Memorandum of Agreement

This Memorandum of Agreement is made between

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Telangana (CCETS)

and

Spoken Tutorial Project, IIT Bombay (ST- IIT Bombay)

The *Commissionerate of Collegiate Education* is created to promote quality education, giving special attention to the areas located in backward and rural areas. It also strengthens the women education at undergraduate level and works towards educational opportunities for weaker sections of the society.

The Spoken Tutorial project developed by IIT Bombay for MHRD, Government of India is the initiative of the National Mission on Education through Information and Communication Technology (ICT), launched by the Ministry of Human Resources and Development, Government of India. The uses of spoken tutorial is to advocate and popularize numerous Open Source software and their utilization.

Spoken tutorial project intends to provide opportunity to conduct software training from ST-IIT Bombay to all the Government Degree Colleges (GDCs) in Telangana state. As the programme is funded by the National Mission on Education through ICT, MHRD, Government of India it charges a nominal annual User Fee of Rs 25000/year/college. The program will provide the following benefits to the students of GDCs under purview of CCETS-

1. Students and Teachers receive hands on training through a particular FOSS (Free and Open Source Software) like Linux, Scilab, LaTeX, PHP & MySQL, Java, C/C++, Libre Office etc. The students who complete the required training hours will be awarded Certificates by Spoken Tutorial Project, IIT Bombay.
2. The training enhances IT, Software skills and employability for the students and any number of students and faculty can take any number of courses and Certificates in a year with User Fee of Rs. 25000/year/college.

The Commissionerate of Collegiate Education (CCE), Telangana State and **Spoken Tutorial Project,** IIT Bombay does hereby agree to the following broad terms of cooperation as under:

Commissionerate of Collegiate Education shall-

- Identify a Chief Central Co-ordinator from the department who will actively work and co-ordinate with Spoken Tutorial team, IIT Bombay to roll-out and introduce the project into all degree colleges in the state.
- Put up the signed agreement note on the CCE website along with Spoken Tutorial site link and Telangana training manager Ms. Swati Dongardive's contact details and issue notifications to all the Principals of Government Degree Colleges to make the Payment through NEFT, introduce and roll-out the Spoken Tutorial based software training in colleges.
- Conduct a Master training program for a faculty member in each GDC through Faculty Development Training Program for running Software training SELF learning way in their respective Colleges as one of the initiatives under capacity building.
- Offer General IT Skills package in Telugu also.
- Issue circular to all the GDCs to introduce and roll-out the Spoken Tutorial based software training in the GDCs.
- Have a monitoring system on department's website ccets.cgg.gov.in to track the progress made by the different colleges, suggest bi-monthly reports from colleges to CCE and ST, IIT Bombay.

The Spoken Tutorial Project, IIT Bombay shall-


- Work as a mentor for the GDCs in the Telangana State.
- Support the training and execution by CCE by providing manuals and continuous guidance at the unit level that is the Government Degree College.
- Nominate a Representative who will work with the Faculty Development Training Program in CCE.


- Provide guidance and learning path for progressively higher levels of learning through advanced courses.
- Provide the knowhow and course content material that includes CDs/DVDs, online material, instruction sheets and any other training material related to the GDCs.
- Issues Completion Certificates, who undergo training and qualifies the Online assessment test
- Participation Certificates shall be issued to the students who undergo the training and do not take the online test.
- Provide the promotional materials like posters, brochures, leaflets, banners etc. to the CCETS and the GDCs in TS.

