1. INTRODUCTION

Every person in one way or another is a consumer of various products and services. As citizens of India, we are protected against all forms of exploitation by the service providers. Through the Consumer Protection Act, 1986 all consumers have the right to safety, information, choose, be heard, redressal and consumer education.

It is important that as consumers, we are mindful of our rights. A consumer under the Consumer Protection Act is:

“One, who buys any goods, hires any service for a consideration which has been paid or promised or partly paid and partly promised or under any system of deferred payment.”

The Act allows consumers to file their complaint if they find any of the following:

- a. Goods purchased suffer from any defect.
- b. If the services hired/availed suffer from deficiencies in any respect.
- c. Price have been charged excess of the printed price/MRP
- d. Have suffered loss or damage as result of unfair trade practices.

According to the Consumer protection Act, it says that a consumer can file their complaint in the following places:

- a. District Forum
- b. State Commission
- c. National Commission

As noted earlier, the government provides adequate machinery to protect the rights of the consumers. However, the general public are not fully aware of their rights as consumers. Many a times, they are left wondering, what they would do when they are cheated by traders.

In such a context, it is imperative that awareness is created amongst the general public i.e. men, women and youths. Moreover, informal interaction with people reveals the need for such awareness programmes

- This field trip sensitized the students towards caring for the environment and importance of planting more trees.

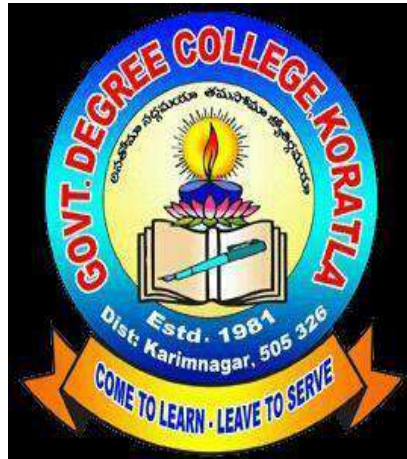

INTRODUCTION:

Work towards free from blindness in Telangana State. The government has decided to take up universal eye screening by covering the entire population of the state under the scheme of “Kanti Velugu”. Chief Minister K. Chandrasekar Rao formally launched the “Kinta Velugu” a mega eye screening programme covering the entire population of the state at Malkapur village in Madak district on 15th August 2018 covering with Independence Day.

The programme envisages eye servicing and vision test camps for the entire population of the state and the government would provide spectacles free of cost to beneficiaries whoever required. Medicines, surgeries and treatment extended free of cost for the needy.

All the services provided absolutely free of cost. This scheme will provide benefits to all residents irrespective of their Socio-Economic status.

STATEMENT OF THE PROBLEM:

Many people especially the elderly, suffer from eye problems. The problem is seen more in villages due to lack of nutritious awareness and poverty.

OBJECTIVES OF THE STUDY:

The objectives of Kanti Velugu are as follows:

- To conduct eye screening and vision test for all citizens of the state.
- Provide spectacles free of cost.
- Arrange for surgeries and other treatment free of cost.
- Provide medicines for common eye ailments.
- Educate people on prevention of serious disabling eye diseases.

METHODOLOGY:

The research was based on primary and secondary data have been collected from residents of Koratla, websites, news papers and so on.

REVIEW OF LITERATURE AND FEEDBACK

Like in all other districts of Telangana State, people are queuing up for eye screening in several eye camps set up across the state. Most of them are happy that they are being provided facilities which they would not have been able to afford.

1. I got my vision checked at the medical camp and it was found that I was having long sight. I got spectacles for it. I thanked KCR for introducing the scheme.

2. Devulapalli Laxmi a resident of Koratla said, "I got spectacles for my eyesight problems within 30 minutes after visiting the camp. I thanked CM.
3. Problem a resident of Koratla expressed her views about Kanti Velugu and said. "I thank chief Minister of introducing this scheme. Now, I got my eye checked free of cost.
4. Medical Officer opined about this programme. "More number of people thronging the camps day by day the number is increasing.
5. Jayamma (70), a resident of Koratla, who was referred to designated hospitality for cataract surgery by the doctors at the Koratla centre said. "Thanks to Chief Minister Chandra Sekar Rao for introducing the scheme.
6. A. Ram raj (33), a small business man said. "Kanti Velugu scheme is a wonderful scheme. It creates awareness among the people about the eyesight as many people generally ignore despite poor vision.
7. Kanti Velugu is giving a fresh lease of life to service citizens and middle aged persons from economically poorer strata.

