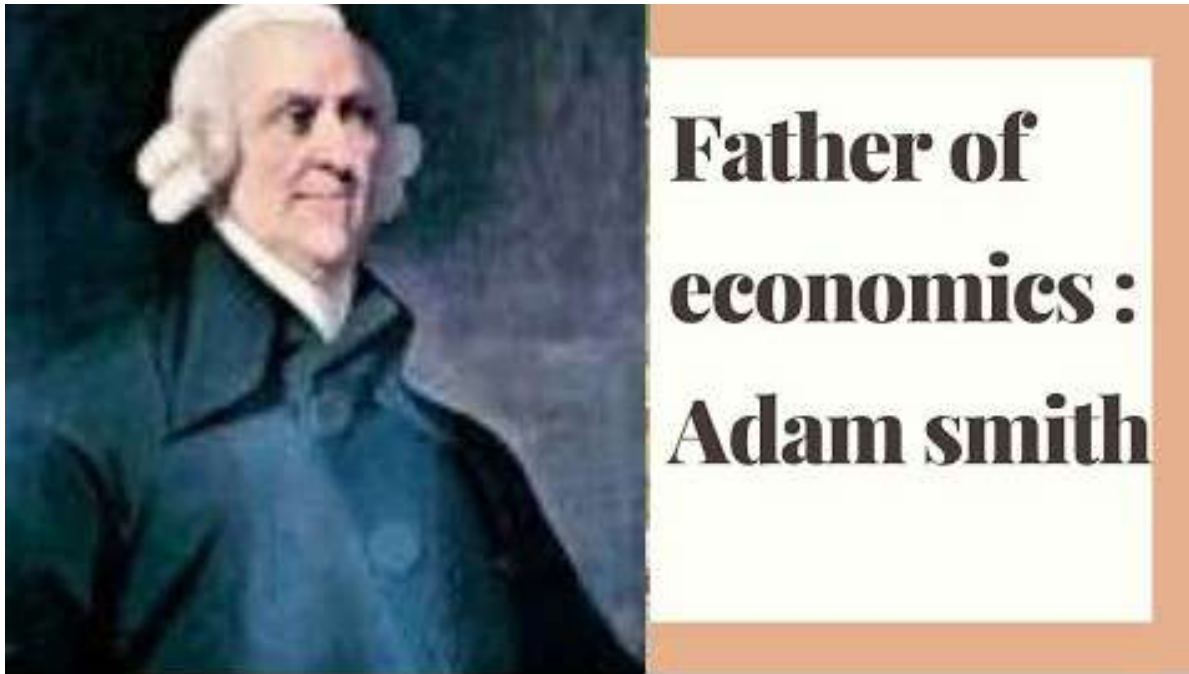

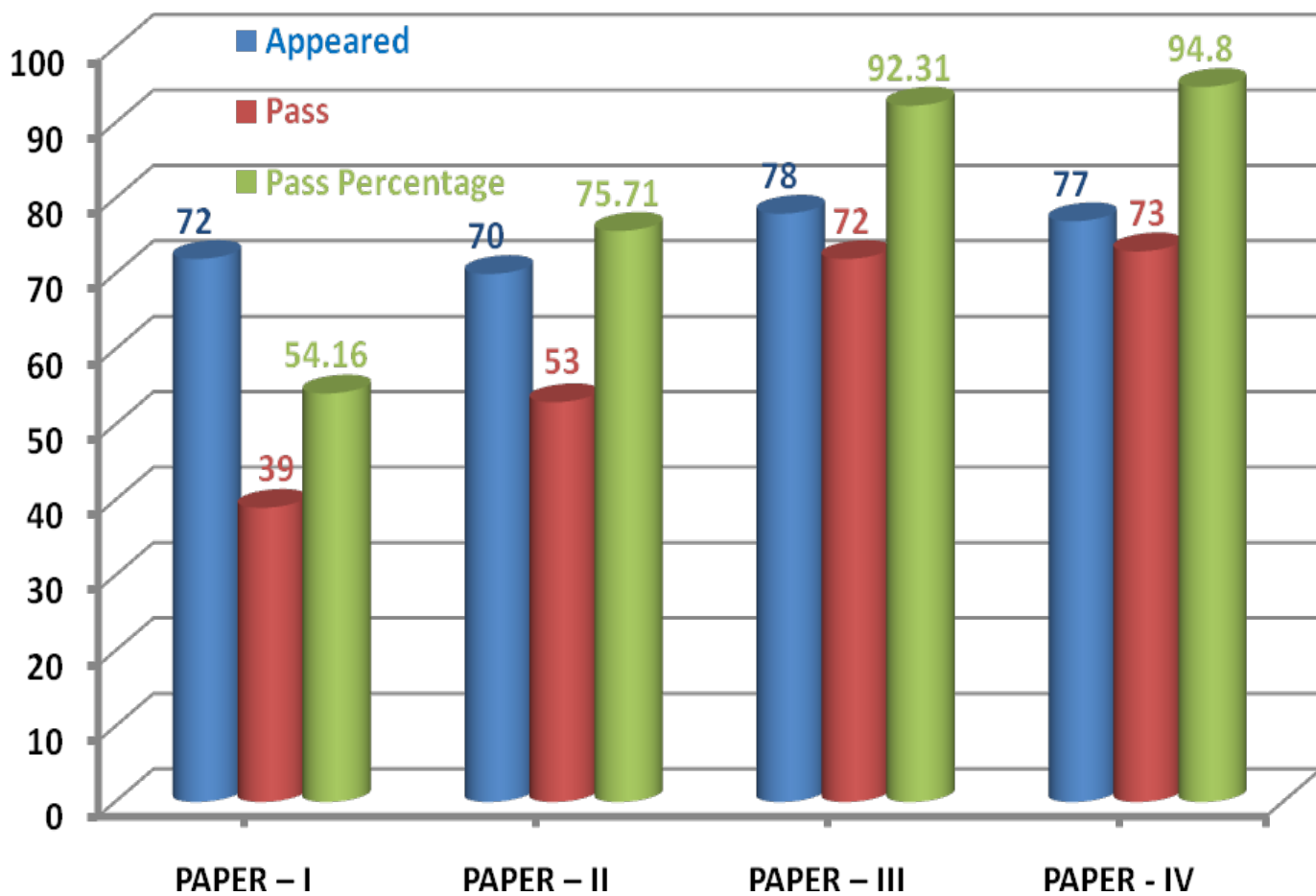

