INTRODUCTION:

The Maharani AdilakshmiDevamma Government Arts & Science Degree and P.G College, Gadwal, Jogulamba Gadwal District, was first established in the Year 1960 under a Private Management later after the Royal family of Gadwal Samsthan handed over the Royal Fort for educational purpose of the public. The College started functioning under government.

In the beginning there were B.A and B.Sc., Courses. The College became the Center of Education for the Students for the assembly constituency namely Gadwal and Alampur.

At present this college is providing Education in Both Medium in Three Groups in B.A., B.com, &B.sc.

ABOUT THE DEPARTMENT:

Department of Economics was established in the year 1960 along with the establishment of the college. Hence, it became the pioneer department in general and of Social Sciences in particular. The department had two sanctioned posts as per the requirement of the college in 1960 and now we had five sanctioned posts. From the year 1969-70 the Medium of instruction was changed From English to Telugu Medium and now we offering both mediums. As we form the part of the education system designed by Department of Education, governed by the Government of Telangana, the faculty positions are governed by the rules framed by the Department of Higher Education, Government of Telangana. As per the students' enrolment, the number of faculty positions increase based on the requirement. Today, the Department has two different medias, viz., English and Telugu medium. STUDENT INTAKE:








RESULT ANALYSIS





The various student-centric activities include



(a) **Slip tests**. Based on the requirement we conduct slip tests for the students to assess their capacity to understand various components of the topics. Later on we also discuss the mistakes committed by the students so that they will be aware of their shortcomings and work towards overcoming those problems.



- (b) **Assignments**. The department has the pre-designed set of topics which will help the students to design and develop their ability to understand the various topics in the syllabus and equip themselves to face the exams at the end of the semester. The department also includes topics of contemporary importance into the assignments. The students are given the topics and they are made to write a note on them including collecting information, analyzing and proper presentation. This activity will enhance their ability and levels of confidence to face any situation.
- B. **Student Seminar**. A topic is given to the students which can be a part of the syllabus or the emerging issues of the economy. They are made to collect the required information and a chance is given for them to present. This will help them to enhance their ability and present their ideas freely and frankly in front of the group. This confidence will help them to face the challenges of life in the future.





C. **Group discussion**. Topics are discussed freely either from the subject or from outside and atmosphere of free interaction is provided for the students. The staff usually takes the role of a moderator and guide the direction of the group.



TEACHING LEARNING EVALUATION

The curriculum for Economics course at Undergraduate level is designed by the Department of Economics, Palamuru University. As an affiliated college, we have to follow the syllabus provided by the PalamuruUniversity for all the courses at undergraduate level. We do not have any flexibility in either adding or deleting any component of the syllabus approved by the Department of Economics, Palamuru University. As an affiliated college, the faculty has an opportunity to participate in the process of syllabus preparation as being a member of Board of Studies Committee, participating in annual conference of the department, special invitees for discussing the finalization of the syllabus, etc. where we the faculty provide inputs under various heads for additions and deletions in the syllabus. Once the syllabus is approved, the affiliated college has no choice but to follow the syllabus in word and spirit.

The department identifies certain contemporary issues which are not included in the syllabus as topics and arranges group discussions, extension lectures and seminars to highlight the contemporary issues for the benefit of the students.

In the year 2016-17, as a part of the unification of curriculum all over India, the Palamuru University adopted the Choice Based Credit System as an education system to pump in flexibility giving choice to the students rather than the system-imposed education. Under this system the university had adopted the semester system with classroom teaching of 90 working days and as an affiliated college we are following the same system. As Undergraduate Course in Economics is divided into 6 semesters and the student is supposed to acquire 108 credits to acquire the undergraduate degree. This structure adopted for imparting knowledge in Economics include the following:

As a component of flexibility and choice given to the students, the students can acquire credits by studying various other subjects outside Economics to qualify and acquire the undergraduate degree in Economics. The flexibility component in the curriculum under Choice Based Credit System includes DSC, DSE, AECC, SEC, and GE.

TEACHING PROCESS

The Department of Economics follows the traditional method of imparting education to the students through the method of lecture. We emphasize on interaction and lecture method rather than monologue. We take up the topics listed under the syllabus and make an effort on our part to make them understand rather than propagate the information of the books. In this period of information explosion, the students of today have access to multiple sources of information. Hence, we the staff of the department concentrate on understanding the information rather than compiling information for the students. We also utilize the modern techniques of teaching methods including ICT, YouTube, Zoom, Webinars, Virtual Classroom, etc. This had been possible more so during the period of lockdown where we had prepared several video lessons and passed onto the students. The process of learning by using the modern methods of teaching. The department also uses the virtual classroom and arrangement made by the college to impart specialized audio-video lessons using the virtual classroom method.

The learning methods for the students span over the traditional output to the modern. Emphasis is made not much on collection of information but the staff makes effort to see that the students develop the capability of understanding the information. We try to provide the alternates available and leave the decision making process on the individual students. We help them to understand and guide them towards fixing the objectives and choosing the path for achievements in life.

EVALUATION

Evaluation is a continuous process and the department adopts the same. Evaluation of students takes place on a day-to-day basis. Several methods are adopted by the department to evaluate the students. Evaluation in modern times has gained importance. Hence, it becomes all the more important in the process of teaching and learning. Certificate has acceptance all over the world. Hence, the department takes up evaluation as an important component of teaching and learning. It starts with the lecture itself by generating questions in such a way that the students are encouraged to understand and respond. We also take up the traditional methods of evaluation such as arranging slip tests, unit tests, and practice sessions, etc. wherein the student is provided with the feedback on their understanding of the concept and their way of presentation. This improves their understanding capabilities and presentation.

The system of evaluation under the new CBCS system also provides for the method of continuous evaluation. The system provides for 20 marks for internal continuous assessment and 80 marks for external assessment, which is conducted by the University at the end of the semester. The internal assessment include conducting an objective-based assessment including 10 multiple choice questions for 5 marks, 10 fill in the blanks for 5 marks, and 5 descriptive answers 1 to 5 lines carrying 5 marks. Two such internal assessments are conducted for the students and the average of the two is taken as a component for qualifying the exam. Another 5 marks assessment is designed in the form of assignment or presentation. Specialized topics are given for presentation and for assignment. We usually give important topics from the syllabus and make the students collect information and present it in required form so that it will be useful to them to write their theory examinations. The system of CBCS provides for 20 marks under continuous evaluation process and it is completely left to the department to make students active in the class.

INFRASTRUCTURE

The Department of Economics as a part of the MALD Government Degree College is allotted six rooms for conducting classes.

- Classrooms: One equipped with ICT-enabled facilities.
- Conference hall equipped with ICT-enabled facilities.
- Virtual Classroom Facilities is available for e-content development such as Lecture Capturing System (LCS).





ONLINE CLASSES

During the pandemic the department has decided to teach the students through online by using various platforms. All the faculty members in the department have taken the online classes for the students and they keep in touch with the students in various ways.
