LIBRARY

The Government Degree College was setup in the year 2013 at the Malkajgiri, Junior college building, with the courses in BCOM, BSC, and BA. In the initial stage the books were purchased from Telugu academy to cater the needs of Telugu and English Medium students.

Dr. P. Ravinder, Assistant Professor in History worked as in-charge librarian since his appointment in 2016 to 2018. In his period the competitive books published by Telugu academy were purchased under the special grants allocated to the new colleges.

Sangiseti Srinivasulu, the present librarian took charge of the library on his transfer from A grade, NMG Degree College, Jogipet, Medak district on 5th September, 2018.

The library shifted from staff room to partitioned computer room at the upstairs of the building under the guidance of Principal Dr. Rajender Reddy. All the books were entered into excel sheets to upload into the library software. As the library is less than three thousand books and the annual maintenance of the Library Software is around Rs. 90,000. Hence the software is not at purchased. We are waiting for the guidelines of CCE in this regard.

At present the Library had **2423 text books** under the **104 titles**. We had the **316 Reference** books. The library had access to more than one thousand old Telugu periodicals, from 1860 to 2012. Journals and periodicals such as Andhra Patrika, Andhra Jyothi, Andhra Bhumi, Telugu Swatantra, Abhyudaya and other material made available through the Kavile – Telangana Research and Referral Centre, which we had an Memorandum of Understanding

Deccan land and The week magazines, The Hindu and Eenadu dailies were subscribed to the library. Books on Competitive exams such as Group I, II, II, IV, and Post graduate exams were made available with extra care in all the subjects. Apart from this the department libraries were also maintained.

The Library is equipped with eight steel almirahs, a computer and printer, old question papers were made available to the students on demand.
