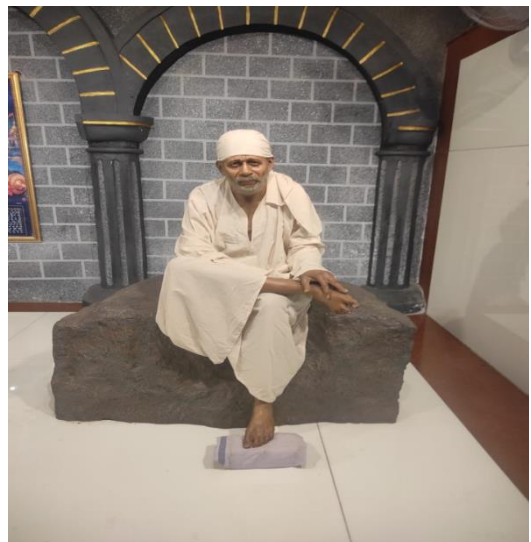
BRIEF OVERVIEW ABOUT THE TEMPLE

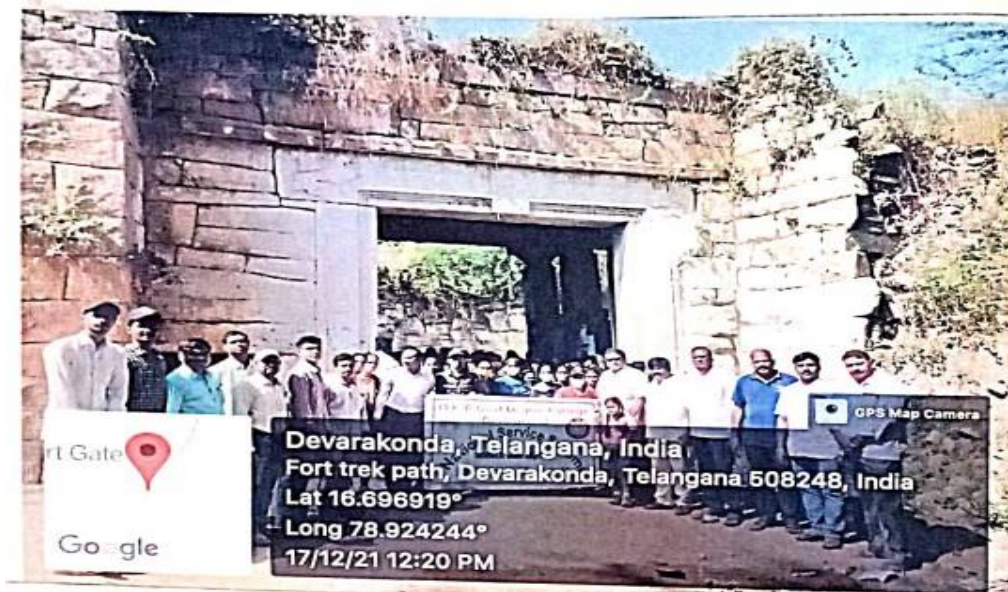

Brief history of Devarakonda fort:

Devarakonda Fort is located in Devarakonda town, Nalgonda district, Telangana state. The fort is situated on a hill rock surrounded by three hills. This fort, which was of great importance at that time, was built in the 14th century by the Padma nayaka Velama kings. It is said that this fort was built to have an impenetrable stronghold against enemies. In the premises of fort stand the Rama and Shiva temples constructed by Maada Naidu. These temples add a hint of spirituality and purity to the untouched beauty of the Fort.

SUMMARY:

Mandal Center Devarakonda is a small village in Nalgonda District. Devarakonda village is one of the most surprising forts in Telangana. This village attracts many tourists from all over the world. The fort is a high point that reflects the glory of the village.

This fort was built in 13-14th century. Devarakonda Fort is a symbol of wealth established by the kingdom of Padma Nayaka Vemula kings. King Vemula ruled from 1278-1492 AD as Padma leader.