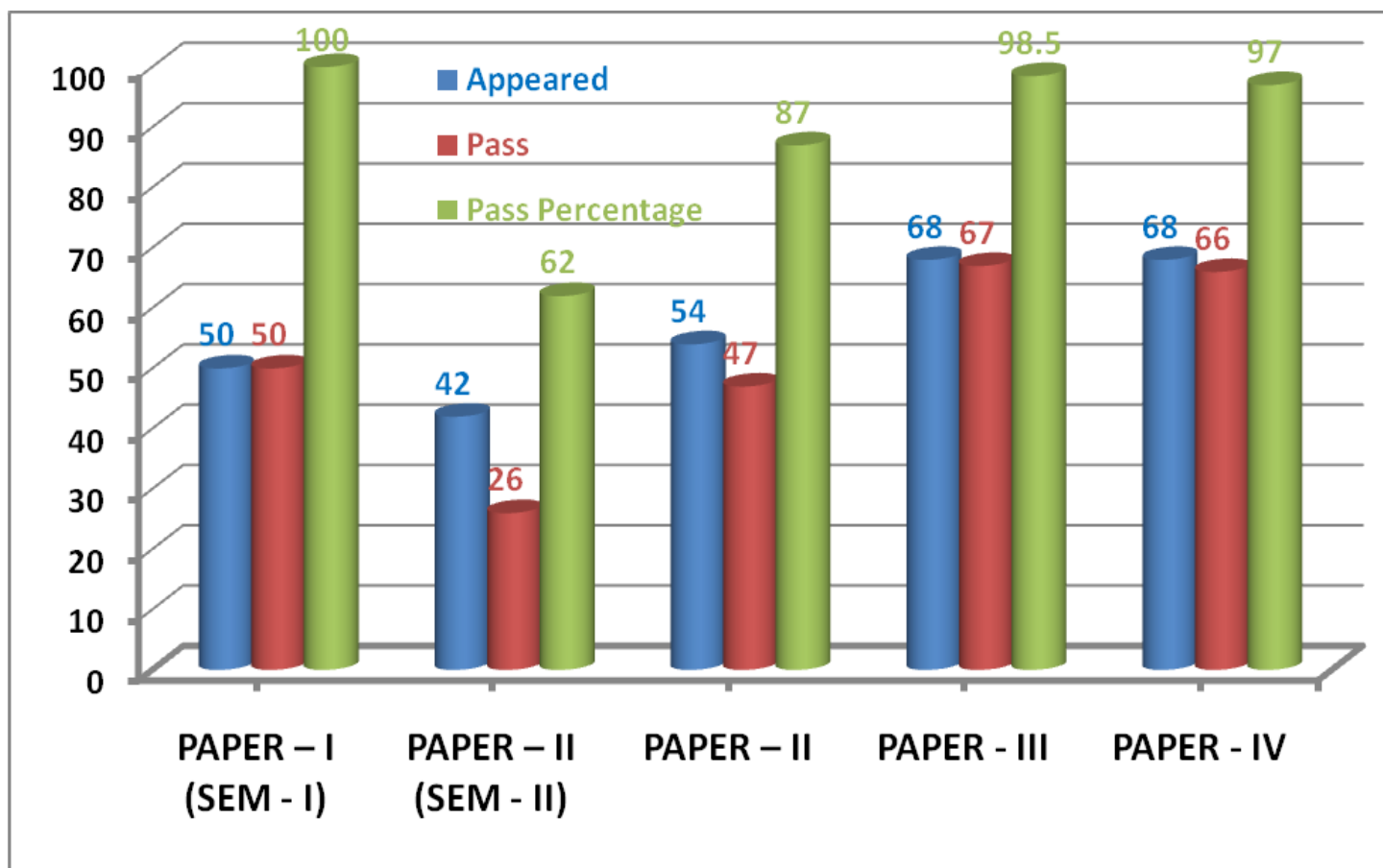
GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION

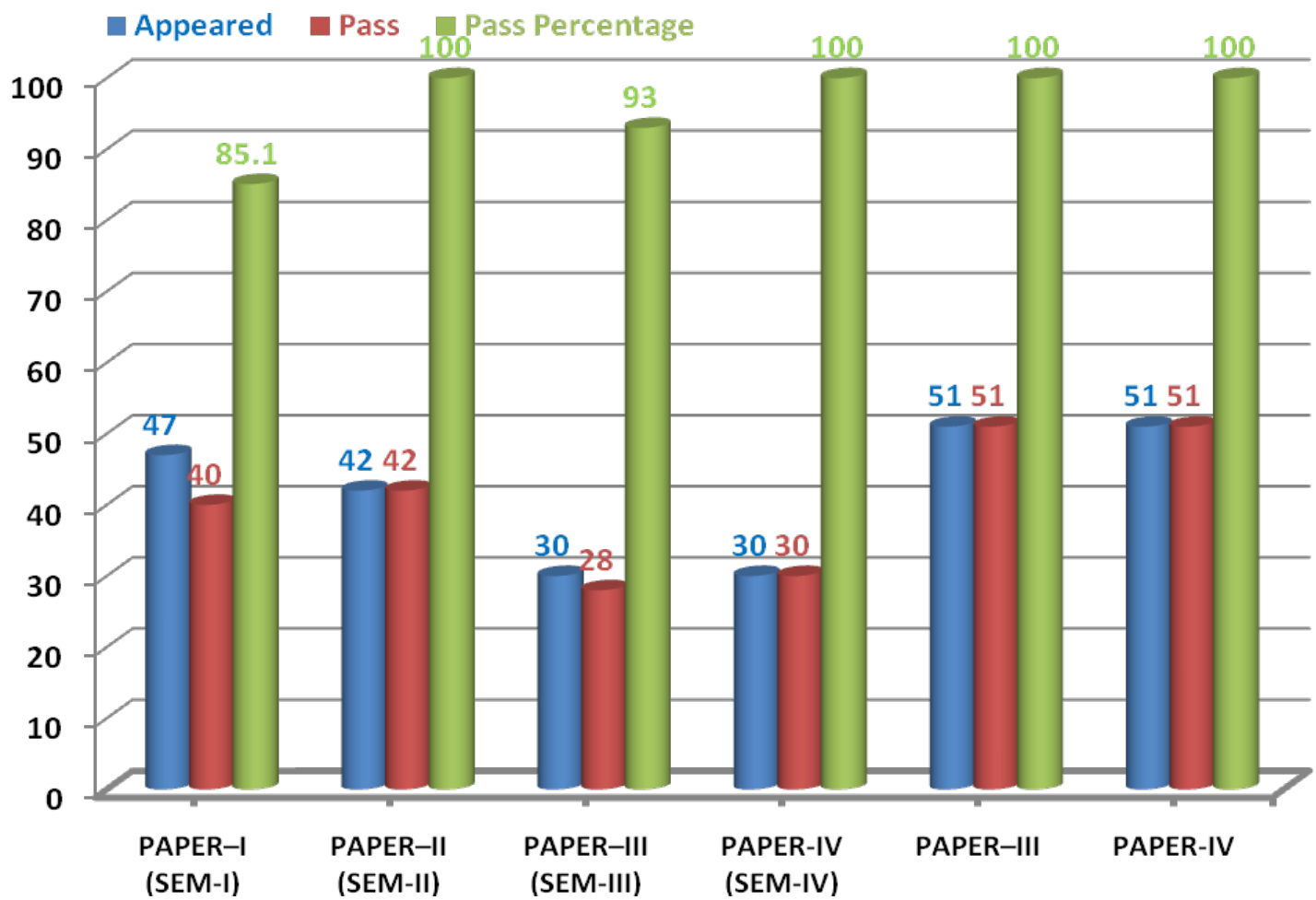
GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION

GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION

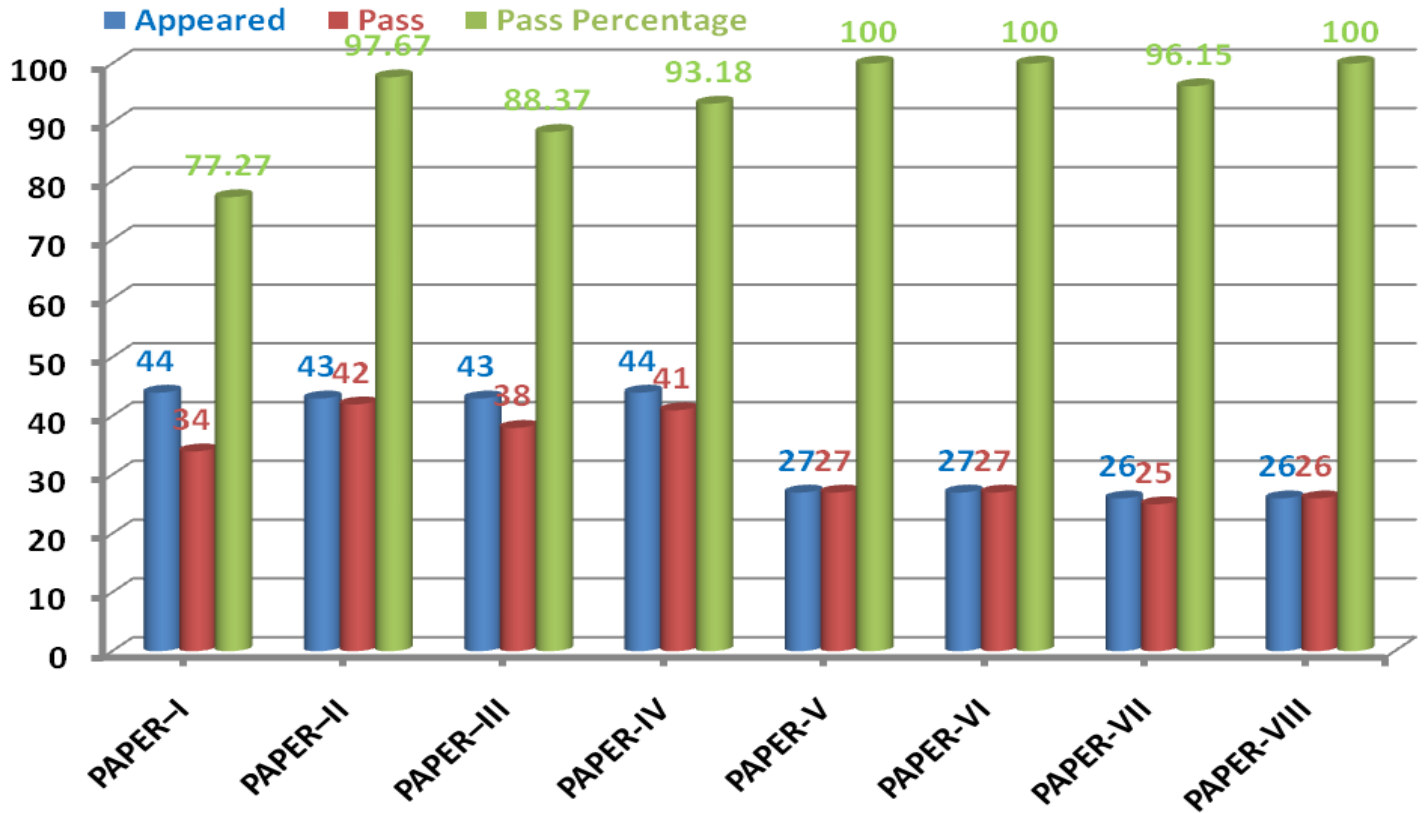

GRAPHICAL REPRESENTATION

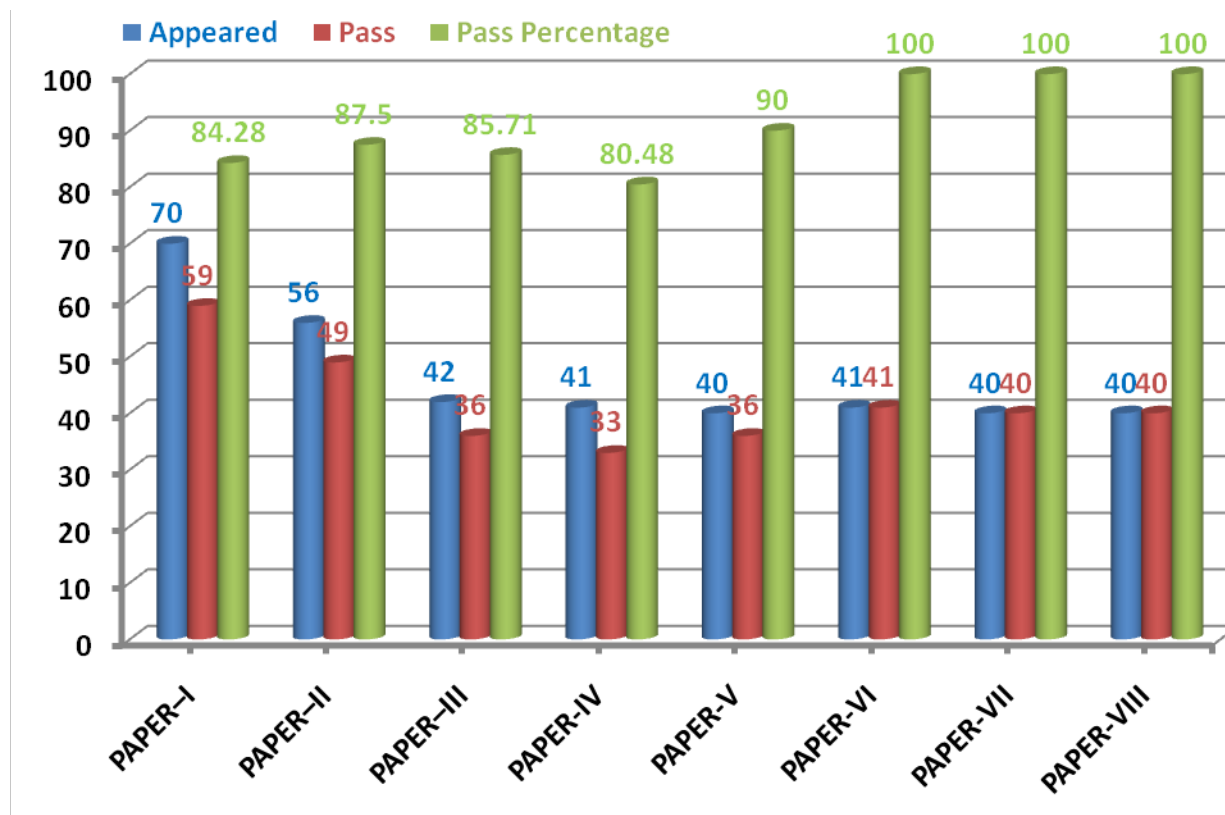

