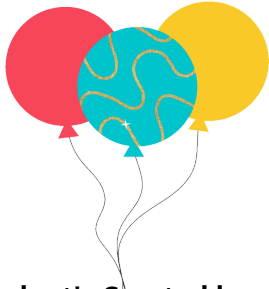
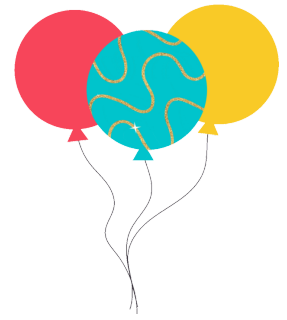

Her father Ganapatideva who is the founder of Kakatiya Dynasty.

After the death of Ganapathi Deva, Rudramadevi celebrated her coronation and became the complete ruler of Kakatiya Dynasty. Many allied kingdoms didn't accept her as their Queen, revolted against her but the queen suppressed every revolution and became a shield to Kakatiya territory.
