Title of the Best practice:

FLUENCY-OUR COMPLACENCY.

Objectives of the best practice:

- 1. To make the students familiarize with new vocabulary.
- 2. To make the students learn spellings of the words.
- 3. To make the students guess the meanings of unknown words contextually.
- 4. To make the students learn how to pronounce the words correctly.
- 5. To make the students improve their reading writing and speaking skills.

Context:

In the present scenario, students have no proper focus on learning English in particular the language skills such as Listening, Speaking, Reading & Writing. They are simply preparing for the exams and getting through. The students who hail from rural background are lacking communication skills. As a result of that, they are losing job opportunities. Keeping this in view, the department of English has initiated this departmental best practice to improve the required language skills to prepare them to cope up with their problems with regard to English language. We have divided the students of the class in to groups in this regard. Each group is headed by a meritorious student to guide the students under the supervision of the faculty concerned.

The Practice:

The practice adopted by the department of English slowly gained momentum. The students gradually began to understand the essence of the best practice. It has kindled enthusiasm in the students towards learning English on their own under our supervision. Whenever, the students are made to read out the news items in the class room, they get the opportunity of correcting the pronunciation. As it's a group learning activity, students began to involve in it enthusiastically. They got opportunity to discuss the unfamiliar words and guess their meanings as per the context. Initially, it was found the

implementation of this best practice in the class room was a challenging task. Some students who were non serious began to make noise in the class room. Controlling large class was also a herculean task initially. But, after much motivation the students started to understand the purpose of the practice. The students, gradually started to gain confidence in learning English through news paper reading in the class room under the supervision of the faculty.

Evidence of success:

In course of time after the initiation of the best practice in the class room students who were aloof gradually began to participate in the group study. They broke the ice and began to lose their fear and inhibitions of speaking. This best practice has improved self motivation in the students. It has yielded good results. It has improved reading skill considerably. Now, the students are able to use correct spellings in most cases. The students are also able to know the unfamiliar words and their usage in their daily contexts. We conducted some tests periodically to test the achievement rate. The results were understood to be satisfactory. The reading, writing and speaking skills of the students proved to be satisfactory. It made considerable change after the initiation of the best practice in the class rooms.

Problems encountered and Resources required:

Initially, we had faced some problems in implementing the best practice. But, in course of time all the problems were slowly resolved. As it is a rural area, we found it difficult for getting English news papers. To overcome this, we got the prints of online English news paper The Hindu. It needed some time and money for getting the news papers printed. We used even old news papers also in this regard .After some initial hiccups, the best practice was implemented in the college successfully to improve English language skills in the students. Now, it has become a habit for the students to read English news papers. We are continuing this best practice for all the classes.

DEPARTMENT OF HINDI

SPOKEN HINDI CLASSES TO NON-HINDI (TELUGU LANGUAGE) STUDENTS

1.OBJECTIVE :

- To make students learn a new Hindi word a Day.
- To understand different approaches to learn Hindi language as a speaking language rather than subject.
- > To understand Hindi language and improve Hindi speaking skills.
- > To make student to introduce themselves in Hindi and prepare resume in Hindi.
- To develop structured modules for an understanding Hindi language learning as well as provide strategies for the student to explore language in all its dimensions – the listening, speaking, reading and writing.

2.CONTEXT:

Hindi is the national language of India; but, it is one of several languages spoken in different parts of the sub-continent. 'National' should be understood as meaning the 'official' or 'link' language. The homeland of Hindi is in the North of India, but it is studied, taught, spoken and understood widely throughout the sub-continent, whether as mother tongue or as a second or a third language.

Hindi has many different styles and speech registers, appropriate in different contexts. At the most colloquial level it reflects more the common ground with Urdu, while in formal and official contexts a more Sanskritized style is found.

The language of this course is that which is used unselfconciously by Hindi speakers and writers in the various, mainly informal situations, which are introduced. We have included some of the English language words here, which are freely used in conversations by the Hindi speakers

3.THE PRACTICE :

- ✓ This practice consists of 90 days
- ✓ Timings of the practice is 1600 hours 1645 hours daily.
- ✓ We have been providing written and instructed notes to students.
- ✓ Student strength is 80
- ✓ Usage type : Black board

Students get practice on the following way :

• Students are instructed to learn a Hindi word a day to improve their Hindi vocabulary.

