


Profile of the students







Criterion wise activities

Curricular Aspects

Initially the syllabus designed by M.G University was being adopted. The syllabus for the BBA Course is being prepared and approved by the Board of Studies of the Department. The Faculty members prepare annual academic plans in beginning of academic year which will be regularly scrutinized by the in-charge of the department.

The staff regularly attends orientation courses with a view to upgrading their skills in the changing patterns of the syllabi and the modes of teaching. The faculty members also attend departmental meetings and conferences arranged by the Departments of the nearby Universities where curriculum design is discussed and reviewed.

Apart from teaching the curriculum designed by the university, the department is also imparting training in some additional curricular inputs to bridge the gap between the prescribed syllabi and the latest trends and developments in the subject.

Teaching-Learning & Evaluation

(a) Teaching

The faculty of the department prepares annual academic plan at the beginning of the academic year by dividing the syllabus month-wise and unit-wise to the extent of working days available in each month. Periodical review of the teaching schedule is done at Department level. Teaching synopses are prepared well in advance and teaching diaries are maintained to record the teaching activity of the day. Remedial classes are held and informal counseling is given in addition to assignment to the slow learners to bridge the gap between students of different learning abilities.

To keep pace with the changes in the systems of teaching, the department is practicing some the learner centered teaching methods like question and answer sessions, Quiz competitions, Group discussions in addition to giving assignments, using charts, attending MANA TV classes, etc.

(b)Learning

In order to promote independent skills and research outlook, the faculty takes a keen interest in involving students in study projects and surveys by providing them the primary information necessary. The students periodically submit their study projects and survey reports to the Department as part of their learning process. The department is assigning study projects and survey programmes to brighter students, assignments and seminars to average students, apart from holding remedial classes for slow learners.

The Department is consistently taking required steps for the expansion of general awareness of the subject among the students by providing latest information through news paper clippings, magazines, journals, etc. Extension lectures are arranged every year by inviting professors from universities and other experts from the organizations and institutions concerned. These lectures are ever at the disposal of the students to help them in acquiring latest knowledge.

STUDENT SUPPORT AND PROGRESSION

BIO-METRIC Attendance system is introduced and bio-data of the students is collected in order to identify and find a solution to the problems of the students.

Assignments and remedial coaching are given to the slow learners. Important questions in each subject are listed out and maintained in the form of question bank. This practice has been in vogue in the Department for the last years. The students make use of all these preserved question banks as and when they find it necessary.

The Government of Telangana is providing scholarships to the economically backward students.

After completion of the program most of the students are joining in the post-graduate and Management course and others are taking up self-employment programmmes.

ORGANIZATION AND MANAGEMENT

The faculty members are also discharging duties in various committees constituted for the purpose of efficient management. Meetings are conducted periodically to review academic plans and other departmental activities. The Government of Telangana has introduced performance indicators to evaluate and help improve of the teaching abilities of individual lecturers in the Department.

Healthy Practices

- The Department is organizes seminars and lectures from time to time.
- Debates and Quiz competitions are held periodically.
- The Department maintains a few textbooks for the purpose of teachers learning.
- The Department takes effective measures to motivate students to face competitive examinations.
- The department is maintaining the bio-data information, and corresponds regularly with the parents.
- The faculty guides the students in preparing charts, and taking up small project works and study reports and surveys.

Evaluation of students:

The Department involves itself in the process of continuous evaluation to assess the extent of the progress of the students by conducting slip tests and giving assignments. The marks awarded are informed to the students and posted in the departmental marks register. On the basis of their performance in Annual Examination, students are broadly categorized into three groups, namely bright students, average students and slow learners. Study projects are assigned to bright students, Semester examination assignments are given to average students and remedial classes are arranged for slow learners. The reports of slip tests and assignments conducted in the Department are shown in the performance indicators.

The Department supplies model question papers to the students and conducts pre-final exams at the end of every academic at the end of each semester.

Student Seminars:

Student seminars are conducted regularly in which they participate and the same is recorded in a separate register

Student Assignments:

Student Assignments are conducted regularly in which they write and the same is recorded in a separate register

Remedial coaching

Remedial coaching classes are arranged every year by the Department for the academically backward students involving the faculty to help them improve their academic standards.

Research and Extension

a)Research:

Teachers update their knowledge by reading latest books, Journals and attending seminars. The faculty members of the Department are actively involving themselves in research activity and guiding the students in preparing study project reports and conducting surveys.

b)Extension:

Our college is functioning not only as an academic center, but also as a center of services to the community. The in-charge of the department regularly takes part in social services, co-curricular activities, like clean & green programme, N.S.S programme, literacy programme and cultural activities.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

The department is making use of all the infrastructure facilities and learning resources available in the college. The faculty utilizes the text books and reference books facility available in the library to improve their learning capabilities. The department is also making use of E-class room facility where pre-recorded audio lessons will be telecast through MANA-TV KU Band Programs.
