**Pronoun:** Words used instead of noun. **Ex:** he, she, it, they

**Verb:** All action words are verbs. **Ex:** singing, dancing

**Adverb:** All words which describe verb, adjective or adverb. **Ex:** My dogs eats quickly.

**Adjective:** Words which describes noun. **Ex:** My dogs are big.

**Preposition:** Words which are placed before a noun and links to another. **Ex:** to, at, after

**Conjunctions:** All joining words are conjunctions. **Ex:** and, because

**Interjections:** All expressing words are interjections. **Ex:** oh!, alas!, wow!