General

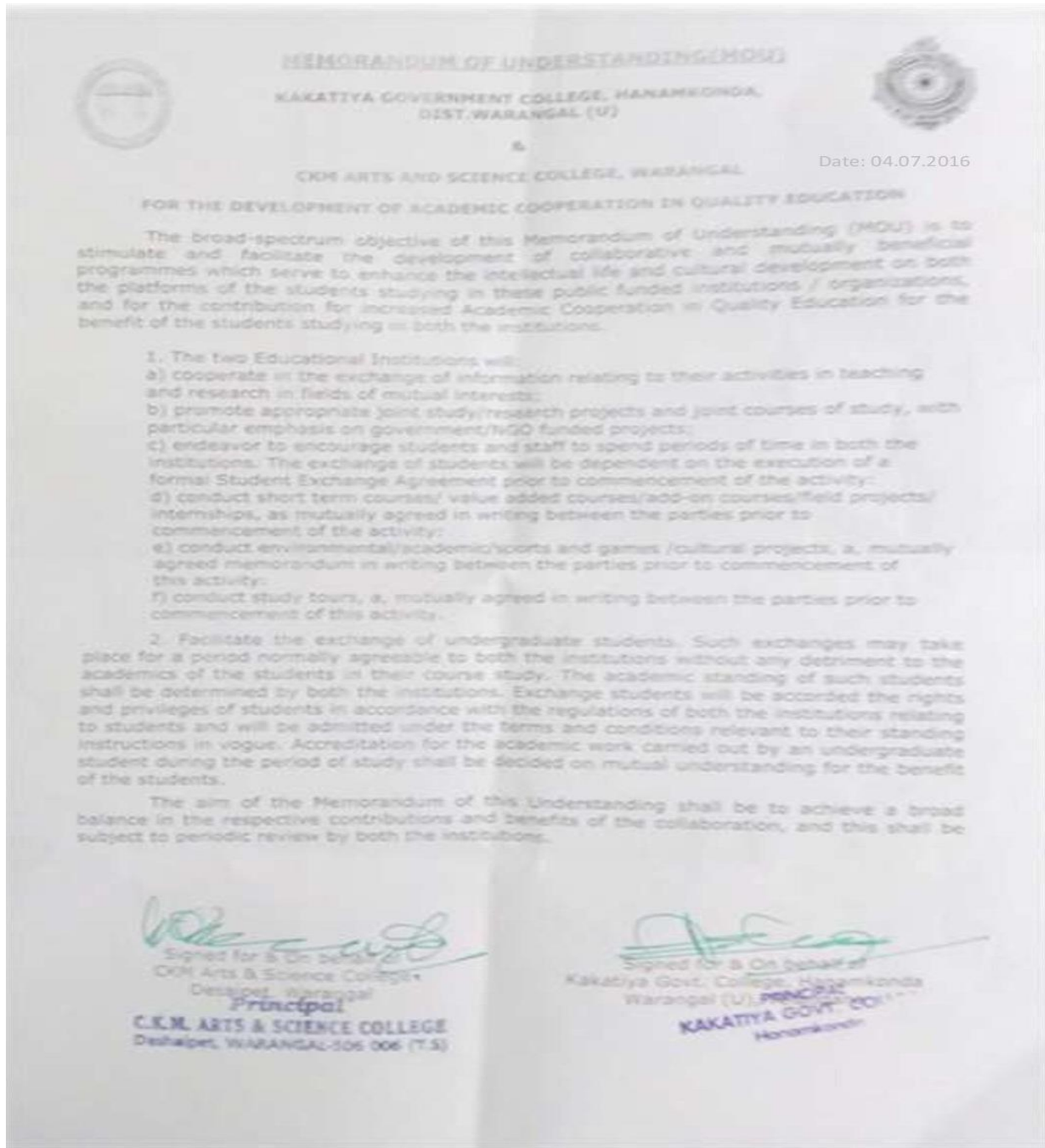
- This agreement is for a duration of one year from the date of signing and can be renewed and modified from time to time if necessary, based on mutual consent.
- IIT Bombay-ST permits the colleges with less than 100 number of students to learn along with nearby college students and will not expect the User Fee of Rs.25000/college/year.
- The interpretation of any clause will rest with CCE TS.


The broad-spectrum objective of this Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is to stimulate and facilitate the development of collaborative and mutually beneficial programmes which serve to enhance the intellectual life and cultural development on both the platforms of the students studying in these public funded institutions / organizations, and for the contribution for Increased Academic Cooperation in Quality Education for the benefit of the students studying in both the institutions.

1. The two Educational Institutions will:
 - a) cooperate in the exchange of information relating to their activities in teaching and research in fields of mutual interests;
 - b) promote appropriate joint study/research projects and joint courses of study, with particular emphasis on government/NGO funded projects;
 - c) endeavor to encourage students and staff to spend periods of time in both the institutions. The exchange of students will be dependent on the execution of a formal Student Exchange Agreement prior to commencement of the activity;
 - d) conduct short term courses/ value added courses/add-on courses/field projects/ internships, as mutually agreed in writing between the parties prior to commencement of the activity;
 - e) conduct environmental/academic/sports and games /cultural projects, a, mutually agreed memorandum in writing between the parties prior to commencement of this activity;
 - f) conduct study tours, a, mutually agreed in writing between the parties prior to commencement of this activity.

2. Facilitate the exchange of undergraduate students. Such exchanges may take place for a period normally agreeable to both the institutions without any detriment to the academics of the students in their course study. The academic standing of such students shall be determined by both the institutions. Exchange students will be accorded the rights and privileges of students in accordance with the regulations of both the institutions relating to students and will be admitted under the terms and conditions relevant to their standing instructions in vogue. Accreditation for the academic work carried out by an undergraduate student during the period of study shall be decided on mutual understanding for the benefit of the students.

The aim of the Memorandum of this Understanding shall be to achieve a broad balance in the respective contributions and benefits of the collaboration, and this shall be subject to periodic review by both the institutions.