The camps are evoking good response day to day. No government focussed on this area so far. Health Officer told about it. Finally, people expressed joy over the scheme.

NEED FOR THE STUDY

As a part of field project students were visited “kanti Velugu”(eye screening) Health camp at SFS school, Koratla. Conducted and organised by PHC, Koratla. Students need to know how the government scheme benefited the common people.

REPORT OF THE FIELD PROJECT

As a part of field project we, the staff and students went to SFS School, Koratla on January 18th, 2018. Our Staff and students underwent eye testing under “Kanti Velugu” scheme. Some of us were given spectacles on the same day. Students observed various tests and the conditions of different age groups. Doctors also advised to undergo eye surgery for the people those are needed.

CONCLUSION

Kanti Velugu, the scheme envisages seeing on unavoidable blindness free Telangana, received good response from the rural masses. Obviously rural women were benefited under the scheme.

It also crossed another milestone of a million with giving away free spectacles to those who required it. One million glasses have been given to the people under the scheme which was launched on 15th August, 2018. Finally, all sections of people expressed joy and satisfaction over the scheme.



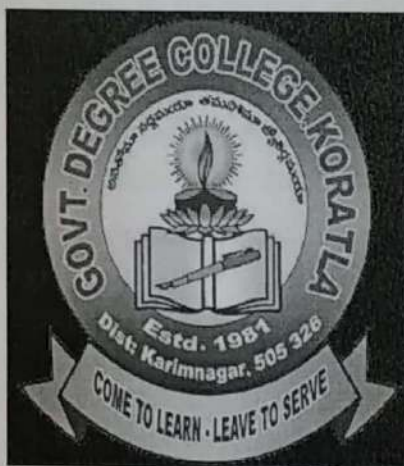

ABSTRACT:

The purpose of this field project is to investigate and analyze the traditional knowledge of medicinal plants and properties used by residents in Our College premises in order to obtain basic data regarding the sustainable conservation of its natural plant ecosystem.

INTRODUCTION:

A **medicinal plant** is a plant that has similar properties as conventional pharmaceutical drugs. Humans have used them throughout history to either cure or lessen symptoms from an illness. A **pharmaceutical drug** is a drug that is produced in a laboratory to cure or help an illness. Typically, pharmaceutical drugs are modeled after compounds found in medicinal plants.

Government Degree college occupies an area of 25 acre.

This region consists of a large number and variety of herbs and plants; however most of this hasn't been commercially utilized. Some of the herbal/medicinal plants found in this area are mentioned in the table below –

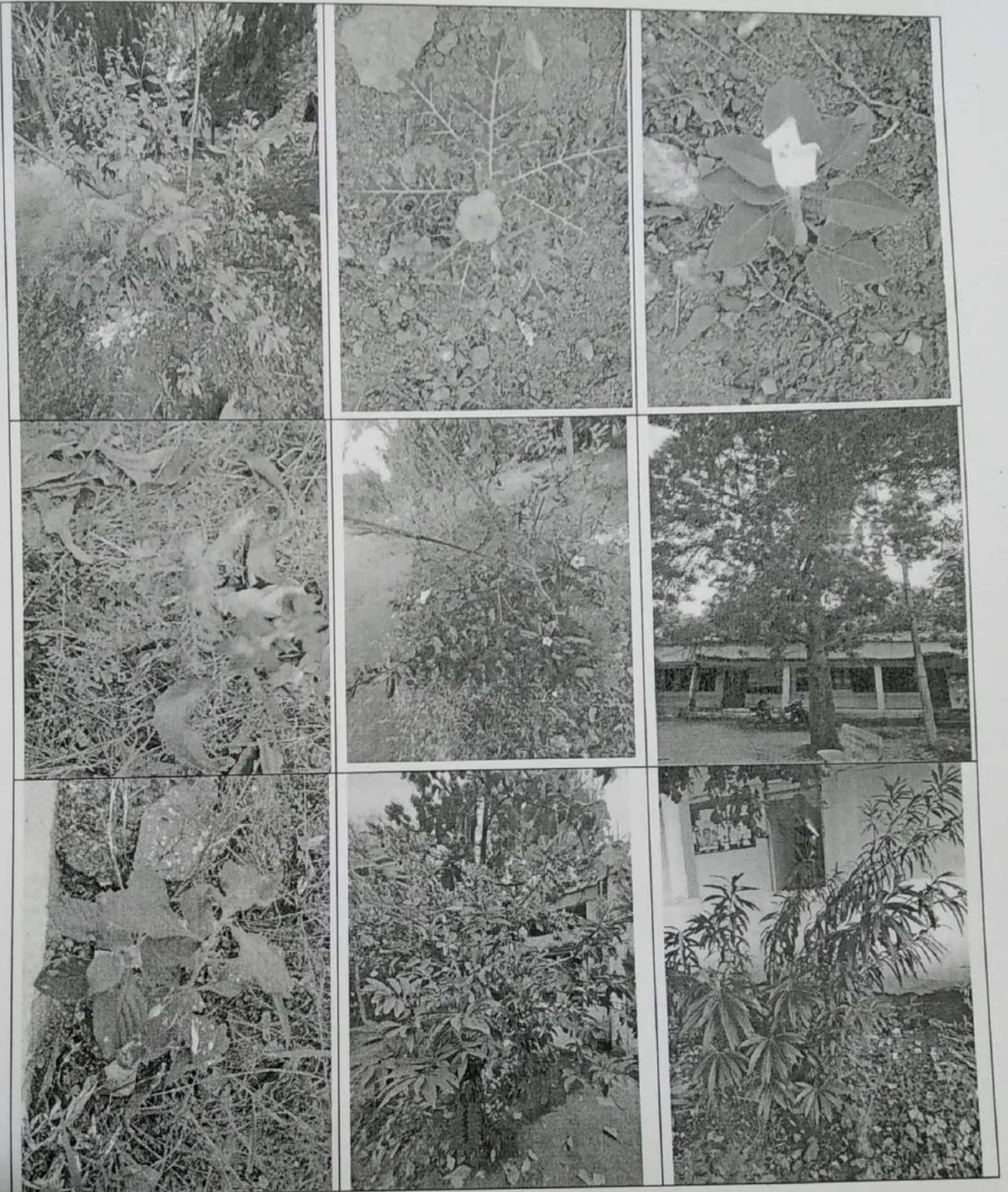
S.NO	PLANT NAME	MEDICINAL USES
1	Tulsi Ocimum sanctum Fam: Lamiaccac	Germicidal, fungicidal, anti-bacterial and Anti-biotic properties. Cures fever, malaria, cold and cough
2	Alma	It enhances food absorption, balances stomach acid. It fortifies the liver and nourishes the brain. It acts as a body coolant, flushes out toxins and increases vitality.
3	Aloe Vera	It is used in the treatment of skin and hair disorders, Inflammation, osteoarthritis and stomach ulcers. It is used in the treatment of diabetes.