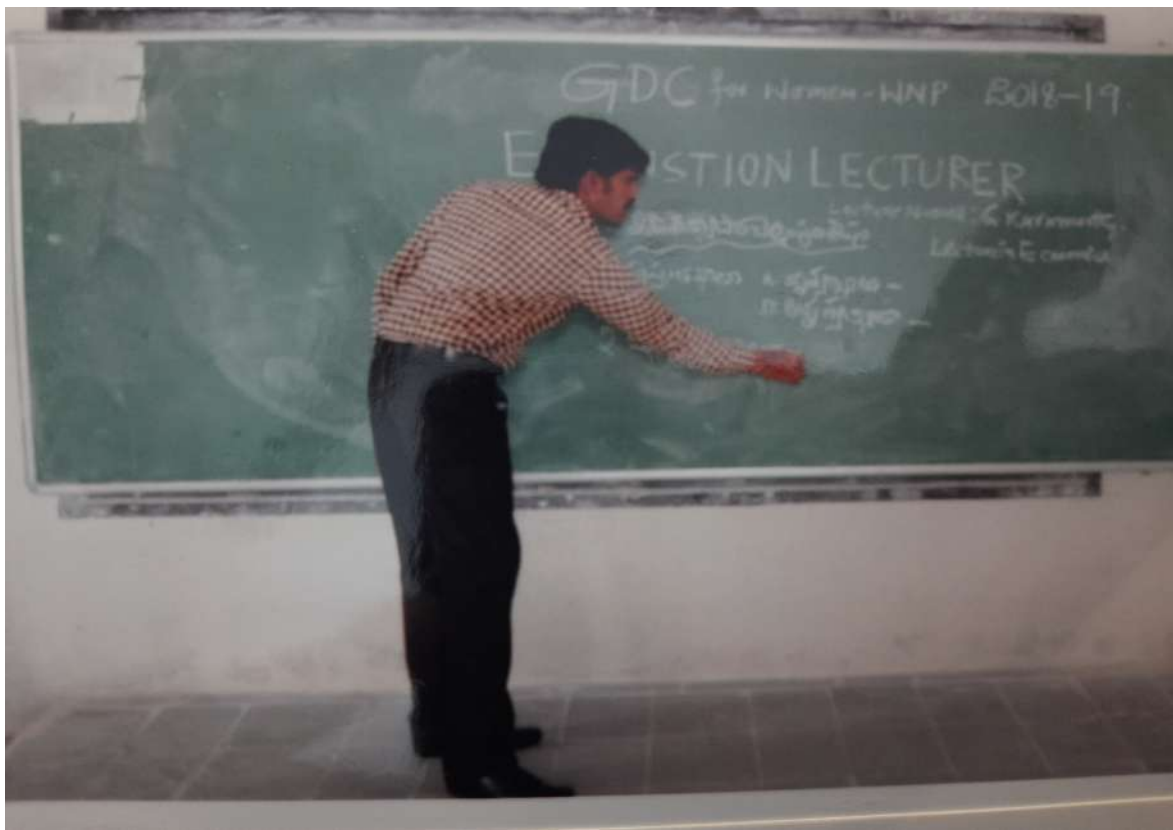

Unique features of department:
