Waste Management Policy

- ❖ The waste material generated in the college is segregated into solid and liquid.
- ❖ Among these liquid waste, solid waste and other hazardous waste are segregated on daily basis.
- ❖ All the science laboratories have been following standard waste management policies which are specific to their discipline. For instance, the e-waste material is disposed as per the e-waste policy of the college.

- ❖ The recyclable wastes such as leaves are sent to be dumped in the vermi-compost pit.
- ❖ Paper will be used sparingly.
- ❖ Second side of paper shall be used for the purpose of non-statutory documents.
- ❖ The college recognises that for every 3000 papers a tree is cut. So, it shall strive to save whenever required all the primary stake holders will be sensitised about the waste management techniques and its importance.
