EVALUATION PROCESS

Each Semester paper carries 100 marks out of which

Before 2019-20 evaluation

External Examination - 75 marks
Internal Assessment - 25 marks

Academic year 2019-20 onwards

- Internal Component —40 marks
- External Component —60 marks

External Examination

The student is declared passed if they secure a minimum of 40% marks in External and overall 40 % in external and internal examinations. The students should put in minimum attendance in NCC/ NSS. Practical Examinations will be held at the end of semester.

Internal Assessment

The college has continuous evaluation methods to assess the learning outcomes effectively: The Internal Assessment comprising of 40 marks of the Total Marks is apportioned as follows:

- To measure the subject knowledge (20 marks) : Written Examination of 2 internal assessments. Average of both the exams is taken.
- To measure continuous evaluation of learning (10 marks): Four unit tests MCQS each of 10 marks of which average is taken .
- To measure the depth of knowledge(5 marks): Assignments .
- To measure the communication and presentation skills (5 marks) : Seminar/Viva Voce .

Unique Features of Internal Evaluation

- a) Introduction of Computer Based Testing (CBT)
- b) Project Work.

Credits, Grade Letter, Grade Points and Credit Points

Credit means the unit by which the course work is measured. In these Regulations one credit means one hour of teaching work or two hours of practical work per week.

Grade Letter is an index to indicate the performance of a student in a particular course (Paper). It is the transformation of actual marks secured by a student in a course/paper. It is indicated by a Grade letter O, A, B, C, D, E, F. There is a range of marks for each Grade Letter. In case the student is absent for any exam, AB is indicated in the memo in place of the Grade Letter.

Grade Point is weightage allotted to each grade letter depending on the marks awarded in a course/paper.

Award of Grade

| Range of % of Marks | Grade Letter | Grade Point |

| ≥ 85 to 100 | O | 10 |
| ≥ 70 to < 85 | A | 9 |
| ≥ 60 to < 70 | B | 8 |
| ≥ 55 to < 60 | C | 7 |
| ≥ 50 to < 55 | D | 6 |
| ≥ 40 to < 50 | E | 5 |
| < 40 | F | 0 |
| Absent | Ab | - |

Semester Grade Point Average (SGPA)

Credit Points for the Paper = No. of Credits assigned for the paper x Grade Point secured for that course/Paper

SGPA indicates the performances of a student in a given Semester. SGPA is based on the total credit points earned by the student in all the courses and the total number of credits assigned to the courses/papers in a Semester.

$$SGPA = \frac{\sum(\text{Letter Grade Points}) \times (\text{Credits})}{\sum(\text{Credits})}$$

$$CGPA = \frac{\sum(SGPA) \times (\text{Credits})}{\sum(\text{Total Credits})}$$

Note: SGPA is computed only if the candidate passes in all the papers (gets a minimum 'E' grade in all the Papers)

The following examples illustrate the calculation of Grade Points, Credit Points and Semesters Grade Points Average (SGPA) and Cumulative Grade Points Average (CGPA). The percentage of marks shown in column III is the marks secured by the student in the Internal Assessment and Semester End Examination put together.
