## ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT



(A brief History of the College and English Department).

M.A.L.D Govt. Arts & Science college, Gadwal was established in the year 1960 to cater to the educational needs of the rural students in this interior part of Andhra Pradesh now Telangana. Before the establishment of this college the students of this area had to travel a long distance to fulfil their aspirations for higher education. Most of them gave up their studies, as they could not afford the expenditure to pursue their higher education at far off

places. The college fulfilled the long felt needs of these students. The department of English was established along with the inception of the college in 1960. The founding fathers of the department were:

The department served the linguistic needs of the students of this backward area at pre-university and undergraduate levels till 1996. Consequent to the bifurcation of the college into two separate units i.e. Junior College and Degree Colleges in 1996 the Department has started teaching only to the Undergraduate Students. The department has been sanctioned with Five Lecturer posts of the five, all posts are vacant. The vacant posts are temporarily filled with guest faculty.

The College is offering Science, Arts, Commerce and computer Courses. English is First language for all the courses up to Final year. The total number of students for the 1<sup>st</sup> year is 1067 and for the 2<sup>nd</sup> year is 871 and final year is 551. The Department is sanctioned 8 Lecturer posts out of them all are vacant. The College has appointed Eight Guest Lecturers.

91% of the students are BC, SC and ST with rural background and are economically very poor. The department is strictly adhered to the academic schedule of the Palamuru University. The department maintains all academic records. The department also prepares an annual plan with different programs to have more systematic approach while imparting the subject to the students.

The departmental meetings are arranged at the beginning of the academic year and whenever necessary.

