



To study the rural credit system, a study tour was organized by the department on 14-12-2017to Pathipaka village of Shyampet mandal in Warangal district. The objective of the tour was to study the institutional and non-institutional credit sources and also the accessibility of banking facilities to villagers.

It was found that still villagers were in the clutches of land lords and money lenders for their loan requirements and paying exorbitant interests. As the coverage of institutional credits resources like banks and cooperative societies was very limited and their loan amount was not sufficient to meet the requirements, the villagers mainly depended on local brokers (Dalal) for their loans. Total 130 students of BA groups participated in the tour and interacted with the villagers.The faculty members Y. Narendra, Dr. M. Ravinder and Dr. A. Venkata Ramana acted as facilitators for the tour.

The Regional Science Centre (RSC) is fostering spirit of science among the youth. It was established in Warangal district head quarters to serve as a means of infotainment to the students from across the state. Telangana State Council of Science and Technology (TSCST) launched this project with a view to evolve methods of promoting applied science and technological research among the youth. Sitting on top of a hillock at Hunter Road in Hanamkonda, opposite to the Kakatiya Zoo Park, the state of the art building dressed with a dual tone of orange and grey does not fail to grab the attention of the passers-by on the road. When we enter the premises, the serene atmosphere develops curiosity and inquisitiveness in us towards science and technology. The purpose of establishing this centre is to inculcate scientific temper in the minds of students, teachers, academicians and even general public.

There is a lot of response from schools and colleges from all over the state. The science centre is experiencing a daily traffic of about 400 students from across the state. Students from other districts have become enthusiastic to visit this science centre and gain practical knowledge of science which they study in their text books. The science centre is loaded with state of the art equipment inside and outside the 15 acre complex. There are 69 exhibits in a range of galleries across Physical science, Biological science, on Biodiversity, climate change and other contemporary science topics which help students understand various concepts of science better. The 'magic' tap, which pours out water without any pipe connection, the Leon Foucault pendulum which proves that the earth is revolving, head on a platter which explains the concept of optical illusion and other such exhibits provide a lot of information to the students in an enjoyable environment. Other exhibits like the musical corridor, infinite train, sympathetic swing, parabolic reflectors and pinhole camera are thoroughly enjoyed by the students at the same time inculcating scientific outlook among them.

Being the only science centre in the state, it serves to motivate and inspire students to take science to every nook and corners of the society. The scientific exhibits drawn from the National Council of Science Museums, Kolkata are a major attraction here.

PLACES OF WORSHIP

India is a secular country. People of different religions and beliefs live here. Though the country is big it has unity in diversity. Majority of Indians are Hindus. Muslims and Christians form the minority. We have different places of worship. Hindus go to temple, Muslims go to masque, and Christians go to church. They visit these places on the respective days meant for worship.

As a student of B.A I year, I went on field trip to a nearby church. It is called 'Centenary Baptist Church' because it more than 100 years old. It is situated in the heart of Warangal city. It has a huge structure and has a great history. It could accommodate as many as 2000 worshippers. In the same premises there is a small church which is 145 years old. It could accommodate nearly 500 worshippers. There I have met a person and came to know that many Christians attend this church on Sundays and on other holy occasions to worship Jesus Christ. The worship takes place in two languages-Telugu & English. Besides this, the church is kept open throughout the week for everyone to visit and pray. There is a prayer tower for special prayers. People come over there to offer prayers in times of joy and sorrow to have personal time with God for peace and solace. There is a beautiful garden around the church. The atmosphere is calm and comfortable for worship. The church has a bell tower which is used on Sundays. The bell is rung on other days to indicate an important event or incident. A person called 'Sexton' takes care of gardening and bell tower.

The church is maintained by a committee. Worship services are conducted by the religious head called the 'Pastor'. He gives Sermons on Sundays and on other important days of Worship. There is a tall cross on the top of the church. This is a symbol of sacrifice. This represents the sacrifice of Jesus to save this world from sin. Christians observe 'Good Friday' in memory of this. This is followed by 'Easter Sunday' the third day which according to Christians Jesus conquered death and rose again. 'Holy Communion' is conducted in memory of Christ on every first Sunday of every month. On this day 'Eucharist' or 'Holy Communion' is served to those Christians who receive 'Baptism'. 'Baptism' means 'Death by Water'. In the church there is a special bath tub meant for this purpose. The belief of the Christians is that once you dip in this water, your old sinful life must be changed into a new sinless life. Christians do not believe in Physical Re-birth, but they believe in Spiritual Re-birth only.

There is a small library in the premises of the church, where you could find books on Christianity and other related information. The church also does social service in the form of a school and a hospital. Members contribute for the welfare of the church and its activities. My field trip to this place though it was a short visit gave me such valuable information which I could share with you. I enjoyed this field trip.



Warangal is recognized as one of the best heritage cities of India. It is 145 km away from the state capital Hyderabad. It is also the second largest city in the state of Telangana. The city's name is derived from the Telugu word Orugallu – 'Oru' which means one and the word 'gallu' meaning stone. The city was the capital of the great Kakatiya rulers who reigned between 12th and 14th centuries.

According to the history of Warangal, the Prola Raja of great Kakatiya dynasty built the beautiful city in 12th century. The Kakatiyas, who ruled the place for more than 200 years, have left the succeeding generations, many grand monuments and architectural wonders like the famous Warangal fort, Swayambhu Temple and many other amazing ancient structures. The Warangal Fort, which is the main attraction of the city is spread over a radius of 19 kilometers between Warangal and Hanamkonda. The fort was constructed in the 13th century in the reign of the Kakateya King Ganapati Deva. The Warangal fort is most famous for its graceful and finitely carved arches and pillars. This fort has four large stone gateways.


Warangal fort is located at a distance of 3-4 km from Warangal city, which is well connected by road and rail from Hyderabad, approx.140 km away.