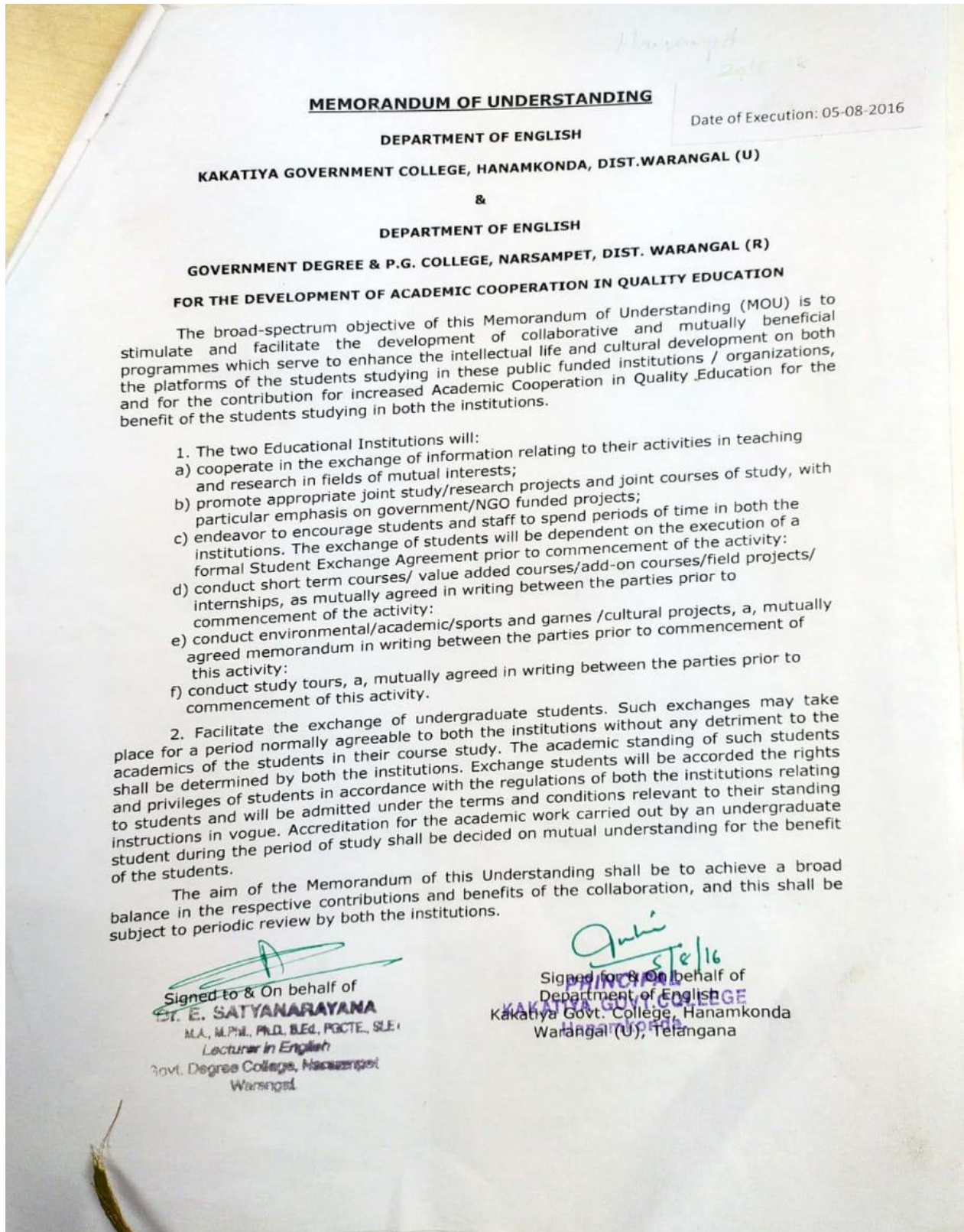

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



Letter of Understanding Between United Nations Development Programme And Commissionerate of Collegiate Education Government of Telangana

The United Nations Development Programme (UNDP), an agency of the United Nations, helps countries to develop policies, leadership skills, partnering abilities, institutional capabilities and build resilience in order to sustain development results. UNDP works in more than 170 countries and territories, helping to achieve the eradication of poverty, and the reduction of inequalities and exclusion.

The Commissioneate of Collegiate Education, Government of Telangana's mandate is to promote Collegiate Education, giving special attention to the areas located in Backward and Rural areas, to strengthen Women education at undergraduate and post-graduate levels to create educational opportunities for weaker sections of the society and to introduce need-based vocational courses replacing the conventional courses in a phased manner. The Government's initiative of Telangana Skills & Knowledge Centre (TSKC) addresses help students learn and practice employability skills as a dependable solution to the problem of unemployment faced by students studying non- professional courses in Government Degree Colleges.

Through this Letter of Understanding (LOU), UNDP and the Commissioneate of Collegiate Education, Government of Telangana wish to explore areas of collaboration in the framework of the UNDP implemented Project, 'Creating Opportunities for Employment and Entrepreneurship for Women in India'. This initiative seeks to leverage the needs for skilled personnel and other inputs in the business sector (as well as their financial and institutional capacity) and to create opportunities for skill development, employment and entrepreneurship for women. This multi-state initiative is funded by the IKEA Foundation and is supported by Xynteo, an international advisory firm which will help build partnerships with the business sector as well as the India Development Foundation (IDF) which is responsible for concurrent monitoring and research. The project has been duly endorsed by the Department of Economic Affairs, Union Ministry of Finance.

This LOU is aimed at harnessing the initiatives of the Commissioneate of Collegiate Education, government of Telangana to make the students of non- professional courses in Government Degree Colleges employable. The core of this partnership will be to bridge the information gap thatcollege students particularly the women confront with regard to information on opportunities for skill development and employment as well as public programmes created to serve these needs.

This LoU will facilitate collaboration in the following areas:

Strengthen the Government Degree Colleges in their efforts as career guidance, counselling & skills centres in the form of Telangana Skills & Knowledge Centres (TSKC) to :

- Provide information, Psychometric profiling & career guidance to girl students.
- Facilitate establishment of close linkages with the businesses / private sector to open up a range of internship and job opportunities for girls.
- Facilitate linkages with the government & private training providers to promote employability and entrepreneurship among students.
- Train & build capacity of select college teachers as trainers & counsellor for Career guidance & counselling so as to sustain the initiative.

The joint programme will be piloted initially in 40 government degree colleges across Hyderabad, Ranga Reddy, Medak, Mahbubnagar, Warangal, Adilabad and Khammam districts.

The LoU will be operational from the date of signing till 31 October, 2018.

A brief project outline is attached for reference (Annex-1). To ensure smooth implementation of the project, a detailed action plan with specific deliverables, timelines and responsibilities will be mutually worked out within a month of signing of the partnership LOU.