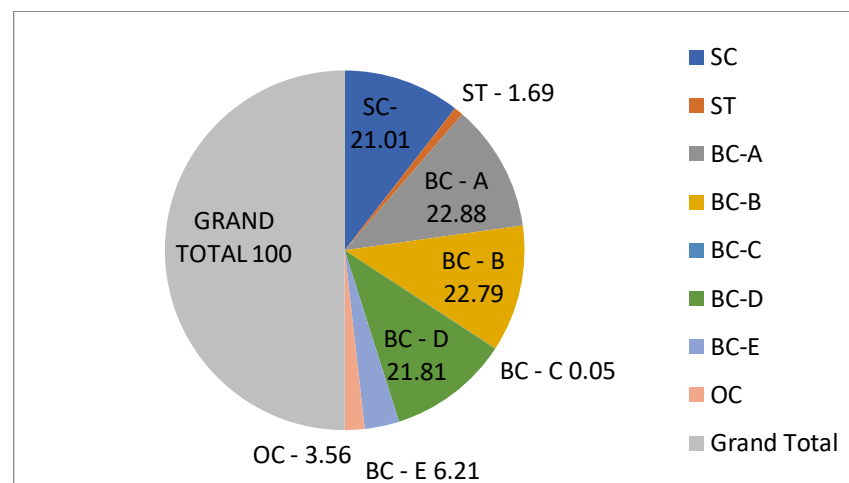

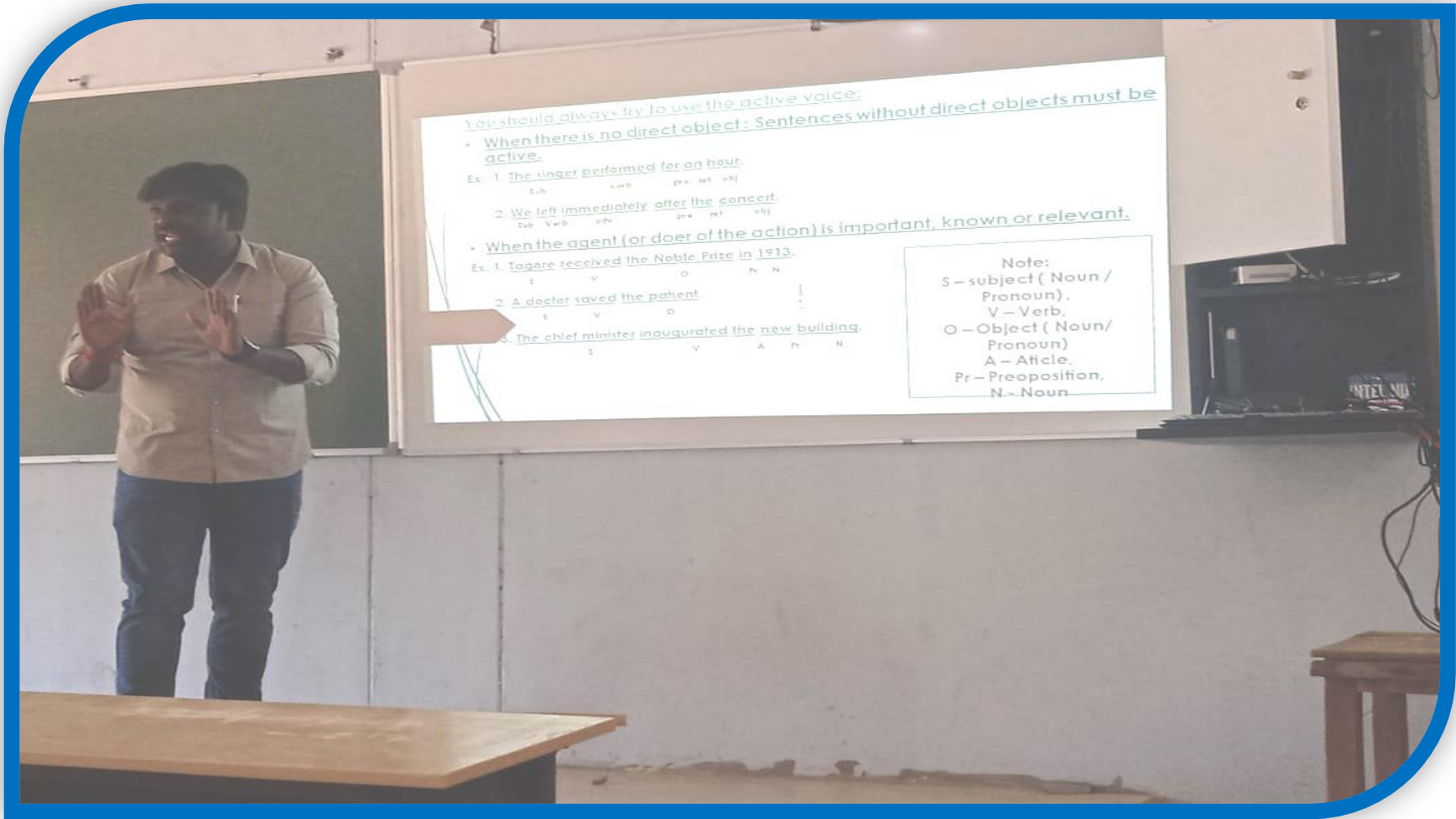
## **LIBRARY**

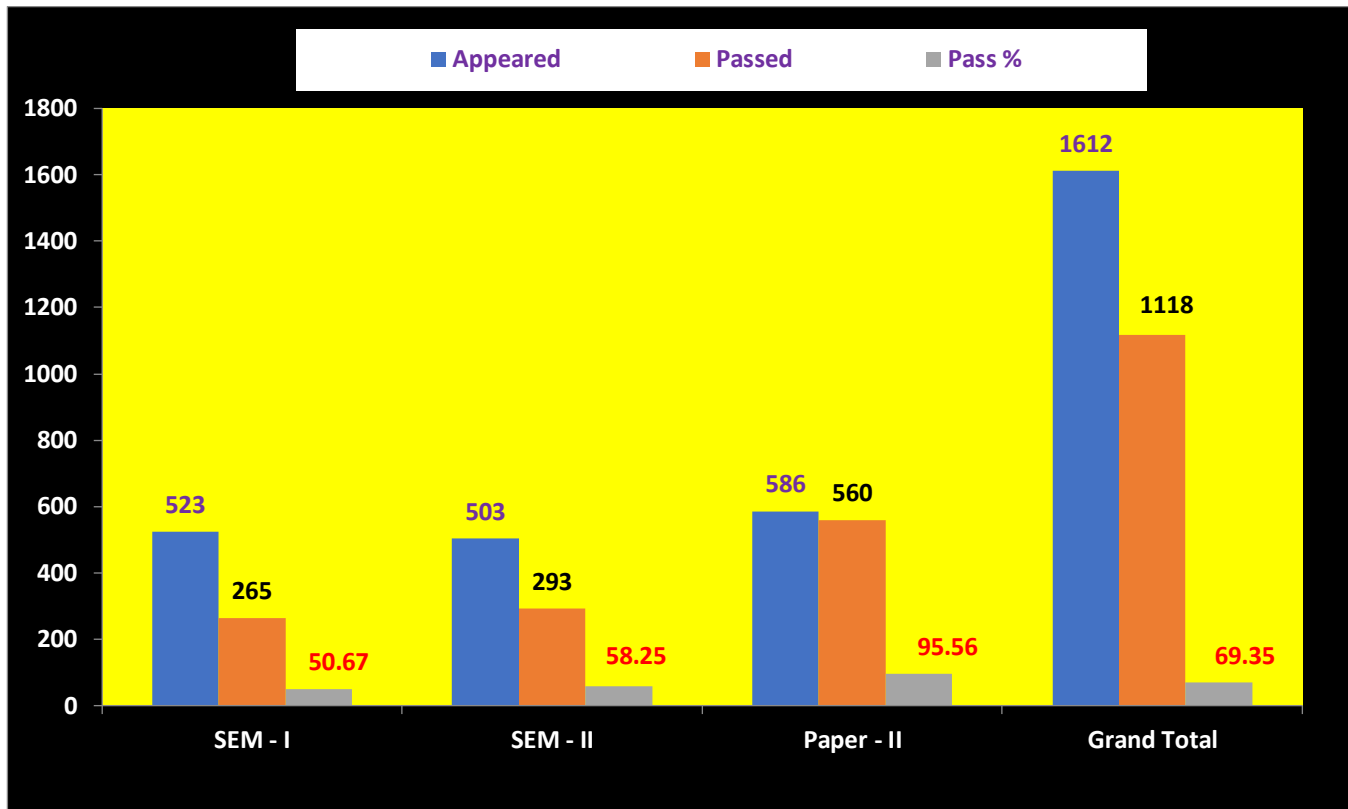

## BEST PRACTICES

### 1. Creating Language Acquisition Skill System in English (CLASS in English)

#### Goal

- To create the system that enables the students to learn English as they have acquired their mother tongue.

#### The Context

- Learning English Language involves mastering four skills: Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing.
- However the two skills Listening and Speaking have been neglected since their schooling which has resulted poor communication ability in English.
- Hence there is a need to address this issue and empower them with the ability to speak in English fluently and accurately.

#### The Practice

- We have started this practice since the academic year 2015-16.
- In 2015-16, we have resolved to focus on listening skill by allotting 15 minutes a period for providing listening to the students and encourage them to speak only in English in their English Classes.
- In 2016-17, in addition to the above, we have provided audio material downloaded from NET and transferred to their mobiles and encouraged them to listen at least 15 minutes a day. For speaking skill, we have conducted class room seminars once in a week and encouraged them to speak in English.
- In 2018-19, the above strategy is further strengthened by way of monitoring the students whether they are really listening. For this, once in a week students were asked to speak on what they have listened to. This added strategy encouraged the students to listen more carefully. This has also improved their spoken skills.
- In 2019-20, we have added additional feature to this strategy. 20 minutes a week is allotted for playing the audio files in the classrooms followed by discussion on the played topics. We noted that this has a dramatic effect on the students which resulted better communication skills in English.



