This temple is built in 12-13 AD by Racharla Rudra , a general of Kakatiya king Ganapathi deva . The presiding deity here is Ramalingeswara Swamy . Local legend has it that a sculptor named Ramappa from Karantaka executed the temple for 40 years and hence it was named after him . This is believed to be unique as no were in the world a work is named after Sculptor .

Among the amazing carvings include a flute at the entrance of sanctum sanctorum which when hit make the sound sa-ri-ga-ma. The pillares with in the temple boast of such a fine carvings that one could pass a strand of hire throw. It has 13 such carvings perhaps indicating the 13<sup>th</sup> century when it was constructed. Inside roof above one's head, the sculptors featured epics on Eight sides. A complete story of 'Ksheera sagar madhanam' was carved on one beam and so also on other beams featuring - Dakha samharam , Daksha yagnam , Tripurasura samharam , Gajasura samharam and Narakasura vadha , Gopika vastra paharanam.

Thay used red stand stone for the temple wild black granite was used for carving out amorous statues adorning the temple outside connecting roof and walls . The dancing girls in erotic forms bring out the artistic splendour of those days . The columns were arranged in such a fashion that sun light reflects on the garbhagriha all the time .

One of the striking features of the temple is the statue of Nandi in Nandi Mandapam, facing Lord Shiva's shrine. It is said that unlike the Nandi statues elsewhere in shiva temples, this majestic Nadni statue is in an "attentive" Posture.



#### Academic Year 2016-17: Laknavaram

Laknavaram Lake is a lake located in Govindaraopet mandal in Mulugu district. It is located 17 km from Mulugu and 80km from Warangal, Telangana. The lake is spread over an area of 10,000 acres and holds about 2.135 tmcft of water. It irrigates over 3,500 acres of land. It was built by Kakatiya kings. It has about 13 islands in it and has a 160 meters long hanging bridge, which connects three islands. It is surrounded by a thick deciduous forest, and it is a very popular tourist spot. The Students Learnt about the Boating and String Bridge, Which is situated at the Lake.





Ramappa Temple, also known as the Rudreshwara temple, is a UNESCO World Heritage Site located in Telangana, India. It is 15 km (9.3 mi) from Mulugu, 66 km (41 mi) from Warangal, 209 km (130 mi) from Hyderabad. An inscription in the temple says it was constructed in the year 1213 CE by Recharla Rudra, a General of Kakatiya ruler Ganapati Deva 1199–1262. Located in the vicinity of Ramappa Lake, the Ramappa Temple complex which consist of three temples was constructed between 1212 and 1234, designed and architect by Ramappa, after whom the temple complex is named.

The temple is a Sivalayam, where Lord Ramalingeswara is worshipped. Marco Polo, during his visit to the Kakatiya empire, allegedly called the temple "the brightest star in the galaxy of temples". Ramappa Temple stands majestically on a 6-foot (1.8 m) high star-shaped platform. The hall in front of the sanctum has numerous carved pillars that have been positioned to create an effect that combines light and space wonderfully. The temple is named after the sculptor Ramappa, who built it, and is perhaps the only temple in India to be named after its craftsman.

The main structure is in a reddish sandstone, but the columns round the outside have large brackets of black basalt which is rich in iron, magnesium, and silica. These are carved as mythical animals or female dancers or musicians, and are "the masterpieces of Kakatiya art, notable for their delicate carving, sensuous postures and elongated bodies and heads". On 25 July 2021, the temple was inscribed as a UNESCO World Heritage Site as "Kakatiya Rudreshwara (Ramappa) Temple, Telangana".






Bheemuni Paadam Waterfalls is situated in Seethanagaram Village, GUDUR Mandal, Mahabubabad in Telangana State, INDIA. At 10 km from Gudur Bus Stand, 55 km from Warangal, 88 km from Khammam Bus Station and 200 km from Hyderabad, hidden inside a dense forest, is a picturesque waterfall known as Bheemuni Paadam (Bheema's step) The Bheemuni Padam waterfall came into limelight recently when determined tourists began making their way to it.

At the Bheemuni Padam, water falls from a hillock from about 20 feet in a semi-circular enclosure. Apart from the sound of falling water, it is quiet all around. It has not been conclusively established where the water comes from. Even when the flow is less, it is used to irrigate local fields. Visitors say the waterfall has lot of scope if facilities are provided and the tourism department markets the place. Lack of security is a concern since the area can get lonely.