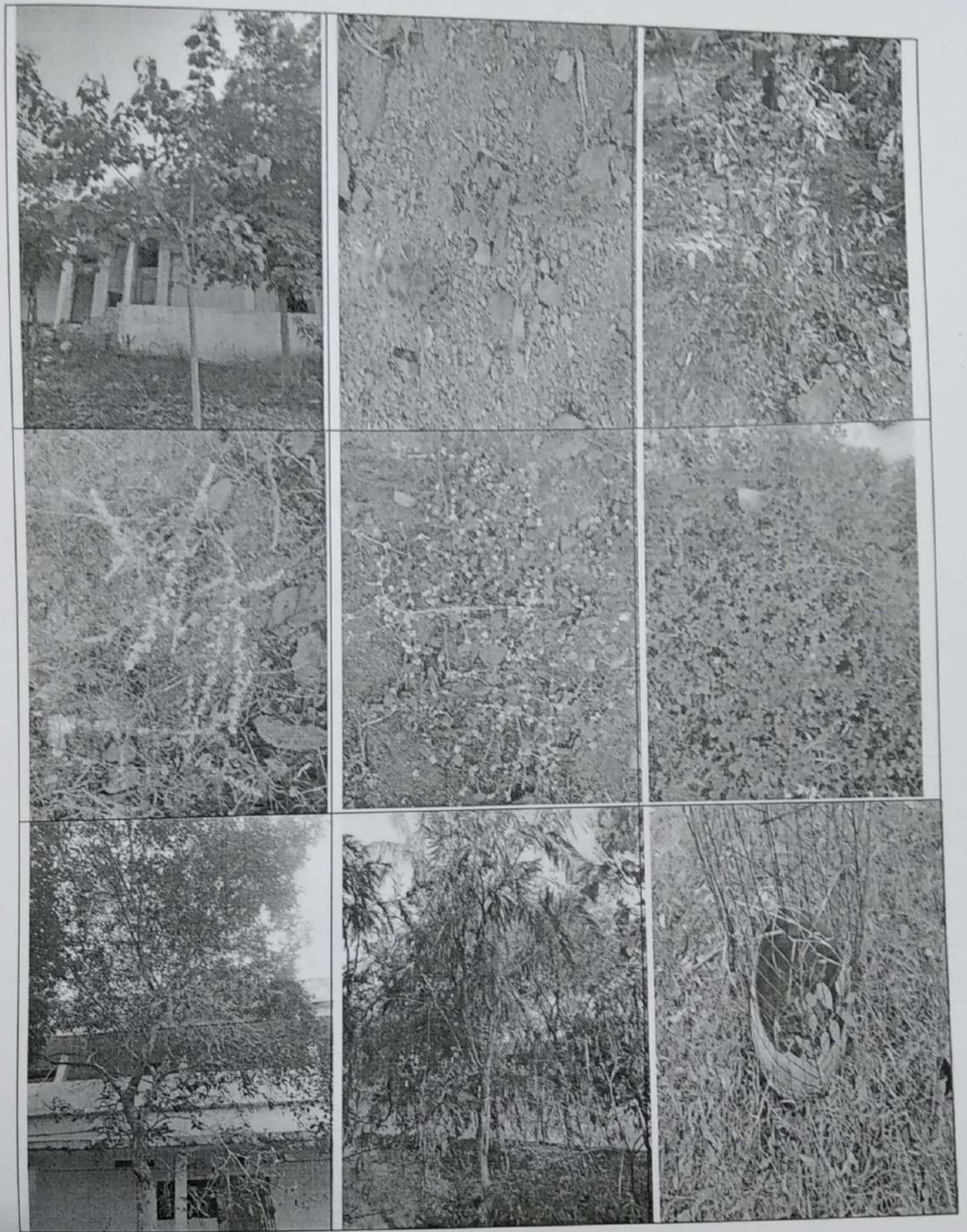
4	Phyllanthous amarus Fam : euphorbiaccac	Anemic, jaundice, Dropsy.
5	Vincea rosea/ catharanthusRoseus Fam : apocyanace	Leukemia, Hypertensive, Antispasmodic, Atidot.
6	Azardirchata - indica Fam : Mahaceae	Sedative, analgesic, epilepsy, hypertensive
7	Euphorbia hirta	Used traditionally in Asia to treat bronchitis asthma and laryngeal spasm.

It also has strong antiseptic agents that can help heal minor cuts and abrasions. Thyme essential oil is very popular in aromatherapy and it's often used as a disinfectant
10	Abutilon indicum (L.) Sweet	Leaves roasted in castor oil are applied to cure piles and anus irritation. Seed used to reduce venereal hea
11	Achyranthes aspera L	Whole plant is ground into ash and mixed with honey and taken with two seeds of pepper for 5 days to give relief from cough
12	Cleome Gynandra	The plants are recommended for curing sinus, insect and bug bites, chest congestion and mild fever. A decoction made out of the plant's seeds and leaves is prescribed for treating pains, swelling, fever, cough, asthma, skin and urinary diseases.

