About the College:

The college was established in the post independent era in 1956 and was named after Girrajmalji Agarwal, one of the prominent philanthropists who helped in its inception by donations. It was taken over by the Government of Andhra Pradesh in 1959. The college is located in sprawling 29.6 acres of land on the out skirts of Nizamabad city. crucial ones in its successful functioning. It is chaired by John Sukumar with the senior faculty members Dr. I. Gangadhar, Dr. Dandu Swamy, Dr. V. Shyam Kumar and Prathibha are to mention a few. Besides taking up many academic activities, the department organizes an 'English Club of Students' on behalf of which the students publish an English Journal, 'Girraj Gazette'. Apart from offering English at Under Graduate level, the department has also been offering Post Graduation (MA in English) since 1982 with high percentage of students' enrolments and results.

- Boosting the skill of creative (narrative) writing

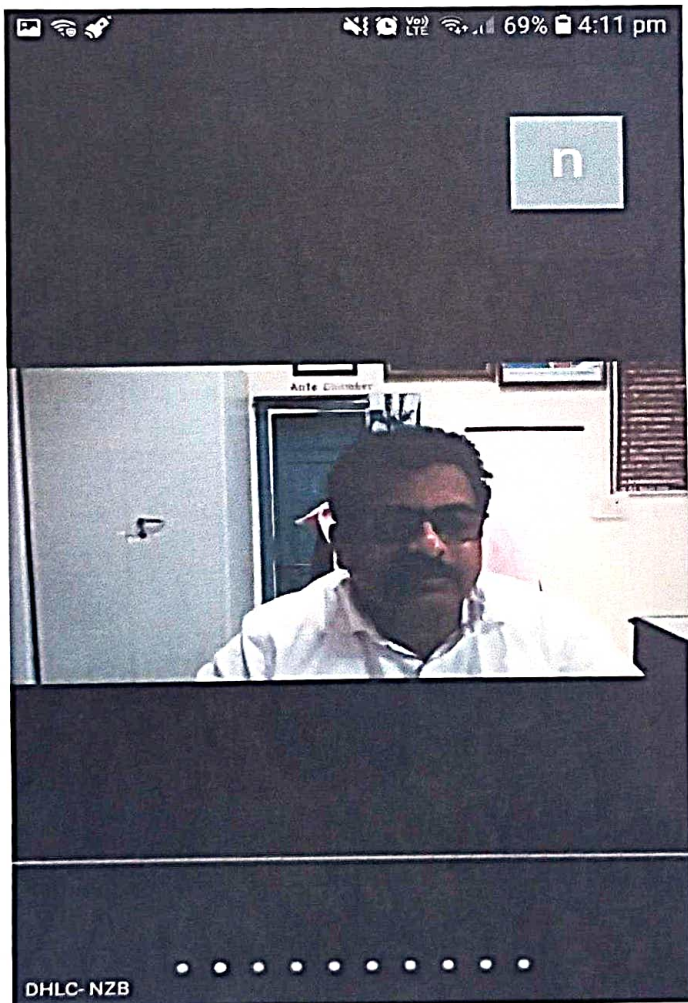
Learning Outcomes:

Gulliver's Travels (1726); A Tale of a Tub (1704)

- ▶ A satire on human nature
- ▶ A parody of the "travellers' tales" literary sub-genre
- ▶ A philosophical novel
- ▶ Almost unique in England
- ▶ A satirical view of the state of European government, and of petty differences between religions
- ▶ Used fantasy as satire to reveal weakness of the society

- ▶ Digressions (flashbacks) as important as main plot; non-linear plot, fragmented narrative.

 - ▶ stream of consciousness
 - ▶ self-reflection
 - ▶ modernist and postmodernist writing

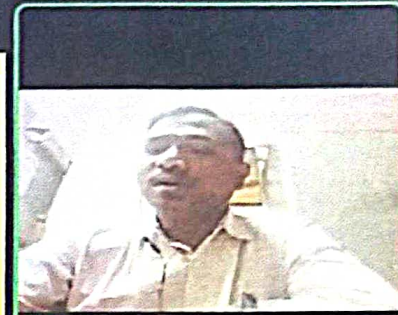

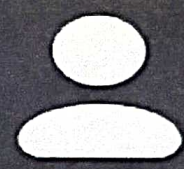
- Pamela (1740)** or *Virtue Rewarded*; **Clarissa**
- ▶ the first example of the **epistolary novel**
 - ▶ the first mature novel to be written in English
 - ▶ Enjoyed its greatest popularity in England and France from the mid-1790s to the end of the century
 - ▶ Plot is advanced by letters or journal entries of one or more characters.
 - ▶ Invented the **Epistolary novel** and **the Sentimental Novel**
 - ▶ Other examples:
 - ▶ Montesquieu in France *Lettres persanes*
 - ▶ Rousseau's *La Nouvelle Héloïse* (1761)
 - ▶ Goethe: *The Sorrows of Young Werther* (1744)



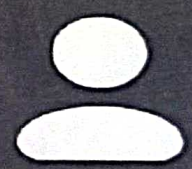


