### SOCIAL SECTOR IN INDIA-

UNDP report shows that the position of India in the human development is weak. The attempts made in the field of education, health and poverty eradication are not satisfactory. The Central Government is continuously providing funds to state Govt. For the Development of social sector. The expenditure of Central Govt. in the year 2004-05 was Rs. 18240 crores on rural development and social services, and it has increased to Rs. 70910 crores in the year 2012-13. In order to eradicate poverty, the Govt. has launched National Rural employment scheme.

On 12th April 2013 A National health mission was started to provide better health facilities to the poor living in the villages. The expenditure on the health mission was Rs. 6731 cr.
