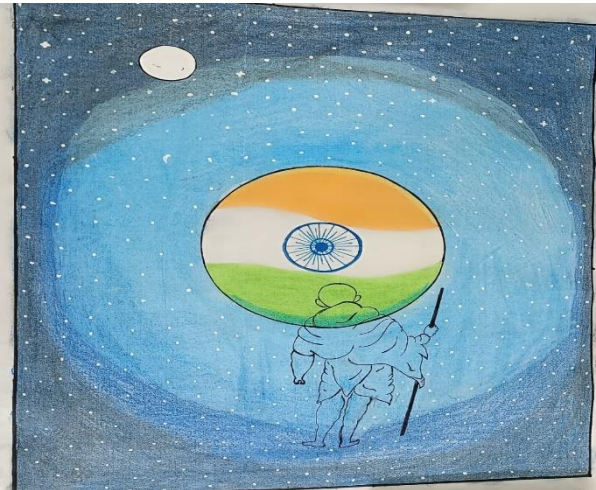

In the memory of India's great soldier



- A museum on Subhas Chandra Bose was established at the Red Fort. Apart from this, the Government is planning another museum in Kolkata.
- In 2018, three islands in Andaman and Nicobar were renamed. The Ross Island was renamed as Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose Aapda Prabandhan Dweep, the Neil Island as Shaheed Dweep, and the Havelock Island as Swarna Dweep.
- In 2018, the Government instituted an annual award known as Subhas Chandra Bose Aapda Prabandhan Puraskar to recognise the excellent work done by individuals and institutions in India in the field of disaster management.
- In 1920, Netaji Subhas Chandra Bose secured fourth position in the country in his exam.
