### **CRITERION I - CURRICULAR ASPECTS**

#### 1.1 - Curriculum Planning and Implementation

1.1.1 - Institution has the mechanism for well planned curriculum delivery and documentation. Explain in 500 words

Govt. Degree College, Narsampet was established in 1984 to cater the higher education needs of the students of Narsampet. The College has the following mechanism for the effective delivery of the curriculum through a well-planned and documented process: 1. All the courses offered by the College are based on Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) pattern. 2. The College is affiliated to Kakatiya University, Warangal and the Syllabus is prescribed by the University which is in accordance with the UGC guidelines is being followed and completed as per the almanac prescribed by the University. 3. As per the syllabus prescribed by the University each optional subject has 60 to 90 hours per semester including 30 hours for practical classes in the subjects wherever required. 4. In addition to the above hours for the main subjects 30 hour Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses for first two semesters, 30 hour Skill Enhancement Courses for the remaining four semesters and 30 hour Generic Electives for the last two semesters are part of UG curriculum as prescribed by the University. 5. In addition to the prescribed syllabus, employable and life skills are also imparted to the students through various on campus and off campus training programs by TSKC. 6. Games and Sports are regular activity in the college for the overall development of the students. 7. Well-designed Time-Table is prepared at the College level as well as the department levels and is followed scrupulously to achieve the objective of effective delivery of the curriculum in each semester. 8.All the Faculty members prepare semester

plans & teaching plans before the commencement of each semester and are reviewed every month to see that the teaching process is going on as per the schedule 9. Various Teaching Methods such as lecture method, seminar method, Group discussion, student seminar, Group presentation, practical methods, field trips are used for the effective delivery of the curriculum. 10. T SAT live classes and ICT are used in all the departments. 11. The days of National and international importance are celebrated to inculcate moral and ethical values among the students 12. Periodic reviews and meetings are conducted at the department level, as well as the college level on the implementation of semester plans. 13. Two internal examinations in each semester are conducted as per the University almanac and the performance of the students is assessed and the marks are posted on the University website. 14. Students are categorised into quick learners, average learners, and slow learners, and special attention and extra coaching is given for the required students in each semester 15. Remedial coaching is conducted for the students who could not clear the examination in the first attempt, and utmost care is taken to see that such students clear the examination in the very next attempt. 16. End semester examinations are conducted by the University and student wise results of the examinations are recorded by all the departments. 17. The aspirations, interests and future goals of the students are fulfilled through the "Mentor-Mentee" system.

2.5.2 - Reforms initiated on Continuous Internal Evaluation(CIE) system at the institutional level (250 words)

Continuous Internal Evaluation is an important aspect in the process of studying a course. It will help the students know their status of the learning process. Evaluation of the students can be done in various ways. It can partially be done in the classrooms at the end of the sessions or the following day. Assignments, brainstorming, and elicitation are some of the best ways of knowing their level of understanding of the subject. Conduct of Internal assessment, Pre-final Examinations will prepare the students for end examinations. CIE will help them have a clear picture of their performance levels. Evaluation is also done in the form of seminars, and their performance in the subject-oriented quiz programmes, group discussions, Assignments, etc.

2.5.3 - Academic calendar prepared and adhered for conduct of Examination and other related matters (250 words)

An Almanac of academic calendar is prepared by Kakatiya University and supplied to all the affiliated colleges. Each college follows the same schedule. The coverage of syllabus, conduct of internal examinations, are conducted as per the Alamanac of the Univeristy schedule. However, the college adopts co-curricular activities such as quiz programmes, student seminars, workshops, assignments, internal exams, and pre-final exams for further process of effective teaching and learning. The semester-end examinations are conducted by the Kakatiya University, Warangal with jumbling examination Centers to avoid malpractices and fair conduct of examinations. Each centre is allotted a Chief Superintendent and an observer. The duty of the observer is to see to the smooth conduct of the examinations. He will submit a report on the mode of conduct of the examinations at the centre to the Controller of Examinations. Further, the Flying Squad teams check the mode of conduct of Examinations by the colleges concerned and they book the candidates who are involved in Malpractice.

Government Degree College Narsampet is situated at Vallabhnagar in Narsampet town. It is near to Ambedkar Chowk of Narsampet town and it is on the way to Muluqu. It has Academic and Physical facilities with a total campus area of about 18 acres of land and it has mango groves and running track, Volleyball, kabaddi courts. The college comprises 9 class rooms among these 3 classrooms are equipped with LCD facilities to teach the students with ICT tools. There are five Science laboratories besides English Language Lab (ELL). It also has one each of the Principal room, Vice-principal room, UGC room, Examination and office room. There are two rooms meant for departments of English and Arts faculty. It also has one seminar Hall and Office room. In addition to this the college has one library with one digital library and the library is providing reprographic services to the students who are in need of xerox copies for their future reference. The college has a small, beautiful garden. The college is provided with furniture in all classrooms. The library consists of 13,700 books, reference books, 5094. The college is upgraded technologically (with bandwidth 100 MBPS) with 96 computers, 5 computer labs such as computer lab, Digital library, TSKC lab and English language lab with internet hence 04 browsing centres and in 02 various departments. We are providing Library services constantly to all the students by issuing textbooks and reference books. The teachers of the college are regularly attending seminars, workshops. They are writing articles in their domain. These activities have a positive impact on the teaching-learning process. The following committees are functioning under the supervision and suggestions of the IQAC committee. Lab, Library purchase committee, Furniture committee, science laboratory committees. The above committees take part in the college budget distribution and utilization towards academic and physical facilities of the institution. At the end of the academic year, academic audit committees are constituted by

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the Principal and they verify the stock physically as per the stock Registers of all science laboratories including computer lab TSKC, library, physical education equipment, furniture, audio visuals etc and update the working equipment at the end of every academic year. Curriculum Development	The curriculum is an important aspect with regard to the subjects in each course. The Curriculum of Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) is prepared and supplied to the college by affiliated university, i.e., Kakatiya University, Warangal. It is prepared by the Chairman, BOS of the Department concerned with the involvement of the members. The efficient faculty members of some colleges are also involved in the preparation of the curriculum. The same is approved by the Registrar of the University and circulated to all the affiliated colleges of the university.

