
- **14.** Credit Point: It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.
- **15. Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA):** It is a measure of academic performance of student/s in a semester. It is the ratio of total credit points secured by a student in various courses registered in a semester and the total course credits taken during that semester. It shall be expressed up to two decimal places.
- **16.** Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA): It is a measure of overall cumulative performance of a student over all semesters. The CGPA is the ratio of total credit points earned by a student in various courses in all semesters and the sum of the total credits of all courses in all the semesters. It is expressed up to two decimal places.

2) CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS) IN UG COURSES

2.1) Main features of the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS):

- 1. All the UG Departments in the Faculties of Science, Social Sciences, Arts, Commerce and Business Management of the constituent and affiliated colleges of **TU** shall participate in this Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) from the academic year 2019-20.
- 2. In the CBCS system continuous evaluation of the students in all the semesters is done through Internal Assessment Examinations, Assignments, etc..
- 3. Course contents of each UG Programme are designed to meet the ever changing requirements of the industry/job market/needs of society.
- 4. Each paper/course is assigned a specific number of credits and the marks secured by a student are converted into grade points and credit points. The performance of a student in a semester is expressed as Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA) and the combined performance of a student in all the semesters of the UG programme is expressed as Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA).

2.2) CBCS Course Structure:

- 1. UG Courses in the CBCS are offered within the Semester pattern.
- 2. There shall be six semesters in each UG Course. The duration of an Academic year consists of two semesters, each of 15 weeks of teaching.
- 3. The Academic session in each semester will provide 90 teaching days.
- 4. The period of the odd semesters shall be July to November and the even semesters shall be from December to April.
- 5. There shall be six categories of courses/papers in the UG programmes:
 - i. **Core Course:** A course, which should compulsorily be studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.

- ii. **Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course**: Elective courses may be offered by the main discipline/subject of study is referred to as Discipline Specific Elective. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
- iii. **Dissertation/Project**: An elective course designed to acquire special/advanced knowledge, such as supplement study/support study to a project work, and a candidate studies such a course on his own with an advisory support by a teacher/faculty member is called dissertation/project.
- iv. **Generic Elective (GE) Course**: An elective course chosen generally from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure is called a Generic Elective.
 - **P.S.:** A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.
- v. **Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC):** Environmental Science, English Communication/MIL Communication.
- vi. **Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge.
- 6. Each course/paper shall have a character code which indicates
 - i. The Department
 - ii. The Semester
 - iii. The Course No./Paper No.

3) Attendance:

- 1. 75% of attendance is compulsory for all students. A student shall be considered to have satisfied the requirement of attendance for appearing for the semester end examination, if he/she has attended not less than 75% of the number of classes held upto the end of the semester including test and practical's, etc.
- 2. However, there is a provision for condonation of attendance for the students who have attendance between ≥65% and <75% on Medical Grounds on payment of a fee and production of medical certificate.
- 3. If a student represents his/her institution, University, State or Nation in Sports, NCC, NSS or Cultural or any other officially sponsored activities, he/she shall be eligible to claim the attendance for the actual number of days participated subject to a maximum of 20 days in a semester based on the specific recommendations of the Head of the Department and Principal of the College concerned.
- 4. A Student who does not satisfy the requirements of attendance shall not be permitted to take internal assessment as well as the Semester examinations.

4) Medium of Instruction:

The medium of instruction shall be English/Telugu/Urdu.

5) Award of Grades, SGPA, CGPA:

Credits, Grade Letter, Grade Points and Credit Points

- **1. Credit:** A unit by which the course work is measured. It determines the number of hours of instructions required per week.
 - i) 1 Credit= 1 Theory period of one hour duration.
 - ii) 1 Credit= 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration.
 - iii) 1 Credit= 1 Practical period of two hour duration.

- **2. Grade Letter:** is an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course (Paper). It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper. Grade letters are A+, A, B+, B, C+,C, D, F(Fail), Ab (Absent).
- **3. Grade Point:** It is a numerical weightage allotted to each letter grade on a 10-point scale.
- **4.** Credit Point: It is the product of grade point and number of credits for a course.

SGPA(S_i)= \sum (C_i X G_i)/ \sum C_i Ci⇒No.of Credits in the ith Course. Gi⇒Grade Point Scored by the student in the ith Course.

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA):

Credit Points for the paper = No. of Credits assigned for the paper X Grade Point secured for that course/Paper.

SGPA indicates the performance of a student in a given Semester. SGPA is based on the total **credit points** earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum (Letter Grade Points)X(Credits)}{\sum (Credits)}$$

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum (SGPA)X(Credits)}{\sum (Total Credits)}$$

Note: SGPA is computed only if the candidate passes in all the papers (gets a minimum 'D' grade in all the papers).
