ANNUAL REPORT (2017-2018)

Government Degree College, Siddipet was established in the year 1956. The College offers various UG and PG programme besides Certificates programmes providing quality education to empower students. The College has been granted Autonomous status in the year 2015 by the UGC both for the UG & PG courses. Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) was introduced from the Academic year 2015-2016 for both UG and PG courses.

The College follows the semester system. The Examination comprises of Internal and External evaluation in the ratio 30:70. The College offers 4 programme with 17 course combination at UG level and 5 programmes at PG level.

Examination Branch is established in the College after the autonomous status is granted. The Examination Branch carries its activities keeping in view the guidelines suggested by the UGC from time to time.

The main feature of the examination system and evaluation is a focus on continuous evaluation which includes assignments, project work, viva voce, seminars, Internal examination and semester examination.

Examinations occupy a very important place in our educational system and they have become the central pivot around which the whole of education including syllabi, course of study, method of teaching and employment potentialities revolve.

Examination work involves various procedures in the conduct of examination. Based on the approved Almanac submitted by the Principal, the examination schedules are made to conduct the end semester examinations for theory & practicals. The Examination are conducted twice in an academic year i.e. once in October/November (for Semester I, III & V) and the other in March/April (for Semester II, IV & VI).

The Controller of Examination exercises to

- Issue the notification of all examinations.
- Receive exam application from eligible candidates and get them scrutinized.
- Issue Hall tickets.
- Receiving the question papers from the paper setters, and then the question papers are printed in the confidential printing section.
- Appoint Chief Superintendent for the conduct of all semester examination.

The chief superintendent prepares the invigilators list, seating arrangement and non teaching staff duties well in advance. With the help of external & Internal squads she ensures that the examinations are conducted in the best possible manner.

The received answer booklets are coded to ensure that the students identity is protected. The answer scripts are sent for evaluation to the external examiner. After reviewing, the marks are entered in Student Life Cycle Management(SLC)of Examination Management System (EMC). The results are processed with the help of software and then presented before the Examination Results Committee as tabulated for its approval. Examination Branch has conducted UG & PG Examination for students under CBCS stream. The first The following is the result analysis for the academic year 2017-2018.

After the announcement of the results, if a student is aggrieved by her result in a paper (or papers), she may apply for recounting and/or revaluation. The provision for revaluation applies only to answer scripts valued by a single examiner (for UG). No provision for revaluation shall exist for courses where the answer scripts are valued by two or more examiners (for PG). Revaluation of each answer script shall be done independently by two external examiners selected by the Controller of Examinations. The original marks shall be revised to the average of the total marks awarded by the two external examiners, provided that such an average is more than the original marks by 15% of the maximum marks of that paper. Otherwise, the original marks remain unaltered.
