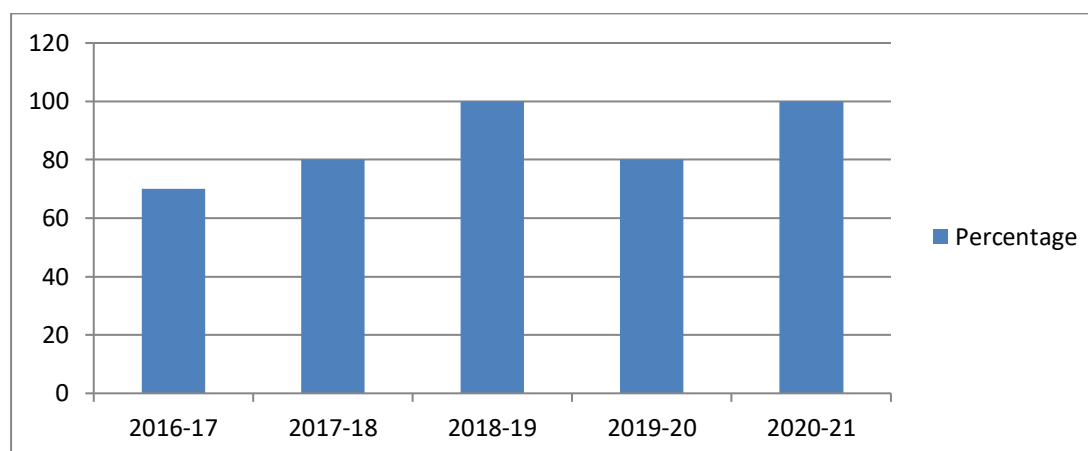

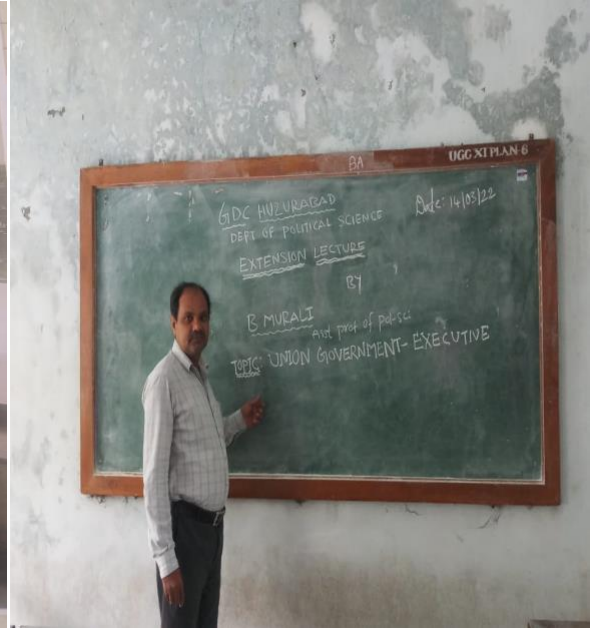
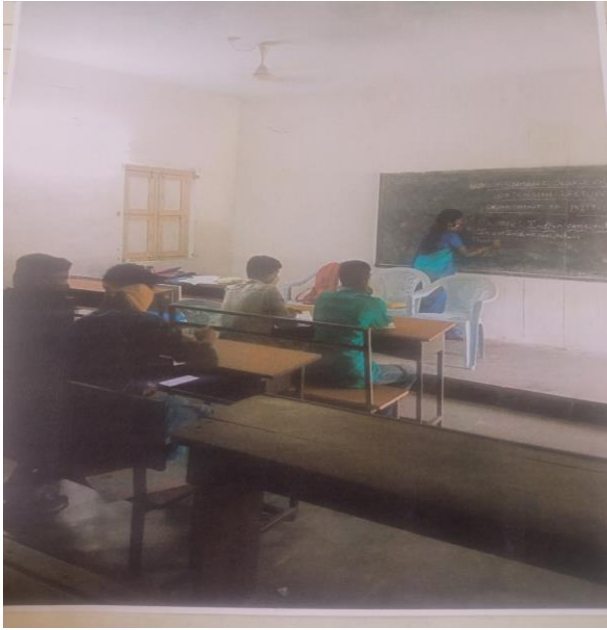

Best Practices of the Department of Political Science (National Voters' Day Celebrations)

1. As part of the celebrations on the occasion of National Voters' day on 25th January 2019, the faculty Dr. K Mallesham, Dr. B. Kavitha, S. Kamalakar and A. Madhusudhan reddy spoke on the significance of Voters' day and enlightened the students on various aspects of electoral system and the values of Indian democracy. The department also conducted Elocution competition and gave away 1st prize to S. Tulasi, 3rd year JMC and 2nd prize to K. Thirupathi.
2. In 2018, on the occasion of National Voters' day on 25th January, a quiz poster was released by Dr. Vijayalaxmi, the principal of the college. K. Mallesham, Incharge, Dept. of Political Science, B. Murali and K. Madhavi of dept. of Public Administration participated in the programme. In the quiz competition was held on the occasion, Vishnu Prakash and team won in the competition.
3. In 2017, voters' pledge was taken. Elocution and essay writing competitions were held and winners were given away prizes. K Mallesham of the department enlightened the students about Indian electoral system and advised the students to be ever vigilant of protecting their rights. T. Sambasivarao, incharge of the department, also spoke on the occasion.
4. In 2016, as part of National Voters' Day celebrations, a meeting was conducted under the chairmanship of T. Sambasivarao, incharge, dept. of political science. Dr. V Vijayalaxmi, Principal of the college, was the chief guest. On the occasion, proportional voting system based on single transferable vote was conducted by the students themselves so as to enable them to understand the technicalities and its significance.
5. In 2015, proportional voting, where students themselves were the contesting candidates, was held. Students were sensitized about the counting process and declaration of results under proportional representation based on single transferable vote.
6. In 2014, on the occasion of national voters' day celebrations on 25th January, the model presidential election of the Indian president was conducted by the students themselves. They were very much sensitized on election and voting system of the election of the Indian President.
