Additional Curriculum:

However, we have added certain other chapters on our own as additional curriculum to enrich the knowledge of the students. Wherever and whenever it is needed, we are supplementing the syllabus with additional topics.

Curricular Activities / Aspects

> Synopsis:

The Department is following synopsis and regularly maintaining the record for synopsis. It is containing the main points of the lesson and chapter. While teaching the lesson we follow synopsis.

> Teaching Diary:

The CCE is supplying teaching diaries for every academic year to every Department. The Department is maintaining teaching diary about the lesson and also giving information about using additional inputs to explain the lesson. The teaching diary is verified by the academic co-coordinator and Principal.

Additional Inputs:

Paper Clippings: The Teacher and students collect the subject based paper clippings and discuss that topic in the classroom. If it is very important we put it in the paper clipping folders.

CRITERIA-II TEACHING, LEARNING AND EVALUATION

TEACHING METHODS & PRACTICES:

- The faculty members prepare Academic plans at the beginning of every academic year. Academic records such as Teaching Diary and Teaching notes with synopsis of the Lessons and regularly maintained.
- 2. Whenever and wherever necessary, the traditional method of lecturing is supplemented by study supervision and Team teaching.
- 3. Interacting with students while teaching is given preference. As education should always promote thinking among the students they are given opportunity to express ideas and opinions on the topics in the syllabus and also on general topics. Students are motivated to read articles in News Papers and discuss about the issues focused in the class room.
- 4. Essay writing and elocution competitions are conducted for the students on social and political aspects which enables to frame ideas and express them

Students learn the subject basically from classroom lectures. Along with this faculty also uses the projectors for delivering lectures through power point presentations. Students are guided to participate in collection of paper clippings and photos on the subject and in preparation of charts. Students are encouraged to learn to use internet as a source of information and advised to habituate reading of e-texts for their subject improvement.

Group projects are assigned to the students so that they can share their knowledge with the academically backward students. Assignments and monthly tests are conducted to each class to measure the performance of the students in the subject. Extra classes were conducted to all failed students to prepare the students to write backlog examinations. Department organize many curricular and co curricular activities.

➤ Learning

 Quiz: Quiz Programs are also conducted to all students of B.A.Political Science to sharpen the memory of the students.

Group Discussions: The Department of Political Science conduct group discussions on various topics for all semester students of Political Science as it creates interest among them to update their knowledge and also develop speaking skills.

Students are provided with previous year's examination question papers to understand the pattern of questions in the final exams. Along with this they are also provided the model questions for various competitive exams such as P.G. entrance UPSC, Group-I and Group-II etc.

The Department of Political Science has taken up the responsibility of conducting counseling and career guidance classes to prepare the students to appear for Public Service Commission examinations.

Physical facilities:

- Class rooms: the Department has big sufficient, ventilated class rooms with good infrastructure for the students.

IT Infrastructure:

Each Department is having computer system with net facility:

Computer Labs: College is having well equipped two computer labs and one TSKC lab. TSKC lab is having internet facility. Another computer lab is having Wi-Fi system, which is very useful to students, lectures in research.

E-Class Room: The institution has well equipped e-class room. The Department uses it for audio, visuals in teaching process. The faculty members of the Department use the e-class room for PPTs, OHPs, to show the downloaded lessons etc.

Maintenance of Campus facilities:

Apart from library, e-class room and computer lab, college has classroom with smart board and projector for showing presentation. College has well furnished gym for students and faculty members. There is also a health club with facilities of First aid box, Career Guidance cell plays a crucial role in personality and all round development of the students and also helps for

placements. NSS units in the college help students to develop social responsibility, community helping nature, and discipline. All the facilities that college has are maintained by principal and faculty members.

CRITERIA-V: STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

Student Mentoring and Support:

- Career guidance: students are supported by Career Guidance cell for getting knowledge and skills to get jobs
- Orientation: At the beginning of the academic year students are provided orientation programme by giving the clear information about the college and Department.
- Personality Programs: the institution and also the Department organize development programs like personality development programs on morals and ethics, time management programs and stress management programs for the all round the development of the students.
- Track and alumni: the Department maintains track with alumni. Faculty members give suggestion to them and encourage them to achieve their goals. Alumni meetings are organized to have interaction with students by inviting them to the college functions and funds are given by them to help the institution.
- Student prepare notes, maps, charts to the Department and also conducting peer teaching.
 This way they give support to the Department.

Student Support Services:

- Remedial coaching: Depending on the ward counseling and the progress of the students, the faculty members are divided into groups like average, above and below average, according to the division the faculty members conduct remedial for below average students and also conduct these classes for the students who failed in the subject.
- Special classes: the faculty members conduct two types special classes for two types for the students. One for the above average students and the other for below average students. For above average students faculty members given assignments, projects and divide the class in to groups making them as leaders for the groups so that they could help their peers.
- Tutorials: the Department organizers tutorials in zero hours. The final year and second year students also conduct the classes for their juniors. Faculty members take the classes and supervise the students. In these tutorials we given information about the subject and Students achievements:
- The students at the graduate level need help in planning for their future career the Department actively participate in counseling the students of first year in improving their personality and conduct on the campus. Outgoing students are suitably counseled about the employment opportunities and various competitive examinations.