13	Nerium oleander L. (Apocynaceae)	The plant is used in Ayurveda to treat scabbies, eye disease and haemorrhoids.[3] It is used to treat parasitic infection in Calabria (Southern Italy). Leaf decoction is used to treat diabetes in Guide to Medicinal Plants Southeastern Morocco. Bark, leaf, flower are used medicinally as a cardio tonic and diuretic.
14	DaturametelL	Seed: for treatment of leprosy; Leaf: in guinea-worms; Other uses of seed, leaf and root: in insanity, fever with catarrhal and cerebral complications, diarrhea, skin diseases and antiseptic. It is narcotic, acrid, anodyne, antispasmodic, intoxicating, emetic and useful in asthma; Root: used for treatment of bites from rabbits; Poultice made of leaf: used for epilepsy, ophthalmodynia, nostalgias, lumbago, sciatica, neuralgia, mumps and painful swelling.
15	Ficus bengalensis- Banyan tree	Its Latex, bark, fruits, leaves, roots; buds all are have medicinal value. It is used for Local inflammations, Polyuria, Diabetes mellitus, darkening of face & around eyes, burns, Hemorrhages, Nausea, Ulcers in mouth
16	Ficus religiosa	Ficus is used in the traditional medicine to relieve about 50 types of disorders which include diarrhea, diabetes, epilepsy, inflammatory disorders, and gastric problems, sexual and infectious disorders
17	Acalypha indica	Acalypha indica are also much used in traditional medicine for treating many diseases such as gonorrhoea, diarrhea, dysentery, chest pain, ear infections, piles, wounds, epilepsy, and are also used as a purgative. The root infusion or decoction is taken to treat asthma.
18	Annona squamosa	The treatment of epilese, dysentery, cardiac problem, ulcer

- They have practical knowledge how to cultivate this kind of medicinal plants under guidance of our botany lecturer of this college.



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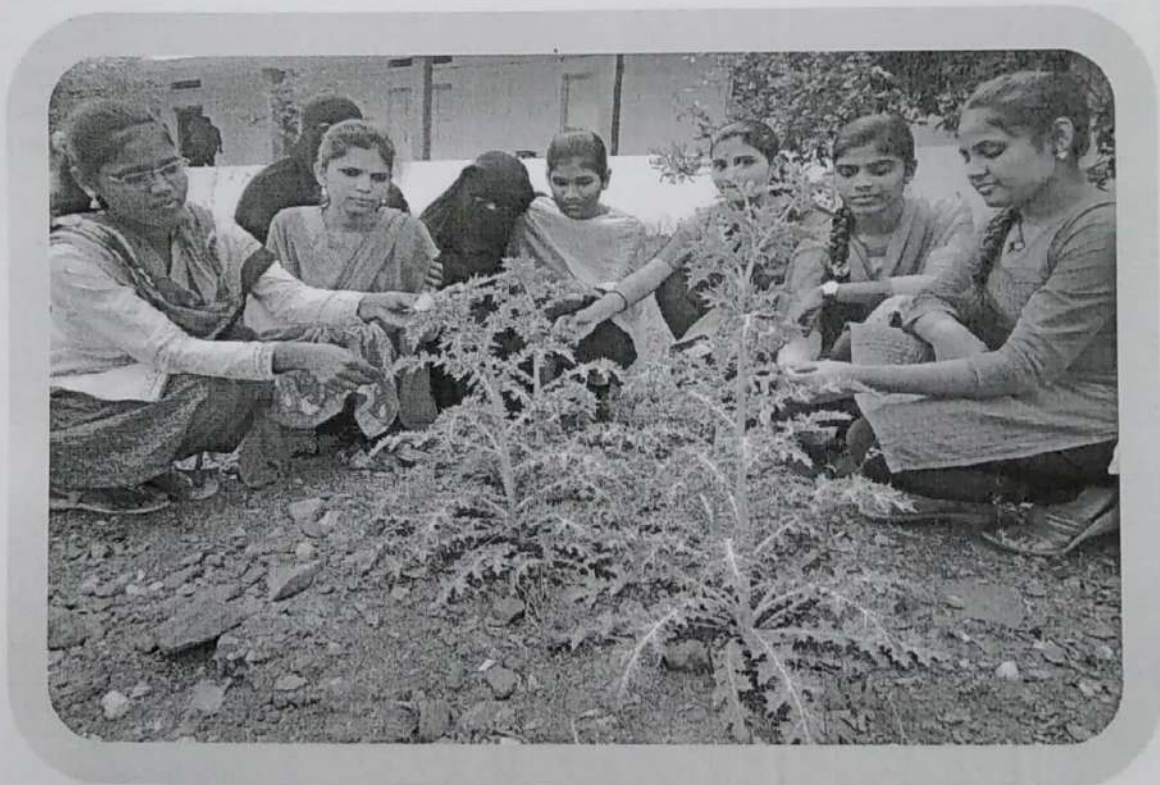