The teaching-learning process is mainly student-centric, and the focus is on analytical, critical thinking of the students and to make them creative. Seminars, Group Discussions, Quizzes, Assignments Group presentations, and ICT usage are parts of the regular teaching-learning process in the college. Students actively participated in field trips, extension activities, and awareness rallies to get exposure to the first-hand data of the real world. Library and well-equipped Computer Labs and other science labs enrich the learning experience of the students. Students are also participating in e- content development through T SAT along with faculty.
Examination is aimed at testing the performance of the students on what he/she has learnt across the academic year in the classrooms. The assignments, internal and Pre-final examinations will help the students prepare for the year end examinations well. Continuous evaluation of students is being done through End Semester examinations and practical examinations which are conducted by the affiliating university. In addition to this evaluation is being done though two internal examinations per semester, Assignments, student seminars, Group discussions, Group presentations, quizzes, interactive sessions conducted atcollege level. The performance of the students is also assessed as per the participation in various competitions conducted at the college level and state-level competitions like JIGNASA Student Study projects. Students' performance is also assessed by the mentor-mentee system.
Research is an advanced study of a subject. Students are encouraged to visit the field trips organized by various departments for practical knowledge in the subject concerned. The faculty are encouraged to undertake research work and to attend faculty development programmes, refresher courses, national international conferences. They are permitted necessary on-duty facility.
The library is a temple of learning. A well-equipped library is available to the students during and beyond college hours. The students are motivated tovisit library regularly to inculcatethe habit of reading in them. Thestudents are exposed to PPTs inlaboratories prepared by faculty. They are encouraged to make the best use of the infrastructure facilities available in the college. The college has 05 class rooms with LCD Projectors, 04 class rooms with WiFi/LAN,01 seminar hall with ICT facilities, besides Digital Library with e-books,N-list e-journals with N-list open access and it is automated withSOUL package. Identification cards are issued to the students and faculty. This college is upgraded technologically (with band width50 MBPS

	speed internet connectivity) with 30 computers in English Language Lab, 01 computer lab 01 TSKC Lab, 01 Commerce Lab and 4 Science labs with computers and internet facility.

In addition to the prescribed syllabus, employable and life skills are being imparted through various on campus and off campus training programs by TSKC. 6. Games and Sports are regular activity in the college for the overall development of the students. 7. Well designed Timetable is prepared at the College level as well as the department levels and is followed scrupulously to achieve the objective of effective delivery of the curriculum in each semester. 8. Departmental Timetables are also prepared in all departments allocating different papers to the faculty available in the departments. 9.All the Faculty members prepares semester plans & teaching plans before the commencement of each semester and are reviewed every month to see that the teaching process is going on as per the schedule 10. Various Teaching Methods such as lecture method, seminar method, Group discussion, student seminar, Group presentation, practical methods, field trips are used for the effective delivery of the curriculum. 11

T SAT live classes and ICT are used in all the departments. 12. The days of National and international importance are celebrated to inculcate moral and ethical values among the students 13. Periodical reviews and meetings are conducted at department level as well as the college level on the implementation of semester plans. 14. Two internal examinations in each semester are conducted as per the University Timetable and the performance of the students is assessed and the marks are posted in University website kuonline.co.in. 15. An Almanac of academic calendar is prepared by Kakatiya University and supplied to all the affiliated colleges. Each college follows the same schedule. The coverage of syllabus, conduct of internal examinations are conducted as per the Alamanac of the Univeristy schedule. However, the college adopts the cocurricular activities such as quiz programmes, student seminars, workshops, assignments, internal exams and pre-final exams for further process of effective teaching and learning. The semester end examinations are conducted by the Kakatiya University, Warangal with jumbling examination Centers to avoid malpractices and fair conduct of examinations. Further the Flying Sqad teams check the mode of conduct of Examinations by the colleges concerned and they book the candidates who are involved in Malpractice.

Research indicates that students are more likely to retain theknowledge gained through project based learning than the traditionaltextbook-centred learning. • To invigorate the learning environment in Government Degree Colleges, the Commissionerate of Collegiate Education has initiated Jignasa-Student Study Projects in all Government Degree Colleges. • To motivate and encourage the students and ensure that they participate and work as a group on a study project. Each group shall comprise of 5 to 6 students, a group less than 5members shall be treated as disqualified. Each studentshall be assigned only one project in a specific subject. The Context: The teaching faculty shall be informed to encourage activeparticipation from students, identify a challenging topic, mentorand supervise the progress of the study project till completion.As each research project is unique and each discipline has itsown requirements and limitations, the aculty members shallguide the students to strictly adhere to the prescribed format todocument the research work. This makes the learners get involved in research culture. • The study projects must include key components in the research proposal like: ? A description of the research problem. ? A description of how the research findings will be used and disseminated. A uniform format was incorporated for the study projects asmentioned below: • Title • Statement of the problem or hypothesis • Aims and Objectives • Review of Literature • Research Methodology - which deals with study settings, sampling, study methods (examination or investigation) Data Collection (obtaining primary sources and secondary sources using techniques likequestionnaire, survey, interview, case study etc) • Analysis of Data • Findings Conclusions and Suggestions Evidence of Success • The students have prepared JIGNASA (Student Study Project) in English entitled "The Use of ICT in Learning of English: A Brief Survey".
