FIELD TRIP – REPORT

Date: 24-03-2017

Place: Udaya Samudram, Pangal.

“Field trips are powerful learning experiences but it is easy for them to pass quickly. Maximizing the learning requires thoughtful work done before and after the trip”.

Objectives:

- Students will examine variety of Zooplanktons and Aquatic animals
- To familiarize the students with Aquaculture
- To know how to collect water samples for physic chemical analysis
- To know how to collect zooplanktons

It was a bright sunny morning of 24th March 2017 Friday. We arrived at Department of Zoology, Govt Degree College for women, Nalgonda at about 10 am. Then our teachers instructed us to assemble in front of Zoology Department. There are 61 students and one teacher guide. During the assembly we are instructed about the journey does and don't and the purpose of the trip etc.

We reached the gate of the reservoir at 10:30 am. Then we talk to the gate keeper and showed reliable documents who allowed us to see the reservoir. Students were done different activities according to the group. Some of us are collecting aquatic insects and some are collecting water samples and zooplanktons while some are taking photographs.

Panagal tank, or Udaya Samudhram as it is called today, is one of the oldest reservoirs in Telangana. It was built by a ruler of the Kakatiya dynasty as an important religious place in this era. With time, it has seen much change — the reservoir's capacity was increased from the original 0.5 tmcft to 15 tmcft. The reservoir continues to supply drinking water to Nalgonda Municipality and 512 villages and irrigation water to an ayacut of 2,000 acres.

We also visited **Panagal Archaeological Museum** located in Panagal village in Nalgonda district, Telangana, India. It is located in the premises of Pachala Someswara temple. It is also close to the Chaya Someswara temple at a distance of 1.3 km to the west of the temple.

The museum was established in February 1982.^[3] The total area of the museum complex is nearly 3 acres. It has a collection of around 640 art objects and antiquities - sculptures, prehistoric tools, coins, bronzes, beads, arms and weapons, and copper plate inscriptions. Some objects are displayed in its open-air gallery while most items are located inside its building.
