The sole aim of the NSS is to provide hands on experience to young students in delivering community service.

AIMS AND OBJECTIVES

1. Understand the community in which they work.
2. Understand themselves in relation to their community.
3. Identify the needs and problems of the community and involve them in problem solving process.
4. Develop among themselves a sense of social and civic responsibility.
5. Utilize their knowledge in finding practical solutions to individual and community problems.
6. Develop competence required for group living and sharing of responsibilities.
7. Gain skills in mobilizing community participation.
8. Acquire leadership qualities and democratic attitude.
9. Develop capacity to meet emergencies and natural disasters
10. Practice national integration and social harmony.

NSS was introduced in the college in 1977 and has four units with 400 students. Unit - III is embraced with 100 volunteers from B.Sc.(Physical Sciences) .There are two types of activities: Regular Activities (120 hours) and Annual Special Camp (120 hours). The college through NSS regularly conducts various activities where the participation of volunteers is really appreciable. The Annual camps also known as Special Camps are held annually, funded by the government of India, and are usually located in a rural village or a city suburb.
