COVID-19 VACCINATION SURVEY SANGAREDDY TOWN

October 2021 to November 2021

NSS Units of Tara Government College(A), Sangareddy conducted Covid-19 **Vaccination Survey** in collaboration with **Azim Premji Foundation** (A Non-Profitable Organisation) and **DMHO** specially Community/Primary Health Centers Indira Nagar and Marks Nagar of Sangareddy from **1st October 2021** to **30th November 2021**. **25 NSS volunteers** were actively participated and each volunteer nearly covered **70 households per day**.

Coronavirus disease 2019 (COVID-19) has rapidly become a global pandemic taking more than 1.7 million lives. While many developed countries are starting their vaccination drive, India is not far behind but still not much is known about the willingness to get a vaccination in India.

Aims:

1. To find out the perception and attitude toward vaccination against COVID-19 among the adult population of Sangareddy in order to know the proportion of people who are willing to get vaccinated against COVID-19.
2. To mobilize all eligible population for full vaccination.

Method:

A study was conducted between October 1, 2021, and November 30, 2021. Data was collected from the interview method with predesigned questionnaire. Each volunteers covered nearly 70 households per day. All volunteers completed the task with full dedication

Results:

Out of covered population 32% of the people were taken two doses of vaccination and 82% of the people taken 1st dose either COVAXIN or Covishield. Only 49.4% believed that people can be protected by the vaccine; 63.1% of the people were willing to get their children vaccinated; and 59.31% felt the vaccine should be free for all. 10% of the were not interested to take any type of vaccination because fear or religious customs or unawareness on vaccination.

Conclusions:

This survey shows that approximately 10% of adults were not willing to get vaccinated against COVID-19. This can guide policymakers to make multipronged efforts to increase the willingness to get a vaccination against COVID-19.