Script & Sound System

Hindi is written in Devnagari or 'Nagari' script. The script is phonetic; so that Hindi, unlike English, is pronounced as it is written. Therefore, it is to learn the characters of the script and the sounds of the language at the same time.

Pronuciations Hints

Each Devnagari character is followed by its Roman transliteration. The transliteration shows each consonant to end in 'a': this is because in the absence of any other vowel sign, the Devnagari consonant is followed by an inherent 'a' sound (pronounced like the 'a' in 'majority'), unless it occurs at the end of the word, when it is not pronouced, or is silenced. Thus each Devnagari character represents a syllable, and the totality is strictly speaking a 'syllabary' rather than an 'alphabet'. Note that Devnagari has no capital letters.

There are 33 consonants and 11 vowels in Hindi. Additionally, there are also many conjunct consonants. Hindi consonants are divided into groups on the basis of phonetic properties of their formations: plosives, nasals, fricatives, flapped and tapped sounds, and semi vowels.

Social Customs

The customary Hindu greetings are 'namaste' or 'namaskar', often said with hands folded in front of the chest. These are all-purpose greetings, covering the English 'hello', 'Good morning', 'Goodbye', etc.

There are two words in Hindi which translate "thank you" :shukriya and dhanyavad.

Grammar

Nouns:

Hindi nouns are either masculine or feminine. The grammatical gender of each noun must therefore be learned. There is no definite article 'the' in Hindi.

Masculine nouns are of two types: those ending in a final aa in the singular which changes to 'e' in the plural, and all others, which are the same in singular and plural:

Adjectives:

Adjectives agree with the nouns they qualify. Hindi adjectives are of two types: those that inflect (change their endings), and those that are invariable. Those which inflect, such as 'baraa' 'big', and 'chota' 'small', end in aa in the masculine singular, e in masculine plural and ii in the feminine singular and plural. The invariable adjectives, like 'saaf' 'clean', never change.

The Sentence:

Hindi uses a different word order than English. The subject usually comes at the begining of the sentence, and the verb comes at the end. The negative 'nahiin' comes just before the verb.

Normal sentences English: Subject Verb Object = I speak Hindi Hindi: Subject Object Verb = I Hindi speak (meinhindiboltihoon.) Verbs: vahbotihai He speaks ham boltiihain We speak tum boltii ho You speak (plural) aapboltiihain " veboltiihain They speak The Uindi york distinguishes not

The Hindi verb distinguishes not only tense-past, present and future- but also different kinds of action: those that are completed (perfective), those that are habitual (imperfective), and those that are going on (continuous).

4.EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS :

We have been observed a lot of improvement in students Hindi communication skills.

We have been conducted different competitions in Hindi to make students improve their self in the aspect of Hindi language.

5.PROBLEMS ENCOUNTERED:

TURNING CAMPUS WASTE IN WEALTH BY VERMI COMPOSITING

<u>1. Title of the practice</u>: TURNING CAMPUS WASTE IN TO WEALTH BY VERMICOMPOSITING.

2. Objective of the Practice:

- > To convert organic waste to Vermicompost.
- > To involve students in Vermi-composting.
- > To use vermi compost college plantation.
- > To motivate students towards waste management methods.

3.The Context:

J.V.R Government college campus is spread over 12.25 with large area under rich canopy of trees. It is covered with more than 300 trees. From about 120 varieties of plants daily 2 to 3 kgs of (approx.) of dry leaves fall as waste materials. Students collect the dry leaves store in a particular place to prepare to Vermicompost to turns waste to useful produce.

4. The practice:

- **Phase –I:** Processing involving collection of wastes, mechanical separation of plastic waste, metal, glass and other ceramics stored the collected waste at specific place .
- **Phase II:** That dry leaves waste mixed with cattle dung.
- Phase III: Preparation of Vermi composting pit with concrete material one meter deep and 1.5 meters wide. Preparation of Vermi-composting bed preparation with dry leaves and cattle dung.
- **Phase –IV:** Collection of earthworm after vermi compost collection. Release the earthworms regular monitoring and adding fresh source.

