The Department of History Tara Government College Sangareddy (A) organized a Educational field trip on **26th November 2020**. As part of this, Students visited **Archaeological Museum Kondapur, Sangareddy District. 3**students took part in the tour.





The excavations made at Kondapur have brought to light the remains of the Satavahana dynasty and the Buddhist era . The exhibits from this museum are basically retrieved from an ancient mound locally known as Kotagadda (Fort Mound) located at a distance of one km east of the The Archaeological Museum Kondapur site was first explored by the famous Archaeologist Mr. Henry Cousens in the early years of the 19th century . Later it was passed on to the Department of Archaeology of the erstwhile Hyderabad State under H.E.H. the Nizam of Hyderabad who carried on a series of excavations at this mound in 1940.

Initially, the museum was established with the excavated material over the ancient site itself which was later shifted to the present building. In 1952 the museum came under the administrative control of the Archaeological Survey of India . Most of the artifacts displayed in the museum have been unearthed during this period. The Archaeological Museum Kondapur contains about 8,100 antiquities at present . The museum has a central hall and two more galleries , it has a rich collection of minor antiquities unearthed during 1940-1942.