**Evidence of Success**

- When we joined the college in November, 2015, it was noticed that there was hardly any student who could give a speech during the functions such as Fresher’s day, Farewell Day, College Day, Sports Day etc. But in the due course of time the communication skills of the students have been improved. This is evident with the increasing number of students passionately speaking in English in such occasions. This has been noticed by one and all. The Principal Dr. P. Rajani many a time appreciated our efforts in encouraging the students to come forward not only to speak but to speak in English. Yet we have not totally achieved what we aimed at. It may take time but we are confident to reach our target.

**Problems Encountered and Resources Required**

- When we conceptualized this strategy we were hopeful that students would do as we expected, but students were interested to get the material into their mobiles but showed little interest to listen to it as expected. We had to strive to motivate them from time to time. From one year to the other we have added additional strategies to make them listen to it. At last we started playing the audio clips in the class room to assist and motivate them to listen. It has at last worked well. Thanks to the Principal for providing necessary devices to play them in the class room.

Permanent Audio Play back system if installed in the class room with good quality speakers we believe it would make class room very interesting to the students.

## 2. Wrappers to Riches

### **Goal**

- To enable students to learn more vocabulary from even with the household utensil.

### **The Context:**

- As English has become lingua franca in many countries in the world, especially in multi lingual countries like India.
- This situation demands on the part of advertisers and manufacturers to promote their products in every corner of the world by choosing English as medium of their advertisements.
- The advertisements are mainly printed on the wrappers of the products. The practice has been implemented in the institution with the following objectives.

### **The Practice:**

- To establish the fact that English language is available everywhere, particularly outside of the classroom.
- To promote the use of wrappers used in the advertisements as a regalia to learn English language.
- To encourage learners of English to pay attention towards the language of wrappers to learn English.
- To include the wrappers of different products in daily language classroom transaction for teaching and learning English.
- To motivate the teachers and learners to gain mastery over the four English language skills: listening, speaking, reading, and writing through constant following of advertisements.
- To use wrappers of household articles up to their potential in language classrooms and even in outside for learning English language.
- To make use of the wrappers as the cheapest means of teaching and learning English by the teachers and learners.

### **The Practice and its uniqueness:**

- The novel idea got its origin in the attractiveness of the vivid and colorful wrappers used in packaging industry by spending huge money in producing them with a much closer look at the otherwise waste litter that every busy customer wants to throw away opens up an opportunity to learn English. Almost all wrappers used to pack the daily house articles are printed with the details mainly in English and are readily available material for imparting English language skills. Hence, the institution has adopted the unique practice.
- Language plays an important role in the preparation of wrappers for product advertisement. The use of catchy, interesting and relevant vocabulary, phrases, clauses, idioms and sentences enhances the chances of the advantage to reach the target group.

### Problems Encountered and Resources Required

- The wrappers are everywhere and easily accessible, moreover they are available always. There is absolutely no problem in collecting them. The only resource that is needed to use them is interest and resourcefulness in using them in an appropriate manner. Hence, no cost but valuable in learning English. In the modern times, English has emerged as a dominant medium of many advertisements.
- In this context, one can learn a lot of English language through constant and conscious exposures to the wrappers used in packaging industry. Almost every wrapper contains a catchy motto / slogan / tagline in English.
- These mottos are a great source of English language leaning. The students and teachers need to be aware of the fact that the English language is available not only in the classroom but also in real life situations outside the classroom.
- Hence, the students are encouraged to exploit the wrappers to their fullest manner to learn English.





## FUTURE PLANS

- Improve the Strategies implemented for creating better learning atmosphere.
- There has been excellent response for the Certificate Course in Communication Skills in English for the past three years. The department plans to introduce a long term Certificate Course not only for our students but also for the outside students taking due permission from Palamuru University.
- The department is planning to introduce English Literature as one of the optional subjects for B.A. students.
