The college is working in line with its vision and mission and objectives. During the last five years, incremental improvements are done. This is reflected in our College Website.

Vriksha Bandhan, is innovative for environmental consciousness, Bar coding of trees in the campus .Extension activities through 3 units of NSS
- Infrastructure & Learning resources : 5 additional rooms, Botanical garden and indoor stadium under construction. Library is partially digitalized. Women’s Hostel, gym are available.
- Student support and progression: Scholarships, epass etc as per norms of Government of Telangana are disbursed. Always motivating girls to take up career, actively participate in sports and literary and cultural activities. A bronze medal in International Kick boxing is received. Alumni Association is formed. Few Alumni are in good positions at Zilla Parishad, Group I level , teachers etc and in private sector.
- Governance, Leadership and Management: eoffice, CAIMS, DOST online admission, College Website, Satavahana University website etc are used for this purpose- good governance, leadership and management. Non teaching are upgraded with inhouse training in ICT tools.
- Institutional Values and Best Practices: Door to Door Admission campaign, competitive examination coaching, Vriksha bandhan , code of conduct, ID cards, CC cameras, Eco friendly Ganesha, Vehicles, Plastic preventing campus, are all inculcated.

Construction of Five additional rooms - This year, 5 new additional classrooms.

Lockdown Period - As per the directives of the Satavahana University, Work from home guidelines were issued from mid March. Accordingly, the teachers have been engaging in various academic pursuits and the details were being conveyed to the college authorities on a regular basis. Teachers also attended and participated in many Webinars and Faculty Development programs during this period. Webinars were also organized by our teachers for the benefit of our students and the teaching community.

The members of the IQAC have been discussing and working on the IQAC report for the academic year 2020-21, before and after the lockdown period. From January 2020, several meetings were held with the Principal where each criterion was discussed. The staff members had online meetings like Zoom meetings and offline meetings in college, where each criterion was taken up for discussion every day, after the presentations by the concerned criteria incharges. The road map for the Second cycle of NAAC was shared by each member, which resulted in very engaging and

fruitful discussions. This was also an opportunity for teachers to get acquainted with new teaching methods using technology.

Through the NSS and Committees, several videos were recorded; online quizzes etc were organized using online technology, where teachers encouraged the students to use their time and talent effectively. During the Lockdown period, teachers could complete a considerable amount of their syllabus by engaging the students in online lectures using Zoom and other technology.

Several webinars on a variety of important topics were organized from May 2020 to June 2021 which was greatly appreciated by all the participants.

Our College organized the online certificate courses for the UG and PG students of our college for duration of 30 days.

The Vision 2022 Document of our college for the year 2022 was presented before our CPDC. Our faculty members contributed their ideas towards this presentation.

The College organized a session for all the faculty to use the Google Classroom platform for teaching and learning.

The Department of Commerce in association with IQAC had organized an International webinar had participants from all parts of the country and even foreign countries to make the event truly international.

Just as Rome was not built in a day, the journey to progress and quality improvement of an institution is a slow and steady process. Every benchmark and milestone achieved is the fruit of the labor of the College administration and many stakeholders and the team effort that is put in.
