



- India's land area. PAs (as on Sept 2019) covering an area of 1,65,158.54 sq km or 5.02% of Geographical area of India is 32,87,263 sq km. Within it are:870 notified
- The break-ups are as follows:
- 104 National Parks: Area 40,501.13 sq km or 1.23%551
- Sanctuaries: Area = 1,19,775.80 sq km or 3 64%So, 655
- National Parks and Sanctuaries comprising an area of 1,60,276.93 sq km
- or 4.87% of India's geographical area
- In addition there are 88 Conservation Reserves: Area 4356,49 sq km or 0.13%127 Community Reserves: Area - 525.22 sq km or 0.02%



## Community Conserved Areas (CCAs)

- cultural, spiritual and aesthetic purposes. indigenous, mobile, and local communities have played a critical role in conserving a Protected areas across the globe, managed and sustained by ordinary people. In fact, variety of natural environments and species for millennia, for various economic
- Community Conserved Areas (CCAs) can be defined as natural and modified indigenous peoples and other local communities through customary laws or ather biodiversity, ecological services and cultural values—voluntarily conserved by ecosystems (with minimal to substantial human influence) – providing significant effective means.
- These efforts range from the continued traditional protection of sacred sites, to a destructive commercial and industrial forces. resources to community attempts at saving natural habitats from the penetration of revived interest and engagement of communities in protecting their natural
- Many CCAs are much older than government-managed protected areas
