The Department of Mathematics has conducted a one day workshop on 'Awareness Program on Solar Energy' on 18.11.2021 by the resource person Sri Rajaneesh Khattar, Founder and Managing Director of INFORMA Markets Pvt. Ltd., New Delhi, a multinational company.

SOLAR ENERGY:

The radiant heat and light from the sun is termed as Solar energy. Solar energy can be harnessed anywhere that receives sunlight. But, the geographic location, time of day and weather conditions influence the amount of solar energy that can be harnessed for electricity generation using sunlight. The global potential of direct solar energy far exceeds that of any other renewable energyresource. It is well beyond the total amount of energy needed in order to support mitigation over the current century.

Depending on the method of capturing, converting and distributing of solar energy, it is categorised as passive solar energy technology and active solar energy technology. By orienting a building to the sun

using materials with suitable thermal mass or light dispersing properties and designing natural air circulation space. Where as the active solar technology has two types, one is solar power and the other is solar thermal energy. Solar thermal power is produced by using solar collectors for heating Solar power by transforming sunlight in to electricity. The converting of sunlight into electricity can be done either directly using photo voltaics (PV) or indirectly using concentrated solar power. Solar power accounts for about 2% of the world's electricity. Australia has the largest proportion of solar electricity in the world, supplying 9.9% of the country's electrical demand in 2020.

Solar energy is harnessed using a range of ever evolving technologies such as solar heating, photovoltaics, concentrated solar power (CSP), Concentrator photovoltaics (CPV), solar architecture and artificial photosynthesis. Using the photoelectric effect, a photovoltaic system converts light into electrical direct current (DC).

CSP- Sterling has by far the highest efficiency among all solar energy technologies. Solar PV has turned into a multi-billion, fast growing industry, continues to improve its cost-effectiveness, and has the most potential of any renewable technologies together with CSP-Concentrated solar power (CSP) systems use lenses or mirrors and tracking systems to focus a large area of sunlight into a small beam. Commercial concentrated solar power plants were first developed in the 1980s.

Global benefits of Solar energy technologies:

- Huge long term benefits.
- It is an indigenous energy resource.

- It is inexhaustible
- Mostly import-independent resource,
- It enhances sustainability
- It reduces pollution
- It will increase countries' energy security.
- It lowers the costs of mitigating climate change







Outcome: 1.Participants understood the importance of Biological clock and its influence on the body of animals.

2. Observe the biological clock in various animals and even in human beings.

Report:

The Department of Zoology organized an extension lecture to the students of II yr on 4th December 2020, 11.00 a.m. – 12.30 p.m. Dr. Rahanuma, is working as a scientist Zoological Survey of India. About 63 students participated in the presentation.

Biological clocks are organisms' natural timing devices, regulating the cycle of circadian rhythms. They're composed of specific molecules (proteins) that interact with cells throughout the body. Nearly every tissue and organ contains biological clocks. Biological clocks are known to affect hormonal secretions and responses. In a wide variety of experimental animals and in humans, very regular 24-h fluctuations in circulating hormone levels can be observed.

Some behavioral responses to hormone administration vary in amplitude according to the time of day. In mammals the brain's circadian clock is manifest in the activity of neurons in a small portion of the hypothalamus, the <u>suprachiasmatic nucleus(SCN)</u> governs slave clocks in most peripheral cells that are synchronized to the SCN. This system accounts for the daily oscillations and circadian rhythms of hormone levels and behavioral habits. Throughout theanimal kingdom, feeding occurs in a rhythmic fashion. The seasons, the day/night cycle, and the availability of food all affect feeding, but there is an underlying rhythm controlled by hormones



and neural mechanisms. In humans, daily changes in hormone secretions and behavior are governed by at least two types of forces: light-entrained 24-h rhythms, and the drive for sleep.

Medical Terminology: Students are trained to learn to divide and combine difficult medical words to help you understand and meanings of these words. The last lesson on medical terminology teaches students to recognize common medical abbreviations, symbols and plural words. This lesson also discusses special terms such as eponyms, acronyms, homophones, and antonyms

.Documenting Medical Records: Students learn about the role medical records play in a coding specialist's job. They explore the importance of documentation in medical records and learn to recognize the various types of dictation formats. This lesson also discusses how healthcare professionals manage medical records.

Medical ethics: Concepts of ethics, compliance, fraud and abuse and teaches students how these concepts apply to medical coding specialists. Students also learn about the importance of confidentiality when dealing with medical records and discuss insurance audits and the legal concepts.

Diagnostic Coding: Students are introduced to the actual coding process. Students learn about the history of the International Classification of Diseases and the development of the ICD-10-CM coding system. Additionally, students learn to identify main terms and sub terms and describe coding pathways. Students learn to handle abbreviations, cross references, and punctuation when coding, and they gain an introduction to Volumes I and II of the ICD-10-CM.

Students start coding diagnoses. Students learn about infections, parasitic diseases, and neoplasms, as well as how to code them. The Students were also taught Basics of computer, Excel.



Our nation is filled with such gems who have brought pride to our country with their work. They are awarded for their work with awards like Padma Bushan, Padmasree etc. We strive all our lives to stabilize our lives. All we think about living our life is a good degree, a good house, job and a settled family but some extraordinary people dedicate their lives for the well being of others. Such people make their mark on history and are then remembered for centuries ahead. One such great personality is Sri Chintakindi Mallesham. His invention changed the lives of weavers forever.

OBJECTIVE OF THE PROGRAM:

- 1. Telangana is home to many innovators who have fought against all odds to create a significant impact on their local communities.
- 2. To create interest in creativity among the students.

Women empowerment cell and department of zoology of Government degree college for women, Begumpet, Hyderabad organized a Motivational speech on dt.07-01-2022 by inviting Padma Sri Chintakindi Mallesham garu. Women empowerment cell convener invited the Guests on to the dais and briefed the program. He is a weaver from Alair, Yadadri Bhongir dist, Telangana state. He invented the great LAXMI ASU MACHINE. The program began with aninaugural session which included devotional song sung by Krishnasri, BA III yrand followed by the lightening of lamp . This was followed by the addresses by controller of examination Dr.K.Vijay kumar faculty dept.of and member from the political

scienceDR.M.Ramachary.later,Dr.G.S.Jyothirmai,head of the dept.of Zoology presented Mllesham sirs profile invited to address the meeting.

Later Padma sri awardee Sri Chintakindi Mallesham addressed the gathering with a highlyinspirational speech with simple words. He gave an all round picture of his journey started from his childhood and stated that he is from an economically backward family with zero education background. His father was a weaver. His mother used to support him but the struggle faced by her was practically seen by Mallesham garu and decided to find the solution to overcome manual methods for reeling the silk thread. Then he started thinking in that direction. His father stopped his education to support the family. From being a sixth standard drop out moved to winning the most prestigious civilian award. Padma sree awardee, the life of Chintakanti Mallesham is an inspiration to all of us. His journey towards his invention began at a very young age. He used to see his mother work tirelessly on the weaving machine meant for hand weavers. She would continuously toil with pain in her back and neck. That was the point when Chintakanti had decided to do something for her as well as all the weavers who worked so hard every day.

The process by which they weaved the cloth was called Asu. It was a wooden frame over which the threads would pass and the artisans would weave the cloth. Chintakindi wanted to make a mechanical machine that could fit right over the wood. Chintakindi Mallesham wasn't a learned man. He had no knowledge about electrical or mechanical engineering. But still he wanted to make a worthy machine. He would spend hours together working on the invention of the low cost sturdy weaving mechanical machine which would be affordable for all the weavers. He would visit different mills with his friends and family to see the machines work. This made him realize that he requires five working parts in the machine.

Over a period of 1992 to 1999 he was successful in replicating three working parts for his machine then he hit a blind spot. Chintakindi Mallesham was in a dilemma. His neighbors started taunting him for using his parent's fortune and wasting them on the development of the machine which was not reaching anywhere. Which then led to his decision of shifting to Hyderabad to lead his life. He took his Asu machine along with him and would work on the machine in his spare time along with an electrician. He was fortunate to go for a visit to Balanagar workshop one day. Which then ledto his Eureka moment and he figured out the last missing component to make the machine work. He rushed home in a hurry and was able to make the last part which then he fixed on to his machine with a feeling of mixed emotions. He switched on his machine and at last his hard work paid off and the machine worked. The quality of the cloth woven on the machine was even better than the hand woven one and caused less labor stress on workers.

Mallesham has great plans and dreams for his two daughters: Swetha and Rupa. Swetha, who is pursuing textile engineering in Salem, and Rupa, who is interested in studying fashion designing. "The proper degree and education will help my daughters. They should be able to do much more for the handloom sector than me and in less time." are his words of motivation and thought.

The life of Padma shri winner Chintakindi Mallesham,who invented the ASU machine that processes yarn for saree mechanically, is being recreated in this biopic,MALLESHAM.

Mallesham is a 2019 Indian Telugu-language biographical film based on the life of Chintakindi Mallesham, written and directed by Raj R. The film features Priyadarshi as Mallesham, alongside Jhansi, debutante Ananya Nagalla and Ananda Chakrapani in prominent roles. The film garnered positive reviews from critics upon release. Priyadarshi's performance in the film is regarded as one of the "100 Greatest Performances of the Decade".






An Extension Lecture on Career Opportunities in Biotechnology (30-11-2021)

9 Workshop on "Immunotechniques on 30-04-2022

A one day Workshop on "Immuno-techniques, based on Antigen-Antibody (AgAb) Interactions" was organized for students of B.Sc. Biotechnology II Year of our college.

A total of 50 students were registered for the workshop The workshop was intended to provide a hands-on experience to students about immunological techniques being taught in theory but not practically, due to lack of funds. These techniques involved were, immunoelectrophoresis, double immunodiffusion (ouchterlony method), single radial immunodiffusion (mancini's method) and enzyme linked immunosorbent assay, ELISA (sandwich method). These techniques are widely used in research and diagnosis and hence provide a good learning exposure to undergraduate students.

The workshop started on April 30, 2018 with a brief introduction about antigen, antibody and their interactions. Mrs. D.Kethura, Assistant Professor of Biotechnology, St.Ann's Degree College for Women, Mehdipatnam, Hyderabad introduced these techniques briefly to students.

Firstly, immunoelectrophoresis was performed by students followed by double immunodiffusion; Radial immunodiffusion and sandwich ELISA were performed by students.

At last, students submitted their feedback wherein they expressed their willingness for many more such workshops in future.









Online Extension lecture on Molecular markers (15-6-2022)