5. Evidence of Success:

• After using vermi compost to garden plants showed luxuriant their growth, vermi compost having enriched macronutrients and micro nutrients. So, plants nutrition increases of porosity and microbial activity in soil which improved water retention and aeration.

- Regularly using vermin compost to plants is place of chemical fertilizers. The cost of the garden /plantation maintenance is cost effective.
- Plants showing luxuriant growth and high yield.

6. Problems encountered & resources required:

- Collection of the waste material / dry leaves from the garden.
- Some worms keep escaping for the prepared vermi bed.
- The vermin worm & vermin bed having very bad odour in the campus.
- Regular monitoring.
- Rainy season related issues.

A **Formula** is a concise way of expressing information symbolically, as in a mathematical formula

The plural of formula can be either formulas (from the most common English plural noun form) or, under the influence of scientific_Latin, formulae (from the original Latin).

.In a general context, formulas are a manifestation of mathematical model to real world phenomena, and as such can be used to provide solution (or approximated solution) to real world problems, with some being more general than others

During this practice, each student is given the reference material (websites to refer etc.) and asked to come up with their understanding on this subject.

5. EVIDENCE OF SUCCESS:

BEST PRACTICE DEPARTMENT OF PHYSICS

INTRODUCTION OF LATEST FUNDAMENTAL PHYSICS DISCOVERIES

(BLACK HOLE, GRAVITATIONAL WAVES, COVID-19, SUPERCONDUCTOR) 1. Goal:

- To make students understand what gravitational waves are and the latest discoveries in that field
- To understand Hulse-Taylor binary pulsar
- > To understand how physics related to Covid-19.

2. The Context:

In the context of latest developments in physics, understanding them and keeping one-self up to date keeps them connected to the world-wide physics community, hence keeps them motivated and interested in Physics. Lack of knowledge of latest developments is a drawback to the students when participating in any seminars, group talks. Without knowing latest developments students' knowledge becomes irrelevant to the current time. relatives and interested investors to invest the money in more return companies.

3. The Practice:

During this practice, each student is given the reference material (websites to refer etc.) and asked to come up with their understanding on this subject. They were also asked to suggest references they used to come-up with this understanding. Group discussions are arranged among students on this topic after this in which they can discuss how this discovery can become useful in future, can this discovery lead to any other discoveries etc.

4. Evidence of Success:

Astronomers have used gravitational waves (ripples in the fabric of spacetime) to observe so many black hole collisions that by now, it's hardly newsworthy. But in 2020, astronomers <u>announced the discovery of the biggest</u> <u>collision yet</u>: a titanic merger of an 85-solar-mass black hole and a 66-solarmass black hole. Post-merger, the resulting black hole tipped the scales at 142 times the mass of the sun. (About nine suns' worth of mass was converted into pure energy.) In other black hole news, the universe's ultimate Pandora's box was the subject of <u>this year's Nobel Prize in physics</u>.

Gained the knowledge on gravitational waves for which Barry Barish, Kip Thorne and Rainer Weiss were awarded the 2017 Nobel Prize in Physics for leading this work and confirming the observation of the gravitational waves.

Guided the students of lower classes on gravitational waves understanding.

The novel corona virus SARS-CoV-2 has devastated humanity, reaching pandemic levels in only a couple of months and washing across the globe. But we're fighting back with one of our most powerful weapons: vaccines. The current vaccines target a very specific part of the virus, a "spike" protein that it uses to invade our cells. One of the first steps in the war against COVID was to identify and map that protein, which researchers <u>accomplished earlier this</u> year, using a physics-based technique called cryogenic electron microscopy. Using this map, drugmakers could target this feature of the virus for vaccines to mimic, giving our immune systems a fighting chance.

Superconductors are super-neat. Due to the weirdness of quantum mechanics, under very special conditions, electrons can buddy up, with the pairs traveling together without losing energy. That means a game-changing technology where electricity can flow forever without resistance. Unfortunately, to make superconductors work, physicists have had to make everything super-cold. But in 2020, researchers announced the discovery of a superconductor at nearly room temperature, just 59 degrees Fahrenheit (15 degrees Celsius). Understanding the current developments in physics.

5. Problems Encountered and Resources Required :