The focal points persons under this partnership will be Mr. Clement Chauvet, Chief Skills and Business Development for UNDP and Ms. Vani Prasad, IAS, Commissioner, Commissionerate of Collegiate Education, Government of Telangana.

WOF shall provide the following:

- Entrepreneurship education methodology, curricula and content:
 - eContent for blended classroom learning for students that are facilitated by faculty
 - Guide the setting up of E Cells (student entrepreneurship clubs) to facilitate delivery of practicums that strengthen student experience in entrepreneurship.
- Access to Technology platform to manage the delivery of the blended learning modules and manage student participation on signing of licensing agreement.
- Structure, content and methodology for faculty training as entrepreneurship facilitators and educators for effective blended learning.
- Structure, content and methodology for Student E Leader training (for E Cells).
- Access to Entrepreneur engagement platform E Week.
- Program Advisory service to the entrepreneurship faculty and E Cell leaders.
- Framework for entrepreneurship outcomes and impact assessment measurement.

Partner Institute shall provide the following:

- Develop/strengthen the institutional mandate for entrepreneurship education and development.
- Mainstream (as required or elective courses) entrepreneurship curricula within the Partner Institute for holistic development of students' knowledge, skills and experiences.
- IT infrastructure (sufficient bandwidth to provide live device level access in classroom of WOF content) to enable students to learn using modern blended learning methodologies.
- Designate and support required numbers of motivated faculty towards entrepreneurship and provide for their training.
- Support practicum programs on campus with required faculty supervision including engagement with entrepreneurs and professionals knowledgeable about venture creation.
- Track and share input data (including WOF courses offered, student sign-up, number of faculty teaching courses), output data (including student course consumption), and outcomes information to measure impact (companies started by students each year).
- Ensure that periodic training is provided for facilitator and educator through trained master trainers and other infrastructure costs related to running the classroom and practicum programs.
- Partner institutes will run the programs offered by WOF, including the online course in entrepreneurship (Curriculum) and the E-cell activities (Practicum).

3. Financial Terms: Each Party will bear the costs of meeting its responsibilities described in Section 2 above and will not owe the other Party any amounts pursuant to this MOU.

4. Review Process: Both Parties will review progress of the programs conducted pursuant to the MOU on at least a half-yearly basis. The Head of the Partner Institute will participate in the final review for each year to ensure that the management is fully apprised of the development of the programs. The Partner Institute is expected to track progress and data of students, student entrepreneurs, and entrepreneurs that it works with during the course of this association.

5. Intellectual Property Rights

- "Intellectual Property" includes creations, domain names, inventions, know-how, trade or business secrets, patents, copyrights, trademarks, logos, designs, works of authorship, software programmes, papers, models, teaching techniques, research projects, databases and instruction manuals.

- Each Party shall retain all rights to its IP and nothing contained in this MOU, nor the use of the IP in the publicity, advertising, or promotional or other material relating to the fulfillment of the obligations of the Parties contained herein shall be construed as giving to any Party any right, title or interest of any nature whatsoever to any of the other Party's IP.
- Partner institute will not copy or reproduce in any form, WOF's IP.

6. Representations and Warranties:

- Each Party hereby represents and warrants that the use of IP made available or contributed by it does not violate the IP rights of any third party.
- Each Party has all requisite power and authority to enter into this MOU and the execution, delivery and performance by such Party of this MOU has been authorized by all necessary and appropriate corporate or governmental action and will not, to the best of its knowledge, violate any applicable law or approval presently in effect and applicable to it.

7. Confidentiality:

- The Parties acknowledge that during the term of this MOU each Party may obtain confidential and/or proprietary information of the other Party including, but not limited to, financial or business information, contracts and employee details (collectively, "Proprietary Information"). Such Proprietary Information shall belong solely to the disclosing Party. Proprietary Information shall not include information that is or becomes publicly known through no wrongful act of the receiving Party.
- The receiving Party shall not disclose Proprietary Information to third parties without the prior written consent of the disclosing Party and agrees to undertake reasonable measures to ensure that such is kept confidential and to disclose to its employees, officers, directors or representatives on a need to know basis only.
- The receiving Party also agrees to report immediately to the disclosing Party any unauthorized disclosure of Proprietary Information of which it has knowledge.

