
The group discussion revealed the following points -

- ⇒ more private players.

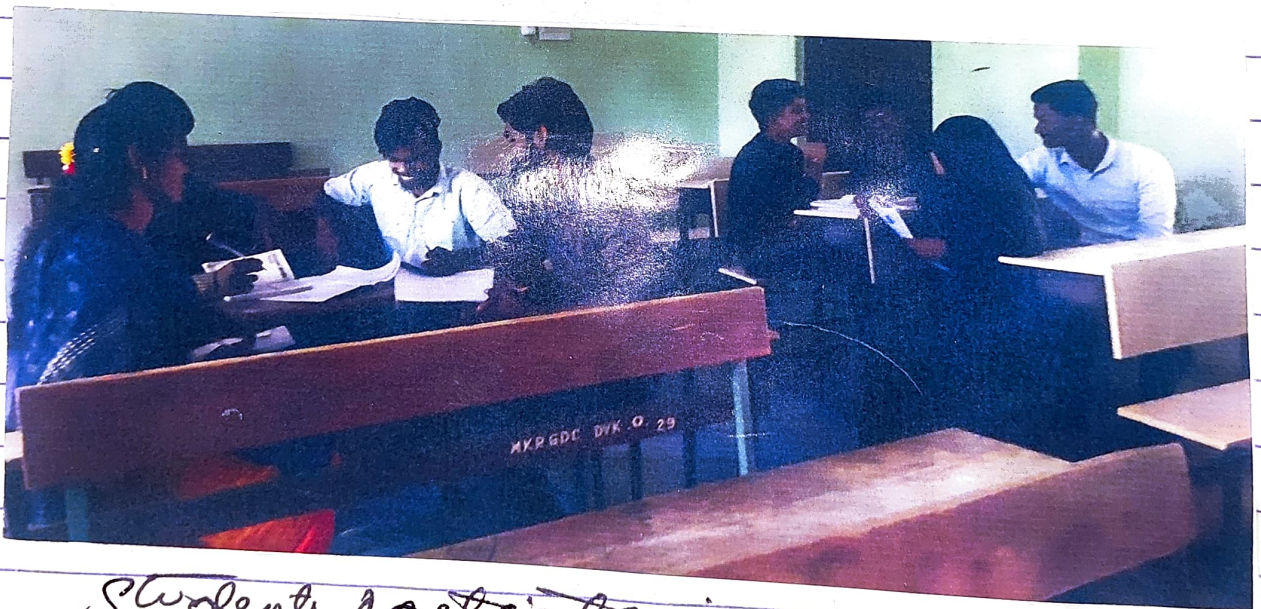
conclusion:

⇒ The rights of the consumer are


- ① right to safety

⇒ The consumer complaint should be filed within two years of purchasing the product.

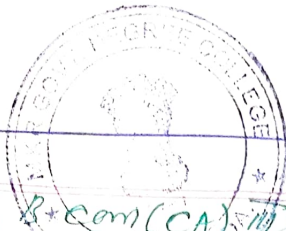
→ A complaint shall be instituted in a district forum within the local limits of whose jurisdiction the opposite party is.

≠ Environmental law works to protect land, air, water, and soil.

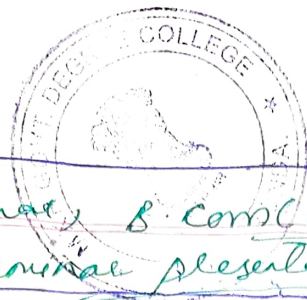