8. Third Party:

- Nothing in this MOU shall mean or shall be construed to mean that either Party is at any time precluded from having similar arrangements with any other person or third party.
- The Parties shall wherever necessary enter into definite written agreements with/without third parties to facilitate the implementation of specific initiatives with the prior written consent of the other Party. Such agreements will be independent and exclusive of this MOU.
- Each Party will promptly notify the other Party of any potential conflict of interest arising from the conduct of activity pursuant to this MOU as soon as it is known by the Party that becomes aware of the potential conflict.

9. Termination:

- a) This MOU is for the duration of three years from the date of this MOU. However, either Party may terminate or extend this MOU by providing 60 days' notice in writing to the other Party. In the event that the Partner Institute would like to continue operating under the terms of the MOU because of student enrollment in courses conducted pursuant to this MOU, despite having received notice of termination from WOF, WOF will support the students until the end of the course, on submission of proof that the enrollments took place before the date of the termination notice.
- b) If the Partner Institute does not fulfil its responsibilities, WOF will discontinue the program and the Partner Institute shall cease to be a member.



10. **Dispute Resolution:** If a dispute arises concerning the interpretation or implementation of this MOU the Parties agree to settle amicably by mutual consultation or negotiation and shall observe and comply with all laws, rules, and regulations of each other's country where this MOU is performed.

11. **Miscellaneous:**

- a) **Entire MOU:** This MOU constitutes the entire understanding of the Parties with respect to the Project and supersedes any prior or contemporaneous oral or written understanding or communication between the Parties.
- b) **Amendment:** This MOU shall not be amended, changed, modified in whole or in part except by an instrument in writing signed by both the Parties hereto.
- c) **Relationship of Parties:** Nothing in this MOU shall be construed as creating a relationship of partnership, joint venture, agency or employment between the Parties. Neither Party shall be responsible for the acts or omissions of the other Party, nor shall either Party have the power or authority to speak for or assume any obligation on behalf of the other Party.
- d) **Assignment:** Each Party may assign its rights and obligations under this MOU with the prior written consent of the other Party. Notwithstanding the foregoing, WOF shall be entitled to assign any of its rights and obligations to any of its affiliates without the prior written consent of the Partner Institute. It is clarified that:
 - i. The assignment or alienation of any part or whole of the Partner Institute IP or WOF IP shall not be construed to be an assignment of rights or obligations under this MOU; and
 - ii. The delegation of any obligations under this MOU by WOF to any person or entity shall not be construed to be an assignment of rights or obligations under this MOU, so long as WOF remains at all times responsible for its obligations under this MOU.
- e) **Indemnity:** This MOU does not contemplate or provide for the exchange of any funds between the Parties. Therefore, save and except for fraud, no Party shall be liable to indemnify or pay damages to the other Party, its officers, directors, employees or agents from and against any liabilities, costs and expense incurred or suffered, or to be incurred or suffered by the other Party that arise out of or relate to, or result from any breach or termination by either Party of any of the provisions of this MOU.
- f) **Counterparts:** This MOU may be executed in two counterparts each of which when so executed and delivered in the English language shall be an original, but all of which shall together constitute one and same instrument.
- g) **Notice:** Either Party may, from time to time, change its respective address or representative for receipt of notices or other communications by giving to the other Party not less than 10 days prior written notice in English.

12. **Matters Not Covered by the MOU:** The WOF brand is upheld not only because of its thought leadership in entrepreneurship and best practices but also for the quality of its content, program management, delivery standards, material, tools, etc. Hence any co-branding, co-certification and marketing association for a program would be subject to quality assessment on a case-by-case basis with individual partners and respective programs. This MOU does not automatically include co-branding, co-certification or marketing of programs operated by the Partner Institute, and discussions regarding such matters would be on a case-by-case basis between the Partner Institute and WOF.
